King Nebuchadnezzar was filled with pride because of the massive image he had made of gold. That image stood nine stories high and was nine feet wide at its base. Imagine how much gold it would have taken to make this image. His arrogance caused him to demand the gathering of all the govern-

ment officials, even from the most distant reaches of the Babylonian kingdom. They were ordered to be present at the dedication of the image.

king's message that when the signal was given every Babylonian who heard it was to immediately fall down and worship that golden image. Any person who did not bow before the image was to immediately be cast into the midst of a burning fiery fur-

nace. Most people know how three Jewish young men refused to bow and, though cast into the furnace, were delivered by God.

The end of the story finds the pagan king affirming that there is only one God, asking who can deliver men from the fiery furnace. However, the king's pride again surfaced in the very next chapter (Dan. 4). We know about this because of the account when Daniel was called for a second time to interpret the meaning of the king's dream about a massive tree. It was cut down and became like a beast which grazes in the field. Later, another great tree grew from the original stump. Daniel explained the dream to the king.

The tree figuratively depicted the proud king, Nebuchadnezzar. The fact that he ruled the earth filled his heart with pride, and he thought his great abilities were the reason for his position. Daniel said, "The tree which you saw...it is you...who have grown and become strong; for your greatness

...reaches to the heavens" (4:20-22). In the dream There is no place the king had seen a being from heaven coming down At that dedication, the king's herald read the for pride in those saying, "Chop down the tree and destroy it...let it be wet with the dew of heaven, and let him graze with the beasts of the field" (4:23).

> Daniel then told the king's destiny. "They shall drive you from men, your dwelling shall be with the beasts of the field...till you know that the Most

High rules in the kingdom of men, and gives it to whomever He chooses" (4:25).

Read this entire chapter. It literally happened to the king and humbled him. His pride was gone, for he saw how small and insignificant he was. He became a worshiper of God.

What a lesson for men filled with pride. They had nothing to do with whatever makes them think they are better than others. What a comforting lesson for us in a world filled with evil rulers. Our God, the Almighty Holy One, rules this world. There is no place for pride in those who know this!



### Which "Love" Do You Have for Jesus?

When we read the New Testament and study the Greek language behind our English translations, we find out that the Greeks had more than one word for "love," and each of those words had a distinctive meaning. While the word agape existed in

the Greek language before Jesus came to earth, Jesus came and snatched that word from the common language of the day and made it a distinctly Christian love. The Greek word *phileo* was commonly used in

that day, as evidenced by cities named "Philadelphia" (Rev. 3:7), meaning "brotherly love." So, which kind of "love" do you have for Jesus?

When we study the different Greek words for "love," Christians often focus quite a bit on agape love (and rightfully so). This term truly became

uniquely Christian. It is the ultimate, premier form of love that is unconditional, unselfish and seeks what is best for the one to whom the love is extended.

"God so loved the world" (John 3:16). This is agape love. "Greater love has no one than this, than to lay down one's life for his friends" (John 15:13). This is agape love. "Christ also has loved us and given Himself for us" (Eph. 5:2). This is agape love. Our Father and our Savior have agape love for us.

Love Jesus with your deepest emotions, as your dearest Friend

"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart" (Matt. 22:37). This is agape love. "If you love Me, keep My commandments" (John 14:15). This is agape love. We are to have agape love for our Father and our Savior. We are to love Him unconditionally, unselfishly and seek what He wants, rather than what we want. As Christians, I suspect that we expect that we need to love our Lord in this way. Do we?

> Interestingly, there is another word that Paul uses for the "love" we are to have for Christ. In the closing verses of First Corinthians, the Holy Spirit revealed these words, "If anyone does not love the Lord Jesus Christ, let him be accursed" (1 Cor. 16:22). The word for "love" here is not agape but the Greek phileo, which is a "brotherly love." What does that mean? Phileo love is a tender, affectionate love that is tied to one's emotions. It is the love between the dearest

of friends that knits their souls together (cf. 1 Sam. 18:1).

So, which kind of "love" do you have for Jesus? Do you love Jesus with the ultimate, unconditional, unselfish love that yearns for what He wants? We must! But, do you also love Jesus with your deepest emotions, as your dearest Friend, with whom you want to spend every moment of every day right next to Him? What a warning Paul gives if we do not have that kind of tender affection for Jesus-"let him be accursed." Let us mean it, "My Jesus, I love Thee!"

## So You've Been Baptized...Now What?

There are few moments in the life of a Christian that compare to the feeling that comes at the moment of salvation. You have finally given in to the call to repentance (Acts 2:38) and put on Christ in baptism (Gal. 3:27), washing away all the guilt of sin (Acts 22:16).

That feeling, however, can easily fade away if you were not taught how to live after that mo-

ment. We were called to a purpose. "For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk that can be done in them" (Eph. 2:10). So, once we have put on Christ, there is an expectation for us to get to that work.

What can be expected of brand-new Christians? 1 Peter 2:2 tells us, "...as newborn babes, desire the pure milk of the word, that you may grow

thereby..." This means that there is time needed in study before spiritual maturity can begin. The Hebrews writer expands on this, saying, "...solid food belongs to those who are of full age, that is, those who by reason of use have their sense exercised to discern both good and evil" (Heb. 4:14). This is a warning that those inexperienced are at risk of being swayed by false doctrines.

So, does this mean that new Christians should just hide in their closet, studying until they memorize a certain amount of Scriptures? Absolutely not! There is work that can be done by even the youngest of Christians.

In Acts 9, we read of the conversion of Paul. After such a radical change of heart, we would expect this new Christian to require a fair amount of study and training before attempting to take on the work of the gospel. But, that is not what we see in Paul.

> In verses 20-22, this brand-new babe in Christ did the exact opposite of what we expect. "Immediately he preached the Christ in the synagogues..." (v. 20). What would Paul know about preaching the gospel? He didn't go to a school of preaching. He was a filthy sinner with the blood of Christians on his hands. Nevertheless, verse 22 tells that he was able to confound the Jews "...proving that this Jesus is the Christ." This new Christian was

When we rise from the waters of baptism, we may ask, "Well...now what?" The answer is the same that it was for Paul and all other Christians, "Go and make disciples" (Matt. 28:19-20). A wise preacher once told me that if you know enough to obey the gospel, then you know enough to teach the gospel. God has work for you to do! You don't need a degree or be perfect to teach someone the gospel. All you need is the courage to tell someone what Christ has done for you.
