

REVELATION 4:11



## **His Blessings Are Eternally Satisfying**

This Sunday I will partake of the Lord's Supper for the 3,819th time. I vividly remember the first time I sat at His table and meditated on all that Jesus had done for me. I have never tired of that time of meditation, and communion is even more moving now than it was that first time. There are some

things that we must never count as ordinary and outdated. Consider these timeless, eternal truths that are part of our soul.

The worship of God must never grow old. I made a decision more than seventy years ago, and I never have to decide if I will worship God every Sunday. How can we not worship the one "in whom we live and move and have our being" (Acts 17:28)? Daniel reminded King Nebuchadnezzar that it is "God

who holds your breath in His hand and owns all of you" (Dan. 5:23). It is Jehovah God who is responsible for every good and perfect gift that comes to us (Jas. 1:17). As long as I remember these truths, how could worshiping Him ever grow old!

Singing must never grow old. When we properly understand how God views our singing, we will understand this truth. Singing is not properly sounding "Do-Re-Mi" at the proper pitch. Singing is not focused on making sure we noticed whether a note gets a full beat or two beats. God says nothing about the quality of the vocal aspects of singing. He is concerned about the melody coming from our hearts, not the melody coming from our vocal cords (Eph. 5:19). The prophet Isaiah describes the hearts of those who truly worship God. "The ransomed of the Lord shall...come to Zion with singing, with everlasting joy on their heads. They shall obtain joy and gladness; sorrow and sighing shall flee away" (Isa. 51:11).

Listening to the proclamation of God's words should never grow old. I remember as a younger preacher how Franklin Camp listened to my preaching. He had at that time studied the Bible for six hours each day for the previous forty years. What could a young preacher like me say that he had never spent hours studying? Yet he listened to the truths I was talking about like it was the first time he had ever heard it. I preached for years with him in the audience. It was

not my preaching that brought it about! He was one who hungered and thirsted to know all he could about righteousness. It was not my words, but His words that filled this older man's desire to know God's will.

Now think about it. What is there in a Christian's life that should ever grow old? This world has nothing to be compared to what God has given us that never grows old. Let me urge you to think soberly about the thoughts in this article. Let us never grow tired of all our God has given us!



## "Let Me First"

Every parent (and probably every teacher) knows what this is like. You tell your kid to do something and the immediate response is something like, "Ok, but first I'm going to do this other thing." What's going on in that response? "This other thing" has taken priority over whatever the child has

been instructed to do. The child thinks he/she knows better than the parent and that what he/she wants to do is more important. In that moment,

Fortunately, kids grow out of that. Right? There aren't any adults who respond with a "but first" I am going to do something else. Right? And surely there aren't any Christians who respond with a "but first" I am going to do this other thing. Right?

In Luke 9, there was a scribe who came to

Jesus and said, "Lord, I will follow You wherever You go" (9:57). Jesus warned him that it was not a position of earthly prominence to be in His kingdom, as even Jesus had "nowhere to lay His head" (9:58). Jesus then turned to another and said, "Follow Me" (9:59). Notice, like one of those children illustrated above, how he responded.

"But he said, 'Lord, let me first go and bury my father'" (9:59). The Lord gave him a command, but he does not respond as if Jesus is truly "Lord." He had something else that was more important than doing what Jesus had instructed him to do, as evidenced in his words, "Let me first."

A second man also said, "Lord, I will follow You, but let me first go and bid them farewell who are at my house" (9:61). Again, this man addresses Jesus as "Lord," but does not treat Jesus as "Lord." In essence, he said, "I will do what you want me to do, but first I am going to do what I want to do."

Note Jesus' direct censure of this type of attitude— "No one, having put his hand to the plow, and looking back, is fit for the kingdom of irresponsible and God" (9:62).

> Let me ask you—Do you have any moments in your life when you look at the expectations of our LORD and say to Him (perhaps in action more than actual words), "Lord, let me first go and do some-

thing else that is more important in my eyes right now"? Let me follow that up by asking this very sobering question—How is that any different than the little child who responds to a parent's directions, "Ok, but first I'm going to do this other thing"? There is NO difference! In that moment, we are being as irresponsible and selfish as that little child.

May God help us to (1) put our hand to the plow in His kingdom and (2) not look back at what we could do first! Christ, and Christ alone, must be first (Matt. 6:33; Col. 1:18)!

## **Does Jesus Want You to Be Taken Advantage of?**

In Matthew 5:40-42, Jesus gave some commands that may seem a little hard to swallow. He said, "If anyone wants to sue you and take away your tunic, let him have your cloak also. And whoever compels you to go one mile, go with him two. Give to him who asks you, and from him who wants to

borrow from you do not turn away." As Christians, we must obey the commands of our Lord Jesus. So, does Jesus expect us to let people take advantage of us? To answer this question, we need to understand the context of these commands.

The first command is regarding a legal matter. Jesus uses the conditional phrase, "If anyone wants to sue you..." It is clear that the only area this for their next fix. command applies to is in legal matters. So, how do

we apply it? Christians should not be involved in lawsuits over petty things. It is much harder to mend a relationship after a lawsuit than it is to buy a new tunic.

The second command (we summarize as, "Going the extra mile") refers to a Roman law which compelled subjects to transport men on a mission for the government. It was known that many Romans often took advantage of this law. Therefore, this command is to be applied in regard to responding to government abuse. Those who abuse their authority have souls, too. If we insist on exercising our rights, we may miss an opportunity to show them the love of Christ. As Paul said in Romans 12:20, "...for in so doing, you will heap coals of fire on his head."

The third command, "Give to him who asks you..." may be the hardest to accept. In this case, there is no special context in view. This command applies generally. So, how do we apply this command to our lives? Do we have to give liberally to whoever asks of us without exception?

> Jesus is very clear here that Christians need to give feely just like He gave freely. So, can we look to Jesus' life and see how He gave? He said in John 14:14, "If you ask anything in My name, I will do it." But, does Jesus give us everything that we ask? When

> Paul asked Jesus that his thorn in the flesh be taken away, Jesus did not remove it (2 Cor. 12:7-9). Jesus

regulates His giving based on His wisdom and responsibilities. So, our giving must also be regulated in the same way.

Each of us has a responsibility to provide for his family (1 Tim. 5:8). Each of us has a responsibility to work as he is able (2 Thess. 3:10). But, we also cannot refuse to give in retaliation (Deut. 15:8-10). Jesus wants us to exercise wisdom. Giving does not always help; sometimes it hurts. A drug addict is not helped when they get money for their next fix. And, we do not help by giving to those looking to take advantage.

## Articles Published in PBL Family News Emails Last Week

#### Cast it out and as far from you as possible

There is a Greek word used often in the New Testament that literally means "to place or lay away from." It was used of clothes in Acts 7:58, but mostly it is used figuratively. Romans 13:12 states, "Let us cast off the works of darkness." The idea of the word is to "put away from oneself, never to take it up again."

In Colossians 3:8, Paul lists a number of vices that are highly inconsistent with the moral standards of a faithful Christian, and he commands to "cast off" these behaviors "away from oneself." Included in this list is "filthy language out of your mouth." The word for "filthy lan-

guage" involves "obscene speech, dirty talk." James says that "blessing and cursing...ought not" to proceed "out of the same mouth" (3:10), and here Paul is ordering Christians to get "out of your mouth" the words and nuances that are foul, vile and obscene in the eyes of God.

May God help us to "cast off," out of our mouths, the language that does not become a child of the holy God! - DS

#### Who is the god?

The Babylonian king, Nebuchadnezzar, was so egotistical that he thought that he was all-powerful and could wield his authority to coerce anyone to do anything that he wanted. When Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-Nego did not bow down to him or his image, the king threatened to throw them "into the midst of a burning fiery furnace." And then he asked this

> sneering question, "Who is the god who will deliver you from my hands?" (Dan. 3:15).

You and I know the answer to that question, and Nebuchadnezzar himself learned the answer to that question, when he later praised "the God of" these three Hebrews (Dan. 3:28).

Let us consider that question in our lives. Who is the god who can affect the moral decline all around us? Who is the god who can turn our wayward children back to righteousness? Who is the god who can take the mess of my life and straighten it out? Who is the god who will deliver us? We know! "Our God is greater than all gods" (2 Chron. 2:5), for our God "is able" (Eph. 3:20-21)! - DS


