

Washing and Cleanliness

When we think of cleanliness, we think of removing dirt from our bodies, clothes, dishes or our houses, but the Jews used the word far differently. God spoke often to them using this word and almost without exception it applied to being ceremonially unclean. This concept can be seen

so clearly in the book of Leviticus where He uses the word "clean" at least forty times. Now add to this that in the same book He uses the word "wash" over thirty times, for often when they became unclean, they were told to wash themselves. When they thought of being unclean, they associated it with washing them-

selves or things in their lives to become clean.

This Old Testament usage has a New Testament application in relation to us and our being cleansed from the filthy pollution of sin. Paul lists a host of sinful actions in his first letter to Corinth. They include fornication, idolatry, homosexuality, thievery and drunkenness. These were common practices in pagan cities. However, when he mentions them as being part of the lives in the Christians, he uses the past tense. It was part of their former lives.

Read carefully his words. "And such were some of you. But you were washed, but you were sanctified, but you were justified" (1 Cor. 6:11). They were no longer stained by

the filthiness of sin; they had been washed. Paul's preaching caused it. They changed when Paul arrived in that city and planted the church. "And many of the Corinthians, hearing, believed and were baptized" (Acts 18:8). The blood of Jesus was the basis on which they were cleansed, for He..."loved us and washed us from our sins in His own blood" (Rev. 1:5). Do not overlook that they were baptized.

Paul mentions this same concept in his letter to Ephesus where he discusses the process of how they were made clean. Christ "...loved the church and gave Himself for her that he might cleanse her with the washing of water by the word" (Eph. 5:25-26). They had heard the word and that caused them to come and be washed in water (Acts 19:1-5).

Jesus' blood? Hear these words spoken to him the day he was saved. Ananias, a messenger sent from God, said, "Now why are you waiting? Arise and be baptized, and wash away your sins, calling on the name of the Lord" (Acts 22:16). He was washed in the blood when he was baptized.

When Paul wrote Titus, he described the process of salvation. It includes two aspects—a renewal of the Holy Spirit and a "washing of regeneration" (Tit. 3:5). Jesus Himself described the new birth as be "born of water and the Spirit." We are not saved by a sinners' prayer. We must be washed!

Two Perspectives on Rebellion

As Israel's "old" and final judge was nearing his last days, the elders of Israel gathered to Samuel and made their demands. The first thing they basically said was, "We don't want you or your sons!" And then they laid out this directive, "Now make us a king to judge us like all the nations" (1

Sam. 8:5). Notice several things about this demand.

Their timeframe for this change was "now." They were done waiting. They wanted satisfaction to their wishes immediately.

Their focus was on "us"—make US to judge US. All they could see were their own selfish desires.

Their standard was "like all the nations." Divine standards were of no interest to them. They wanted to be like everyone else.

At this point, Israel was in full rebellion against God. And the Lord related such to Samuel, when He said, "they have rejected Me, that I should not reign over them" (8:7).

Does any of this sound like what we have seen happening around us—in our nation, in our families, even in our congregations? People want change "now." They are solely focused on self. They want to be like whoever the latest craze is. They are in full rebellion against God.

What should we do? Look at Samuel's perspective when it came to this rebellion. Did he approve of it? Did he celebrate it?

When faced with rebellion against the Lord, Samuel was "displeased" (8:6). Anything that involves sin and going against God should never bring us pleasure or entertain us in any way!

When faced with rebellion against the Lord, Samuel "prayed to the Lord" (8:6). We get frustrated and discouraged sometimes and don't know what to do. Easy! Talk to God about it! Tell Him what is going on and how you feel about! Pray for wisdom!

When faced with rebellion against the Lord, Samuel warned the people and told them "all the words of the Lord" (8:9-10). In similar fashion, we need to warn people of the dangers of yielding to the

devil, for "He will take...He will take...He will take...He will take...He will take...He will take" (stated six times of what an unrighteous ruler would do in 8:11-17). "But the Lord will not hear" those who rebel against Him (8:18; cf. Psa. 34:16).

When faced with rebellion against the Lord, Samuel kept on listening to the Lord and obeying Him. Today, the world around us seems in full rebellion against the God of heaven and His ways. Let us recognize it and respond in a holy manner, just as Samuel did!



The Ultimate Privilege

There is much talk these days about "privilege." While this word has been in the English language for hundreds of years, it is being wielded in order to divide this country along economic and racial lines. But, no matter what monetary or societal privilege a group of people may or may not have in this

world, nothing compares to the privilege of being a Christian. No matter what skin color you have, what neighborhood you grew up in, or what schools you went to, Jesus Christ has offered every soul the ultimate privilege: salvation.

In Deuteronomy 33, Israel is getting ready to enter the Promised Land. Here, Moses gives his blessings to Israel just before leaving to die on Mount Nebo. He tells the people in verse 29, "Happy are you, O Israel! Who is like you, a people saved by the Lord, the shield of your help and the sword of your majesty!"

Israel had been through a lot in the forty years leading up to this point. Over and over, God provided food, protection and favor to the children of Israel. But over and over, Israel complained, sinned and blasphemed their God. In no way did they deserve God's protection, but He saved them anyway. Moses tells His people that no nation in the entire world is as privileged as them. Why? Because God chose to save them, and they did not do a thing to deserve it.

In the world, mercy like this does not exist. Any mistake you or your ancestors may have made can and will be used to "cancel" you. Instead of intellect or education, it is the color of your skin or your gender that determines whether or not you are allowed to speak in public discourse. This is retribution against those born into "privilege." The world has no place for mercy. All the world knows is revenge.

But God is infinitely merciful. He does not hold a grudge like the world. Through the sacrifice of His Son, God extended salvation to every man and woman, no matter where they come from. What privilege of being greater privilege is there? Just like Israel, not one of us did anything to deserve His grace, yet He offers us salvation freely (Eph 2:8-9). "While we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Rom 5:8).

> The world does not understand what it means to be privileged. Only those who have received God's mercy can. No matter what disadvantages we are born into or what struggles we have endured, God has made everyone equal through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Anyone who repents and is baptized in the name of Jesus will be saved (Acts 2:38) and welcomed into the eternal kingdom of the Lord. Thanks be to God for the ultimate privilege of salvation. How happy I am that I have been saved by the Lord.

Can God's expectations for a king apply to you?

God foresaw the time when His people would demand a king, and He set out some parameters for those who would reign over His nation. Consider these two responsibilities. First, the king was to "write for himself a copy of this law in a book" (Deut. 17:18). Do you remember when you used to study for tests in school? Did it help you to get the information locked in your head better if you actually wrote it out with your own hand? What would happen with your Bible knowledge if you took sections of it and wrote it out in your

Second, the king was to keep his handwritten copy of the law "with him, and he shall read it all the days of his life" (17:19). God knew what He was requiring! What happens to your faith when you have read the Bible every day? It is not merely a rote exercise!

Why did God want the king to do this? For the same reason that we should! "That he may learn to fear the Lord...to observe all the words...that he may not turn aside..." (17:19-20).

Your effect on the hearts of others

When the twelve spies came back from their 40-day reconnaissance mission into the Promised Land, the majority reported that "the people" and "the cities" in the land were "greater" and seemingly indestructible. The report, although based on false information, "discouraged" (literally, "melted") the "hearts" of the people (Deut. 1:28). What a negative influ-

ence!

Compare that with Philemon in the New Testament. Paul wrote that he had heard of this Christian brother's "love and faith" and "the sharing of [his] faith," which brought Paul "much joy and comfort" (Phile. 5-7). But Paul's

joy and comfort were actually "because the hearts of the saints have been refreshed by" Philemon (Phile. 7). What a positive influence!

Think about the influence that you have on others. Could it be that your words, attitudes and actions "melt" people's hearts and discourage them? Or do you use your words, attitudes and actions to "refresh" people's hearts and encourage them? The choice is yours! The difference is immeasurable! - DS




