TO GOD Be the Glory



I Was, I Am and I Will Be

The lives of everyone we know can be summed up in the words: "I was, I am and I will be." We have a past, a present and a future. There is a sense in which Jesus, because of His life, death and resurrection, can be considered in this way (Rev. 1:8). However, when we think about God, we must never

forget that the Omniscient, Omnipotent One is also Omnipresent and inhabits ever moment from the eternal past to the eternal future (Psa. 90:2-4).

This concept is emphasized when Moses spoke tion in His name. to God at the burning bush. He asked God what he should say to the Jews in Egypt when they asked what God's name was. Our God answered, "I Am claims his eternal who He is. Not a mute idol made of wood or stone; who I Am...thus say to the children of Israel, 'I Am has sent me to you." Jehovah God said that His name is "I Am."

The name Jehovah is derived from the same root word in the Hebrew language that was used at that bush when God said, "I Am." Before Moses ascended Mt. Sinai the second time to receive the tablets of stone, God told the prophet that when Moses came to the mountain he would not see His face but would see His glory. There is no description of what Moses physically saw, but God promised him that He would proclaim His name to Moses (Ex. 34:19).

What did Moses see when God proclaimed His name and showed Moses His glory? "The Lord descended in the cloud and stood with him there and proclaimed the name of the Lord" (Ex. 34:5). What did God say when He proclaimed His name? "The Lord, the Lord God, merciful and gracious, longsuffering and abounding in goodness and truth, keeping mercy for thousands, forgiving iniquity and transgression and sin, by no means clearing those guilty, visiting the iniquity of the fa-

thers upon the children and the children's children to **There is no varia-** the third and fourth generation" (Ex. 34:6-7).

His name pronature!

Who is the I Am? He is what He is. His attributes, many of them listed above, explain what the name Jehovah means. His name affirms that He is not one limited by possessing a physical body for He is a Spirit, but a living God who proclaims that His name stands for all that He is!

God's attributes were not just shown at Mt. Sinai, for they are shown on every page of the Bible and in every moment of any time He has dealt with man. His name never changes. He is the same yesterday, today and forever (Heb. 13:8). The "shadow of God" is the same every time it is seen, there is no variation (Jas. 1:17).

God is and always has been the same. There is no variation. He is who He is. He is what He is. His name proclaims His eternal, unchanging nature!



Five Reasons to Love and Study the Book of Acts (Part 4)

No book of the Bible is more important than another, but where would we be without the book of Acts? We need this book! And we need to study and know it, so that we can learn about (1) how to become a Christian, (2) the power of the gospel and (3)

the establishment of the church of Christ. A fourth reason we need to study this book is to learn about the

Evangelism (i.e., taking the gospel to lost souls and teaching them God's Word) is not some optional effort to be put forth by certain members of the church during special times of the year. Evangelism is the very purpose of the church and of each member. The church was purposed by God to make known "the manifold wisdom of God" (Eph. 3:10-11).

importance and urgency of evangelism.

Every single Christian has been commissioned to "preach the gospel to every creature" (Mark 16:15). In the book of Acts, we see first-hand the initial fulfillment of the Great Commission of Christ—we see its importance, we see its effectiveness, we see its constancy, we see its perpetuity.

The book begins with Jesus telling His disciples that they were going to take His saving message from Jerusalem "to the uttermost part of the earth" (1:8). And that is exactly what happens for the next 27 chapters.

"All who dwell in Jerusalem" were hearing the gospel (2:14; 4:16). Even when the apostles were commanded to not "speak at all nor teach in the name of Jesus" (4:18), they continued to go back to the same place and preach the same message (5:25). When persecution arose against the Christians and they were forced out of Jerusalem, they did not stop preaching about Jesus! "Those who were scattered went everywhere preaching the word" (8:4).

> They went to those they hated (8:4-13; 10:1-11:18). They spoke to complete strangers, even ones who were of a different nationality (8:26-40). They preached to those who could have caused them great harm (9:1-19). They went on long trips to carry the gospel to foreign lands (13:1-28:31). When angry folks tried to kill them, they kept right on preaching (14:19-20). Even when the Christians were beaten

and imprisoned, they preached even to the ones who put them there (16:25-40; 21:26-22:21). They imperiled their own lives to get the gospel to hearts who had never heard it (27:1-44). Even in difficult (seemingly impossible situations), they still found ways to teach the gospel to others, even one soul at a time (28:30-31). They preached to governors and kings, as well as beggars and prisoners (3:1-10; 16:25; 24:10-26:32).

Thank God for the book of Acts! We need to study it to be reminded of our purpose—teach the gospel to lost souls!

If you give online...do you WORSHIP?

The command to give on "every first day of the week" (1 Cor. 16:1-2) is truly a blessing from God! We need (for our own good) to give to Him! One of the great advances in technology that has been beneficial to Christians and to congregations alike is the ability to give online. BUT, if you give online, do you worship when you do?

Giving is not merely about the giving (any more than the singing is merely about putting words to a tune or the Lord's Supper is about having some bread and juice)! Giving is something that I must do from my "heart" (2 Cor. 9:7). It is very easy, especially with online giving, to NOT

have my heart engaged in the worship during the time for giving to God. God is LESS interested in what the bank is doing in the transfer of funds to the church (same thing if you write a check) than He is in what your heart is doing in the transfer of love to Him (cf. 2 Cor. 8:8, 24).

When we give online, let's make sure that we "first" give ourselves "to the Lord" (2 Cor. 8:5). Actually, this applies to all worshipers, no matter how they give, doesn't it? -DS

If you give online...do you FELLOWSHIP?

Please think very seriously about this. The worship assembly of the church has a "worship God" (vertically-focused) emphasis to it (John 4:24). That's obvious. But, the worship assembly of the church also has a "come together...for edification" (horizontally-focused) emphasis to it (1 Cor. 14:26). This involves EVERY avenue of worship in which we engage, including our giving.

> The Greek word that is translated as "contribution" in Romans 15:26 is the word koinonia. That same Greek word is translated "fellowship" (12 times, including 2 Cor. 8:4) and "communion" (4 times, including 1 Cor. 10:16).

The word *koinonia* means "close association involving mutual interests and sharing of members." By using that word for "contribution," God wanted Christians to know that inherent within the giving that we do in our weekly worship is a sharing and fellowship with each other. The giving is not just about me...but about us...giving together.

I am thankful that when our elders introduced online giving that they also introduced those green slips, so that everyone could join in and share together in our worship, no matter how we give! Let's use them...as we fellowship in giving! - DS




