Follow the Leader

I remember a game I played as a child, but I am not sure what it was called. I think it was called "Follow the Leader," where one child became the leader and whatever he did had to be exactly duplicated in all those other children who were following the leader. If he jumped, they jumped. If

he turned in a circle, they turned in a circle. If he walked backwards, they walked backwards. If he did all three in an immediate sequence, they did all three. Paul had no

There is serious application of this game in the lives of those early Christians. Paul came to Thessalonica as part of the "Macedonian Call" and went first to Philippi and then to Thessalonica. He was only there three weeks before tremendous persecution forced him to leave. He came back there often for several years. In his first letter to that church, Paul spoke of what had happened as the church began. "And you became followers of us and of the Lord, having received the word in much affliction, with joy of the Holy Spirit" (1 Thess. 1:6).

For the first time, these people in Macedonia met a follower of Jesus. He taught them, and they saw the way he lived what he taught. They followed him. They had worshiped images made by the hands of mortals which were embellished with gold and precious stones. Paul taught them about the One who created these very stones, and they "...turned to God from idols to serve the living and true God" (1 Thess. 1:9). What they had seen and heard from the apostle caused them to follow him. Look at verse 6 again. They followed Paul, but he taught them more. They became followers of Paul and "of the Lord." The apostle diverted their focus from him and focused it on the Lord, the One who really matters.

The Greek word for "follower" (mimos) became a word we commonly use today. They saw the folly of idolatry and began to "mimic" Paul and Jesus. Paul was not seeking to become an iconic apostolic hero. desire to be an He taught them what he taught those in Corinth. iconic apostolic "Imitate (mimos) me just as I also imitate Christ" (1 hero for men to Cor. 11:1). He is the One to follow!

Paul described the lives of these new Chrisfollow tians in this way. "For you, brethren, became imitators of the churches of God which are in Judea in Christ Jesus" (1 Thess. 2:14). I will never forget how this verse was taught to the people of Easter Island. Josh Blackmer said, "We have come to this island to ask the people to become followers of 'churches of God which are in' the Bible. The Bible describes that church, and Jesus wants us to read about it and be followers of the Lord as seen in that church."

Read about the Lord. Then become one who mimics the One who really matters!

What would happen in schools if each person just followed the inclinations of their hearts? good as or better You get the idea. The philosophy that "The heart wants what the heart wants" leads to chaos and danger. There are standards and rules set in place for a reason!

The Old Testament era of the Judges was a dark time in the history of Israel. Do you know why? The book of Judges tells us twice, "In those days there was no king in Israel; everyone did what was right in his own eyes" (17:6; 21:25). The people followed their hearts and it led to turmoil and sin.

The New Testament Christians suffered tremendous persecution at the hands of a man from Tarsus named Saul. Do you know why? That man himself later said, "I thought to myself that I had to do many things hostile to the name of Jesus of Nazareth" (Acts 26:9). That man following his heart led to havoc and murder of God's people (Acts 8:3; 9:1).

There are standards set in place (ex: at traffic intersections) for a reason. Even greater, there are laws set in place by the Creator of the universe, which must be obeyed (Matt. 7:21; Acts 10:35; Jas. 1:25). God has put all of His laws in place "for our good always" (Deut. 6:24), "that it may be well with

> you" in this life (Deut. 4:40; 5:16, 33; 6:3, 18; 12:28) and that you enter into "eternal life" (John 6:68; 1 John 2:21-29). Who are we to question God and choose to "follow our hearts" instead of Him?

> But, for some reason, certain people think that their "thoughts" and their "ways" are as good as or better than God's. How foolish! God describes His infinitely superior knowledge and understanding by

stating, "For as the heavens are higher than the earth, So are My ways higher than your ways, and My thoughts than your thoughts" (Isa. 55:8-9). Oh, that we would trust Him!

Truly, "There is a way that seems right to a man" (i.e., it "feels right in my heart"), "but its end is the way of death" (Prov. 14:12). May God help us to "Keep [our] heart with all diligence" (Prov. 4:23), and not allow it to be drawn "far from" Him and His ways (Matt. 15:8). Let us diligently train our hearts to wants what God wants!

However, we all know they were wrong because we follow a natural law given to us by God (Rom. 2:14-15). Man is not just some animal without purpose. Man was created by

the eternal mind of God to bear His image (Gen. 1:26). We do not have to wonder what is right or wrong. We have an objective basis for morality: God.

Before even the Ten Commandments, God established the sanctity of life. In Genesis 4, God punished Cain for killing his brother Abel, exiling him from his people. And, in Genesis 9:6, God decreed, "Whoever sheds man's blood, By man his blood shall

be shed; For in the image of God He made man."

The goal of conflict resolution with brethren

When you set out to resolve a conflict with a brother or sister

in Christ (i.e., to be "reconciled," as Jesus instructed in Matthew 5:23-24), you should have a clear goal in mind and even seek to communicate that goal. The goal should not be oriented toward "selfish ambition" (Phil. 2:3), but it should be focused on the health of long-term Christian relationships (Gen. 13:8; 1 Cor. 6:7), the overall health and unity of the church (Psa. 133:1; Eph. 4:2-3), and how the world (i.e., unbelievers) may be impacted by this conflict (John 13:34-35; 1 John 4:19-21). In other words, when it comes to con-

flict between brethren, there is always a "bigger

picture" to keep in mind.

Let me start with those same words again: When you set out to resolve a conflict with a brother or sister in Christ...read Romans 12. After you read Romans 12, go and practice Romans 12—especially verses 1 through 21. Even if "the other person" doesn't, that does not let you off the hook from doing right (Luke 6:31; Rom. 13:8-10; 1 Cor. 13:4-7).

Listen. Consider. Listen more. Speak less. Think about heaven. Forgive. Pray. Repeat. – DS


