An Unheralded Mother

It is remarkable that we so often overlook the importance of those who are standing in the shadows. Yet their impact on the lives of all those around them can shape the future far more than those who stand in the limelight and the center of the stage. Take a moment to focus on one of the most

unheralded heroes of the Bible. That person is the mother of David, the most widely known individual in the history of the nation of Israel.

Shape the world

She is so obscure that we do not even know her name. We know the name of her husband, Jesse, but she is mentioned only one time in the Scriptures. David speaks of her in Psalm 86. He was in despair because of the many enemies who sought to destroy him. He begged for God to hear him, "...for I am poor

and needy" (v. 1). He called upon the Lord to preserve his life, to save him and to be merciful to him, "...for I cry to You all day long" (v. 3). He had not lost his faith in God (v. 6), but his life was filled with adversity because "a mob of violent men have sought my life" (v. 14). Perhaps you have been in such deep valleys in your life, for there often times like this in the life of many of us.

David could have thought of how God had been merciful to those who were before Him. He could have thought of

the faithfulness of Enoch, Noah, Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, and as a son of such great men, he could have asked God to be merciful to him. However, it was not on the basis of these great men. Rather it was on the fact that God had known his mother and her life, and as a son of his mother he asked God to hear him (v. 16).

Look carefully at his prayer. "Oh, turn to me and have mercy on me! Give strength to Your servant and save the son

of your maidservant" (v. 16). When David thought of his mother and the impact on his life, he knew she belonged to God. When he thought of her, he remembered that she was one who belonged to God.

He also saw her as one who served God. She was not in the center of the stage like others. She was a humble servant, the wife of an unheralded husband in an obscure Jewish village. The world may

not have seen her worth, but David and God valued the importance of what she was doing far differently than others did.

She was blessed by God. David saw it. He asked God to hear him, not because of his forefathers, but because of his own mother. He had seen God in her life. He had seen her righteousness and asked God to bless him because of her!

So, if you feel worthless, think about Mrs. Jesse. Then be like her, faithfully serving God and shaping the world by the life you live in the shadows and not on center stage.

David asked a question in Psalm 34 that seems to have an obvious answer, but it comes with some clear responsibilities.

David asked, "Who is the man who desires life, And loves many days, that he may see good?" (34:12). Who wants to live? Who wants to live for many days? Who

wants to live...for many days...and wants those many days to part of be "good"? Well, that's everyone! Isn't it?

Better than any

Better than any self-help book out there, God tells us what is involved in seeing good days. They do not just come on their own. We must take steps in our lives to bring them about. Note the inspired keys to having a good life.

Good days involve your tongue. The inspired penmen states, "Keep your tongue from evil, and your lips from speaking deceit" (34:13). Do not lie (Eph. 4:25), do not slander (Jas. 4:11), do not use filthy language (Col. 3:8), do not tell crude jokes (Eph. 5:4), etc. Use your tongue for good—to comfort (2 Cor. 1:3-6), to encourage (Eph. 4:29), to thank (Eph. 5:4), to teach (2 Tim. 2:2), to extend kindness (Eph. 4:32), to express forgiveness (Col. 3:13), etc.

Good days involve your conduct. David goes on to say, "Depart from evil and do good" (34:14). We must resist the devil (Jas. 4:7), resist bitterness (Eph. 4:31), resist sexual

impurity (Gal. 5:19), resist anger (Col. 3:8), resist fleshly lusts (1 Pet. 2:11), resist the pride of life (1 John 2:16), etc. Instead, we need to do good to everyone, especially our fellow Christians (Gal. 6:10), seek the church first in our lives (Matt. 6:33), teach the gospel to lost souls (Mark 16:15), obey the commandments of God (Ecc. 12:13), etc.

Good days involve your relationships. The second part of verse 14 says, "Seek peace and pursue it." There are

words and behaviors that can destroy peace in our relationships (Eph. 4:31; Gal. 5:20; Col. 3:8), which is why we must "have regard for good things in the sight of all men" (Rom. 12:17). For we are told, "If it is possible, as much as depends on you, live peaceably with all men" (12:18). This requires "humility, meekness, longsuffering" (Col. 3:12), in which we always go the second mile (Matt. 5:41).

Good days involve your prayer life. David focuses on "the righteous" who "cry out" to the Lord, with the promise that He "hears" them and "delivers them" (34:15-17). Bad days can become good days if we will "cast all [our] care upon Him" (1 Pet. 5:7) and "trust" (Prov. 3:5-6) that He will be "with" us (Josh. 1:9), "strengthen" us (1 Pet. 5:10) and "help" us (Psa. 46:1).

Who wants to see good days? All of us do! Our Lord gives us the secret to enjoying all the good days He supplies!

The Great Commission and Acts 2

Before Jesus ascended to the Father, He left the apostles with the Great Commission, recorded in Matthew 28:18-20. The Great Commission summarizes the mission of the apostles and of Christians everywhere. On the Day of Pentecost, the apostles fulfilled the Great Commission in Peter's first

sermon. We can look to Acts 2 and see how each part of Jesus' mission statement for His church was enacted at Pentecost and must be carried out today.

In Acts 2:4, the Holy Spirit descended on the sinner made into Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I apostles, endowing them with miraculous gifts, signifying an extension of Christ's authority on them. Paul wrote in 1 Thessalonians 4:2-8 that their commandments were

given through the Lord Jesus, "Therefore he who rejects this does not reject man, but God, who has also given us His Holy Spirit" (v. 8). Today, our authority must come from the same source, the inspired words of God, found in the Bible.

Next, Jesus says, "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations" (Matt. 28:19a). In Acts 2, the apostles were provided with an audience of men from every nation (v. 5). Because of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, each person in attendance heard Peter's sermon in his own tongue (v. 6). No matter where they came from or what language they spoke, they heard the message of Christ. In verses 14 through 39, Peter preaches to them the gospel that calls all men everywhere to be reconciled to God through discipleship in the church of Christ.

How is someone added to Christ's church? How is a sinner made into a disciple? The men at Pentecost were cut to

the heart, realizing that they had crucified the Lord. How is someone They asked, "Men and brethren, what shall we The Lord begins, "All authority has been added to Christ's do?" (v. 37). Jesus told the apostles back in Matthew 28:19-20 how to make disciples. By "baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the have commanded you." So, Peter replied to the multitude, "Repent, and let every one of you be baptized

> in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins" (Acts 2:38). "Then those who gladly received his word were baptized; and that day about three thousand souls were added to them" (Acts 2:41).

> If we want to be the church Jesus Christ died for, we must follow the Lord's mission statement. The apostles obeyed each tenant of the Great Commission and established the church in Acts 2. If we want to enter His church and grow His church today, we too must accept the Great Commission.

Learning to resist sin like Jesus did

There are numerous verses in the New Testament which teach that Jesus did not sin while He was on earth (Heb. 4:15; 7:26; 2 Cor. 5:21; 1 John 3:5). Peter wrote, "Who committed no sin, nor was deceit found in His mouth" (1 Pet. 2:22). How did Jesus not sin?

Note the verb tenses in verse 23, which emphasize His ongoing determination and steadfastness in the face of provocation and temptation. "When He was being reviled" (present tense, emphasizing incessant abusive language and insults), He kept on "not reviling in return" (imperfect tense denotes continuous activity in the past). "When He was suffering" (present tense, emphasizing incessant torture at the hands of lawless men), He kept on "not threatening" (imperfect tense). So, these reveal what He kept on "not" doing. What positive action did He take? "But," He kept on "committing" (imperfect tense) "Himself to Him who judges righteously."

How can I resist sin the way that Jesus did? Go back and read those verbs and put them into practice. -DS

Suppose you stand before the Teacher, and He asks, "I only have one question: Did you practice

1 Peter 4:9?" You grab your Bible and anxiously flip to the verse and read it. If this was the one question Jesus asked you on judgment day, would your heart sink when you read the verse or rejoice? Here it is: "Be hospitable to one another without grumbling."

Obviously, there is more required of us than just this one verse, BUT this one verse is required of us! If your entrance into heaven was dependent upon your hospitality, would you get to enter? - DS


