Cornelius—Could He Lay Hands on Others?

There is a vast

difference in re-

ceiving the Spirit

and how He is

manifested

We are excited

and look forward

to many great

things.

There is no doubt that the apostles received the baptism of the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost. After the apostles received the Spirit, they could lay hands on others, giving them miraculous powers when they also received the Spirit. The question is, did Cornelius and his household have this same

ability to impart the Spirit after being baptized in the Spirit?

There is no doubt what the Bible says about what happened in Acts chapter ten when Peter went to Cornelius' house. In three places he described what happened. "These...have received the Holy Spirit just as we have...the Holy Spirit fell upon them, as upon us at the beginning...then I remembered how He said, 'You shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit'..."giving them the Holy Spirit, just as He did to

us" (Acts 10:47; 11:15-16; 15:8—bold emphasis by dj). The Greek is even more emphatic, but one does not have to know Greek to understand what happened. Peter was at both Pentecost and with Cornelius and he said it was the same.

Having established that it was the same does not answer the question as to whether all those in Cornelius' household could then do what the apostles did in Samaria, when the Holy Spirit was given to those in that city. To understand this, we must see the difference in the receiving of the Spirit and the manifestation of the Spirit once He was received.

Look at Paul's first letter to Corinth. He affirms that while every member in Corinth had received the Spirit (v. 7), He was manifested in a different way. It was the same One who gave diversities of gifts, ministries (administrations—KJV) and activities (operations—KJV). He then shows that one man might have more manifestations of the Spirit than the one who had only one (14:13). The fact is that one might have more

> manifestation of the Spirit, but he did not have more of the Spirit. Paul's argument is that they all had received the same Spirit. All were equally important in their service to the church (v. 11).

> Those in Corinth had received the same Spirit that the apostles received on Pentecost. He was simply manifested in a different way. Why is the receiving of the Spirit called a baptism of the Spirit in

Acts 2 and 10? Because they were immersed (overwhelmed) by the Spirit and had no control as to whether they spoke in tongues. Those in Corinth were not overwhelmed for they could keep silent if no interpreter was present. All **received** the same Spirit, He was manifested in different ways. The manifestation of the Spirit gave the apostles the sign they were apostles by laying hands on others (2 Cor. 12:12). Cornelius is different—He was not an apostle. Men received the same Spirit, He manifested Himself differently!

All of their actions were filtered through the process of, "Will this help or will this hurt the church?" In order to do

that, they had to think differently about themselves. Paul said, "In everything commending ourselves as servants of God" (2 Cor. 6:4). They framed out their world view as servants of God. So, no matter the circumstance, they were serving God through everything that happened. These are the circumstances he mentions. "In much endurance, in afflictions, in hardships, in distresses, in beatings, in imprisonments, in tumults, in labors, in sleeplessness, in hunger, in purity, in knowledge, in patience, in kindness, in the Holy Spirit, in genuine love, in the word of truth, in the power of God; by the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and the left, by glory and dishonor, by evil report and good report; regarded as deceivers and yet true; as unknown yet well-known, as dying yet behold, we live; as punished yet not put to death, as sorrowful yet always rejoicing, as poor yet making many rich, as having nothing yet possessing all things" (2 Cor. 6:4-10).

It is possible to go through similar circumstances and have a view of life that would limit our perspective and produce a very different outcome. In all of this, Paul was serving God, and the church was blessed because of it. If we were negative, we wouldn't be able to see blessing because beyond our own situation in order to recognize what is being learned or how our circumstances could be an encouragement to others. Many people have been brought to the Lord by watching how Christians handled very hard situations in their lives. The oppo-

> site is true as well. Many more people have been turned away from the church because of how Christians have conducted themselves in particularly difficult times.

> It is no doubt that Paul was a blessing to so many in the early church. He had commended himself as a servant of God. He had decided that he was going to be a blessing. He had learned the secret to being content in his circumstances (Phil. 4:11). Whenever it was most difficult, it was Christ who strengthened him for the work at hand (Phil. 4:13).



7 Tools Every Home Needs to Survive

Introduction

We sometimes have the mistaken idea that God has one set of rules for how Christians should act outside their homes and a different set of rules behind the closed doors of matrimony. But that's wrong. What would happen if you began applying all the principles of being a faithful Christian—with reference to your marriage?

- 1. The Bitterness Drain (Matthew 5:21-26)
 - a. Do you sometimes save grievances after you've said they were forgiven?
 - b. Ephesians 4:32
 - c. Luke 17:3-5
- 2. The Lust Hammer (Matthew 5:27)
 - a. It's a mistake to think we can make an occasional hobby of pornography and it not hurt our souls or our marriages. Pornography is as addictive as any powerful drug and breaks the trust bond in marriage.
 - b. Men commonly underestimate the marketing skill of those who sell on-line pornography.
- 3. The Sacrifice Booster (Matthew 5:29-30)
 - a. This isn't speaking of a literal eye or hand, but any sin which I have grown to treasure. If an activity is sinful, I must cut it away from me.
 - b. If two people are compatible enough to get married and both are dedicated Christians, divorce will never interrupt their union. There is no sin-free divorce (Rom. 7:2-3; Matt. 19:9).
- 4. The Divorce Vac (Matthew 5:31)
 - a. In Jesus' time, people trivialized divorce as insignificant. It was so common to divorce and remarry that when Jesus taught that divorce and remarriage for any reason other than adultery was sinful, those who heard it exclaimed that if that was true, it was better for people to not marry!
 - b. Divorce-proof your marriage:
 - 1) Be present in your marriage.
 - 2) Be protective of your marriage.
 - 3) Be positive in your marriage.
 - 4) Be polite in your marriage.
 - 5) Be playful in your marriage.
- **5.** The Deceit Trap (Matthew 5:33)
 - a. Serious marriage problems almost always include deceit.
 - b. We don't want to hear our spouses reminding us or criticizing us for our sins, so we lie.
 - c. Vow now that you will always tell your spouse the truth. Every time.
- **6. The Retaliation Extractor** (Matthew 5:38)
 - a. When a counselor is with a couple and she says about her husband, "He hit me!" The counselor turns to the husband and asks, "Did you hit her?" Nine times out of ten the man will say, "Yes, but she hit me first!" What is he implying by that?
 - b. What if you took retaliation out of your marriage? It is very difficult to have a good argument with someone who simply won't participate.
- **7. The Conditional Love Expander** (Matthew 5:43-47)
 - a. We are commanded to grow (2 Pet. 3:18).
 - b. Jesus teaches us here how to love people without regard for how they might benefit us.
 - c. Ask yourself, "Do I only love my husband/wife for what I get out of him/her?"

Don't Stop Short!

In 2 Kings 10, we read the story of King Jehu, an epic tale, as he wipes Israel clean of lingering evils. In 2 Kings 10:1-14, Jehu hunts down the remaining family of Ahab, the previous king, who had corrupted the nation, making sure that the bloodline ends. However, Jehu does not stop at Ahab's family. For the rest of the chapter, we see Jehu enact a cunning plan to trap and kill every worshipper of Baal that remained in Israel. He called an assembly together to worship Baal, bringing everyone into the house of Baal, and then had guards standing outside. When the time was right, Jehu sent men inside, in order to kill every worshiper, and anyone who might escape would be killed by the guards.

What an incredible story! Jehu purged Israel of all Baal worship, so he must have been a devout follower of God, right? Let us take note of 2 Kings 10:29. Jehu "did not depart" from the sins concerning idols. It emphasizes that thought in verse 31, which says, "Jehu was not careful to walk in the law of the Lord." Even though the Lord blessed Jehu for what he had done (10:30), Jehu continued to do evil.

What we need to learn from Jehu, brothers and sisters, is that we can do great things and still fall short of doing what is right in the end. It is extremely easy to fall off the right path. Let us always do what is right and finish our Christian race (1 Cor. 9:24; 2 Tim. 4:7-8).



"All things were created through Him and for Him. And He is before all things, and in Him all things consist. And He is the head of the body, the church, who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in all things He may have the preeminence...And whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him" (Col. 1:16-18; 3:17).
