## Two Men Who Changed "Churches"

In the years of teaching others, one problem often has confronted those who are being taught. Some have deep roots in the places where they are worshiping and the decision to leave that behind is often not one that is easily made. They now look at the Bible so differently, for what they now know

is right is so strange from what they were taught, believed and practiced for many years. Perhaps looking at two examples of men in the Bible who "changed churches" might help them as they struggle.

Saul of Tarsus, far better known as the apostle Paul, was a leader in the Jewish religion. As a young man, he was part of the stoning of the first Christian about the church to Ephesus, he taught others in the synagogue. In a martyr. The Bible says that he not only took care of the outer garments of those who were actually killing

a saint, but as he watched Stephen die, he agreed that it was a godly act to kill that Christian (Acts 7:58; 8:1; 22:20). He progressed in his religion and anti-Christian views above his peers (Phil. 3:5-6; Gal. 1:14).

Was Paul an evil, violent man? Far from it! He was part of the Jewish "church," because his one rule was to live by his conscience and he lived a blameless life before God and man (Acts 23:1; 24:16). Yet when he understood the will of God, he immediately became a Christian (Acts 22:16). He left the Jewish "church" and began a new journey as one who was determined to always do the right thing. The fact he so willingly gave up his past life and embraced a new one is evidence of his honesty and devotion to God.

Apollos is another example of a man who "changed churches." We know less about his life before becoming part of the church of Jesus, but everything we know shows his involvement in religion. He was a Jew who had been born in Al-

> exandria, a great city on the coast of Africa with a substantial Jewish settlement. He was man who knew the Bible and was skilled in publicly teaching others (Acts 18:24-25). In some way, he learned of the teachings of John the Baptist, and when he came sense, he had left the Jewish "church" and became part of the "John the Baptist church." A Christian

husband and wife heard him teaching and privately taught him about the church Jesus built. He "changed churches" and began to confront those Jews with whom he had formally worshiped, using the Bible to show them where they were wrong.

Today when one learns about the church of Jesus he stands at a crossroad in his life. The path he chooses reflects the nature of his heart. Two great leaders in the early church were devoted and active in religious lives. Their willingness to change shows what men who are honestly wrong need to do.

## Five Reasons to Love and Study the Book of Acts (Part 3)

We learn

about the

establishment

of the church

of Christ.

One stands at a

crossroad when

The book of Acts (and particularly chapter 2) has been coined, "The Hub of the Bible." It is truly a book that we need to know and love, for within its exciting pages we learn about (1) how to become a Christian and (2) the power of the gospel. In the third place, we need to study this book to learn

about the establishment of the church of Christ.

The church! What a beautiful and central theme in the Bible (and especially of the book of Acts)! The church was not some kind of afterthought or "Plan B" or parentheses that God put in place when the Jews rejected Christ! The church IS THE (not just "part of" it...the church IS THE) "eternal purpose" of God's "manifold wisdom" (Eph. 3:10-11). And we get to see it established, growing and flourishing in the book of Acts.

One thousand years before Christ walked this earth, God promised David that He would "establish his kingdom... forever" (2 Sam. 7:12-16). Daniel used the word "forever" to describe the "kingdom" that God would "set up" and which would "never be destroyed" (Dan. 2:44). That kingdom (i.e., "house" of the Lord) would be established in "Jerusalem" and "all nations" would be part of it (Isa. 2:2-3). When one finishes reading the Old Testament, he has great anticipation.

The New Testament begins with announcements that "the kingdom" is "at hand" (Matt. 3:2; 4:17; 10:7; Luke 10:9), and Jesus Himself promises to "build" His "church" and give "the keys" to this long-awaited "kingdom" (Matt. 16:18-19). Jesus taught for three years about His church/kingdom and even spent His last days on this earth "speaking of the things pertaining to the kingdom of God" (Acts 1:3). When one finishes the gospel accounts, he has great anticipation.

> With great power and enthusiasm, the church was established in Acts 2 with the coming of the Holy Spirit (2:1-4), the preaching of the gospel (2:5-36) and the baptism of about 3,000 souls into the Lord's church (2:37-47). Only upon the baptism of these penitent believers were these individuals "added" by the Lord to His "church" (2:41, 47), for they were "all baptized into one body" (1 Cor. 12:13).

As the gospel spread and individuals were "baptized into Christ" (Rom. 6:3; Gal. 3:27), each of those souls was "added" to His church, spreading the borders of the kingdom (throughout the book of Acts). As "the number of the disciples was multiplying" in the book (6:1), so also (since it is one and the same) were "the churches...multiplied" (9:31). taught the same gospel, believed the same gospel, obeyed the same gospel, and all became part of the same church!

Truly the book of Acts is the "hub of the Bible"!

## The Significance of the Name "Jesus"

...for Jesus, this

name has even

more meaning.

Did you know that Jesus and Joshua have the same name? It's true! The name "Jesus" is actually the English form of the Greek name *lesous*, which is the Greek transliteration of the Hebrew name *Yeshua* or "Joshua." So, Jesus shares a name with the man who led Israel into the Promised Land.

This name turns out to tell us something very significant about who Jesus is.

If you look in Matthew 1:18-23, you will find the story of an angel commanding Joseph, the father of our Lord, to name his son, "Jesus" (v. 21). Not only does the angel tell Joseph what to name the child, but he also tells him why. He says, "...for He will save His people from their sins." It is obvious, then, that this name has something to say about salvation.

The name "Jesus" or "Joshua" has two parts to it. In Hebrew, "Ye" refers to "Yahweh" and "shua" means "salvation." So, the name shared by the son of Nun and the Lord means "Jehovah is salvation." For Joshua, this would have been a way of praising God in the naming of a child. It is a recognition that salvation only comes from God. As the prophet Isaiah states, "I, even I, am the Lord, and besides Me there is no savior" (Isa. 43:11). However, for Jesus, this name has even more meaning.

Looking back at Matthew 1, it is told to us that the nam-

ing of Jesus fulfills the prophecy of Isaiah 7:14. Matthew quotes, "Behold, the virgin shall be with child, and bear a Son, and they shall call His name Immanuel..." (v. 23). Now, how is this a fulfillment of this prophecy? Jesus is not the same name as Immanuel. Where is the connection? Matthew then explains the meaning of Immanuel, saying, "...which is translated, 'God with us." Do you see the connection yet?

What we learn from this passage is that Jesus' name is a declaration of the fact that Jesus is God. While the name is simply a praise of Jehovah for Joshua, it is a statement of Jesus' oneness with the Father. We read in Isaiah 43:11 that there is no Savior besides Yahweh. But the reason the angel told Joseph to name his son "Jesus" was because **He** would save His people for their sins. In the same chapter of Isaiah, God says, "I, even I, am He who blots out your trans-

gressions for My own sake..." (v. 25). These verses make it clear that the only way Jesus would be able save His people from their sins is if He is, in fact, Immanuel, "God with us."

There are many religious groups today who deny the deity of Jesus Christ (ex: Jehovah's Witnesses, Mormons, etc.). But, if they understood the significance of the name of Jesus, they would repent and turn to the one true Lord who can save them from their sins. Jesus is Jehovah, and He will save, "For in Him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily" (Col. 2:9).

#### **Church for Sale**

It's strange to drive down a road and see an old church building with a sign that says, "Church for Sale." For whatever reason, the building at that location is now vacant and no longer being used. So, what is actually for sale is a "Church Building," not the "Church."

The "church" was already bought! Paul told a group of elders that "the church of God [was] purchased with His own blood" (Acts 20:28). There was NO price that any man could pay in order to "buy" the church! Christ did that!


