Colossians 2



Who Goes First?

Sometimes problems come about because there is conflict about who becomes the leader in a particular situation. You see this in the lives of children, but it continues even into our adult lives. There is a religious application of this in the deeper study of one particular Greek word and how it is used.

Sometimes there are situations where it makes no

difference who goes first—the order is of no consequence. The Greek word *proago* is often used this way. It is a compound word combining the first part of the word (*pro*), which means "before," with the second part of the word which means "to go." It is used in the account of the triumphant entry of Jesus into the city. As you read the text, you visualize the multitude who surrounded the One who was riding

on the donkey as He entered the holy city. The text describes how some preceded Him and how others followed. To look closely at this event shows that here it made no difference who went first.

The same word is used in the account of what transpired before Jesus came walking on the water to the disciples, who were about to lose their lives in a boat filling up with water. After He had fed the 5,000, He told the disciples to get into their boat and go across the Sea of Galilee while He dismissed the multitude. The use of this word indicates that it was His will for them to go first. Because He was their Master, they went ahead not knowing what was about to happen.

The word is used following His resurrection. The angels at the tomb told the women to deliver the message that they were to leave Jerusalem and meet Him in Galilee because He was going first to meet them there. The order made a difference. He was to go first, and He would be awaiting them

there.

However, there is a time when it makes an eternal difference as to who goes first. The ESV reflects the better Greek manuscripts' use of the word *proago* in its translation of John's words. "Everyone who goes on ahead and does not abide in the teaching of Christ does not have God" (2 John 9). We are absolutely forbidden to leave our place as a follower

of the teaching of Jesus. When we "go on ahead" of His teaching, we rob Him who has all authority in heaven and on earth. In substance we say to Him, "You may have all authority in every place, but you do not have it in this place in my life!" There is an eternal consequence for our sinful attitude.

So, as you make choices in your life, humbly deny yourself and take up your cross and let Him go first. He is the leader in all spiritual choices. We leave Him behind when we fail to do what He says. Never forget He said, "I go first."



Salvation: It Requires Repentance from Sin

Salvation from sin is man's greatest need (whether the individual man or woman recognizes that fact or not). It is man's own personal sin which he has committed (1 John 3:4; John 8:34; Ezek. 18:20) that separates him from God (Isa. 59:1-2; Jas. 1:13-16). In a spiritual condition of extreme desperation,

he must get away from and get rid of his sin. The decision to do that is what the Bible calls "REPENTANCE."

Picture in your mind someone drowning in the ocean. What is that person's most desperate need? To get out of the water. What if that person knows he needs to be saved out of the water and even believes in the one who came to save him, but he wants to stay in the water? Would he be saved? No. Could he be saved? Only if he got out of the

water! The same is true with sin. One must make up his mind to "get away from" and "get rid of" sin before he can be saved.

Repentance is absolutely essential in order to be saved. "God...now commands all men everywhere to repent" (Acts 17:30-31), and that was part of the instruction in the first gospel sermon in Acts 2:38. The Lord longs that "all should come to repentance" (2 Pet. 3:9).

"Repentance" is a change of mind that leads to a change of life. Jesus depicted repentance for us when He told

of a man who said to his son, "Son, go, work today in my vineyard." The son said, "'I will not,' but afterward he regretted it (changed his mind, ESV) and went" (Matt. 21:28-29). That is repentance—one decides to turn away from sin and "turn to God" (Acts 26:20).

Repentance is one of the hardest things to do, because it involves turning away from one's passions and fleshly desires—the sinful thoughts, words and deeds that will con-

demn our souls. But, knowing that it is hard, God provides numerous motivations for us to repent: (1) the command by God (Acts 17:30); (2) the goodness of God (Rom. 2:4); (3) the awareness of the gravity of sin (Acts 2:37-38); (4) the godly sorrow for sin (2 Cor. 7:10); (5) the fear of judgment (Acts 17:30-31); (6) the desire to be forgiven of sin (Luke 24:47). Each of these and all of these should drive us to repentance.

If those are not motivation enough, Jesus also warns us of what will happen if we do not repent of our sins. Jesus Himself said, "I tell you, no; but unless you repent you will all likewise perish" (Luke 13:3). If one is not willing to turn from his sins, then he will pay for his sins for all eternity.

Man has a part in his salvation. He must believe Jesus is the Son of God. He must repent of his sins, making up his mind to stop doing wrong and start doing right. But, even then, he is not saved yet. The Lord has more required of him.

You Are Inadequate

Do you ever feel like you aren't good enough? Despite all of your studying, you only managed to get a "C" on your test. Your presentation didn't make the splash at the office that you thought it would. Or maybe you're frustrated with your abilities as a parent. You just feel inadequate.

Inadequacy is a feeling we may experience at a variety

of times in our lives. We want to do a good job at what we do, and when we fail, it can be very frustrating. But with a little more practice or experience we can work to reach higher levels of success.

There is one area, however, where you will you will never be always be inadequate. No matter how hard you try or how much you practice, you will never be as holy as God. In 1 Samuel 2:2, Hannah prayed, "No one is

holy like the Lord, for there is none besides You." That probably seems obvious to most people. Of course no one is as holy as the Lord, but sometimes our actions don't reflect this. Sometimes, our actions are those of someone who thinks he is equal with God.

When we approach Scripture, do we look to find God's teaching (cf. 2 Pet. 1:20)? Or do we seek to validate our preconceptions? When we go to God in prayer, do we make our requests known as humble servants seeking the Lord's grace (cf. 2 Chron. 7:14)? Or do we address Him as an equal who owes us a favor?

In First Samuel, we learn that Hannah was barren, and she wanted nothing more than to have a son. So, she went to the temple and prayed fervently to the Lord. In chapter 1, verse 11, Hannah made a vow. If God would give her a son, then she will dedicate him to the Lord.

> Hannah demonstrated a heart that truly understands God's supremacy. When she prayed, she didn't treat God like He was a servant, bound to grant her every desire. Instead, she thought to see what she might do for the Lord. So, God heard her.

> Do we respect the authority of God? How often do we make demands of God, but never make an effort to fulfill His demands of us? We beg God for forgiveness, but never take the necessary steps to

repent of our sin. We seek an understanding of God's words but rely on our own wisdom to determine their meaning.

Hannah respected God's holiness. She understood her total inadequacy to compare to His perfection. So, she humbled herself. We are inadequate. We will never measure up to God's standard. So, in all that we do, we must be humble. "Therefore humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you in due time, casting all your care upon Him, for He cares for you" (1 Pet. 5:6-7).

What are you?

Context is everything, right? How would you answer the question, "What are you?" It all depends, doesn't it? Depending on the situation, you might answer that you are a man or a woman. If your feet are able to walk, use them for God! If your hands are able to serve, use them for God! Every single thing we have is from God! 


