This Week's Reading: 2 John -Revelation 2

The Highway of Holiness

Isaiah is truly the Messianic prophet because he gives so many detailed descriptions of the nature of the Christ and the work He would do. Most individuals know the words of Isaiah chapter 53, where we read of the One on whom our iniquity would be laid. We know of that lamb and sheep lead to the

slaughter or to be sheared and He would not open His mouth during that ordeal. Far too few know of Isaiah chapter 35 and the wonderful truths about His coming. The highway to

The chapter begins with a promise that God heaven has been would some day come and bring two events with Him. He would come with salvation and vengeance (v. 4). The evidence that Jesus had come would be that the eyes of the blind would be opened and the ears of the deaf would be unstopped (v. 5). It is to

this very verse that Jesus referenced when John's disciples asked if He was the Messiah or should they look for someone else to come (Luke 7:20-22).

Isaiah then reveals that there would be a new path called the Highway of Holiness that would lead men to God. On that highway would be the redeemed singing with everlasting joy and gladness and sorrow and sighing would flee (vv. 8-10). He who was the "way, the truth and the life" would bring that pathway to God (John 14:6).

The Messianic prophet then reveals two aspects of this highway. It would first be characterized by holiness. God had said, "Be ye holy for I am holy" (Lev. 11:44), and the blood of the Messiah would make true holiness to come upon mankind (1 Pet. 1:16). Judaism was charactered by ceremonial uncleanness but Christianity would involve a holy nation with a royal priesthood (1 Pet. 2:9).

> The other aspect of that highway would be how simple it would be to find and then to walk on that path. "Whoever walks the road, although a fool, shall not go astray" (v. 8). While there are difficult passages of the Bible to fully comprehend, none of them involve our salvation. Our God wants all men who hunger and thirst after righteousness to be filled. This is why the New Testament is written in simple terms, easily understood and in the simplest language.

To see this truth, find any passage about faith in the Bible to see if it is involved in our finding God. Then find any passage about repentance to see if it is involved. Find any of those passages about confessing Christ to see its place on entrance to the highway of holiness. Finally, find any passage about baptism to see if God has made it part of that highway.

Now note that I said "any passage." There is not any verse about faith, repentance, confession and baptism that is hard. The highway has come. Finding it is simple!

It is very likely that we disconnect Matthew chapter 3 from Matthew chapter 4 in our minds. We usually do that with chapters-when we see a division, our minds draw a line of separation. Additionally, there are certain chapters that we have designated By David Sproule their themes into differing categories. Mat-

thew chapter 3 is about "The Baptism of Jesus." We probably memorized that some time back. Matthew chapter 4 is about "The Temptations of Jesus." Again, we have that pegged in our minds, and so the two chapters are about two different major events in the life of Christ. And, perhaps they should be separated. But, I want you to look at something that connects them.

Jesus came to John the Immerser to be baptized "to fulfill all righteousness" (Matt. 3:15). When

He "came up...from the water," "the Spirit of God" descended and the "voice" of God spoke "from heaven." Pay attention to His affirmation, "This IS My beloved SON, in whom I am well pleased" (3:17). GOD spoke! He identified Jesus as possessing the nature of God, for He is God (John 1:1; 5:18; 10:30, 33). Who would dare test or deny the words of God right on the heels of them being spoken?

Now, ignore the chapter division. Matthew didn't put it there. Just keep reading. The very next verse (4:1) informs the reader that Jesus was "tempted by the devil." How would the devil tempt the Son of God? What would he throw at Him first? Notice the first words recorded from Satan in the wilderness. Only three verses after God the Father said, "This IS My beloved Son," the tempter came to Jesus and said, "IF You are the Son of God..." (4:3). The devil did not waste any time to attempt to plant a seed of doubt-you can almost here the hissing from his lips, "Ifffffff..."

> So, here's a question that may sound strange-how many verses does the devil wait in your life before he tries to plant a seed of doubt in your heart regarding the words of God? When you read the words from God that say, "Let no corrupt word proceed out of your mouth" (Eph. 4:29), how many verses is it in your life before the devil tempts you to let a corrupt word out? When you read the

words from God that say, "Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another" (Eph. 4:32), how many verses is it in your life before the devil tempts you to be unkind, hardhearted and unforgiving? Make that application with every verse of truth and instruction from God. How soon does the devil put you to the test?

Friends, don't give the devil an inch! If he was brash enough to throw it back in Jesus' face so soon, he will have no problem testing you immediately! RESIST HIM (Jas. 4:7)!

Don't Wait to Follow

Abraham was a man who was far from perfect. Twice, he lied about his wife's identity because he was afraid to lose his life (Gen 12:10-20; 20:1-18). He missed the mark when it came to trusting the Lord to keep His covenant with him. However, Abraham was found righteous in the eyes of Lord by his

works of faith (Heb 11:8; Rom 4:2).

When the Lord called Abraham to a task, he was ready to do it and he did so immediately. When the Lord told him to leave his land, he did not wait. And, when God called him to confirm his dedication, he did not wait.

In Genesis 12:1-4, God commanded Abraham (Abram at the time) to get out of his country, leave his family and his father's house behind and go

to an unknown land. If we were put in the same circumstance, how would we respond? Would we be willing to forsake our family and leave everything we have built behind? It's possible that we would, but we would probably need some time to think about it. Verse 4 tells us that Abraham did not wait at all. God told him to leave, "So Abram departed..."

When we became Christians, there were sins and poor habits that we had to leave behind in order to follow Christ. Then, as we get older, sometimes we allow those old temptations to weigh us down again. Is anything keeping you from being faithful? In Luke 14:33, Jesus said, "...whoever of you does not forsake all that he has cannot be My disciple."

The Christian life also requires dedication. In Genesis 17:9-14, God told Abraham that He required a sign of His covenant with him. He and all his household needed to be circumcised. This would be a physical sign of his loyalty to God. It was also a very painful procedure. That very same day, Abraham

did as he was commanded. Immediately, he dedicat-Nothing is worth ed himself and his household to the Lord (v. 26-27).

holding onto if it keeps us from following the Lord.

Are we as dedicated as Abraham? Many will make excuses as to why they won't serve God. They put work before the church or allow their friendships to make them second guess committing to church functions. We cannot allow our loyalties to be divided.

Let us follow the example Abraham has shown us. Don't wait to go where the Lord wants to send you. God has demonstrated His promises. If we believe in Him and that He can use us, He will. But, He will only use us if we are fully dedicated to Him. We cannot say we will be good Christians "some day" or "sometimes." Let us be the servants that the Lord requires us to be today and all the time (John 12:26). Nothing is worth holding onto if it keeps us from following the Lord. Drop whatever it is and obey God today.

Don't stop what you're doing for the Lord!

When Nehemiah returned to Jerusalem and began rebuilding the walls, he was faced with considerable opposition, particularly from Sanballat the Horonite, Tobiah the Ammonite official and Geshem the Arab. They "laughed," "despised," "mocked" and "conspired" against Nehemiah and the Jews in their rebuilding efforts (Neh. 2:19; 4:1, 8). They tried to trick Nehemiah into working with them and compromising his efforts (6:1-2).

Pay close attention to his reply. Should this not be our words when we face opposition and attempts to get us to compromise? Nehemiah responded, "I am doing a great work, so that I

cannot come down. Why should the work cease while I leave it and go down to you?" (6:3). And wouldn't you know it, his enemies would not stop. "But they sent me this message four times, and I answered them in the same manner" (6:4).

Our enemy is persistent! May we recognize the GREAT WORK that we have as Christians and not "come down" from it and "cease" what we're doing when faced with opposition! – DS



On the night that He was going to be betrayed, Jesus was offering comforting words to His apostles in an upper room, including an insider's scoop on what He was going to do when He left the earth. "I go to prepare a place for you" (John 14:2). All of the descriptions of heaven in the New Testament offer a mouth-dropping description of an incredible place of beauty,
