When He Left the Earth...

Most in Christendom believe that Jesus was the Son of God who came in human form to do the will of His Father. They believe that He arose from the dead and shortly afterwards ascended into heaven. What is often overlooked is what impact He had while on this earth, and what His plan

was after He ascended.

Even a casual reader of the New Testament will immediately discover that He so often spoke of the kingdom. In the four gospel accounts of His life, the kingdom is mentioned over 130 times. Far too many have overlooked this truth repeated so many times, and in doing so, they fail to see just how that said the kingdom kingdom is related to what was involved in His plan after He ascended.

Have you ever considered just how many individuals announced that the kingdom was about to be established? John the Baptist taught that the kingdom was at hand (Matt. 3:2). When Jesus first began teaching, He told those who heard Him that the kingdom was at hand, it was about to be established (Mark 1:15). As He lived on this earth, He sent the twelve apostles out to teach every Jew in every city that the kingdom was about to come (Matt. 10:7). Later, He sent another 70 individuals to go among the Jews and promised them that the kingdom was about to become a reality (Luke 10:9). That's 84 messengers sent by God in a period of about three years who were telling everyone that God's new kingdom, led by the King of all kings, was about to become a reality.

Look at how specific Jesus was in telling those who listened to Him about the precise time that kingdom was to be established. His words are so easy to understand. "Assuredly, I say to you that there are some standing here who will not

> taste death till they see the kingdom of God present with power" (Mark 9:1). Imagine that you had been standing there and heard Him say these words. What would you believe about when that kingdom would come into existence?

> The reason some struggle with the words of these 84 prophets sent by God is because they have heard so many teachers talk about the fact that

when He comes the second time at the end of the world He would finally establish the kingdom. If that is true, you cannot reconcile this with the clear teaching of heaven's 84 messengers. Common sense says we should first listen to these witnesses instead of some televangelists and pastors today who say the kingdom is yet future.

What is that kingdom like? Take time to read the book of Acts telling what happened just days after He ascended. When He left the earth, what did He leave on the earth?



When You Partake of the Lord's Supper

The congregation sings a hymn to "help prepare our minds" for the Lord's Supper. The words are very meaningful, even though we've sung it a hundred times before. Then, a group of men stand up and walk to the front table and pass some trays

By David Sproule to each other. They stand there in respectful silence as a man gets up to make some appropriate comments.

Initially it is a little hard to follow and make the connection, but then he reads some verses about the cross, which are as familiar as any Biblical text. He prays a short prayer of thanks, after which the men disperse and begin to pass the trays up and down the rows. The tray comes to you, and you take a miniature piece of thin bread and place it in your mouth. What now?

The tendency may be to think, "I'm done until the next tray comes around." If that's the case, there's some time to kill between now and then. But, when examining the New Testament, it is evident that I'm not "done." The early church "came together to break bread" (Acts 20:7). But their purpose was not merely to pass the trays and be reverently quiet. Their Lord, Savior and Friend had suffered a viciously cruel death for them. At His behest, they were going to "remember" Him, "discern" His body and "examine" themselves (1 Cor. 11:23-29). What would that involve?

Remember His anguish. His "soul" was "exceedingly sorrowful," and He was in "agony" (Matt. 26:38; Luke 22:44), long before anyone laid a hand on Him.

Remember His arrest. After praying through sweat and blood, "a band of soldiers" came to Him with "weapons" ("swords and clubs," Matt. 26:47), and "arrested Jesus and bound Him" like a criminal (John 18:3, 12).

> Remember His adversaries. He was condemned by liars testifying before liars, who preferred a violent murderer be released into the public rather than innocent Jesus, and shouted with prevailing cries, "Crucify Him" (Matt. 26:57-68; 27:1-26).

> Remember His assault. He was stripped, scourged, crowned with thorns, spat upon and mocked mercilessly (Matt. 26:27-31).

Remember His assassination. He was brutally nailed to a cursed tree to die the most wretched and agonizing of deaths but had "done nothing wrong" (Luke 22:26-46).

No! I'm not done when I pick up a piece of bread or drink from a little cup! Because for six long tormenting hours, He was not done! Let us remember! Let us discern! Let us examine! Let our manner of partaking be acceptable and worthy in His sight, and may we not distract others from remembering, discerning and examining themselves!

Is the Suffering Servant Israel?

Isaiah 53 is probably the most famous Messianic passage of all Scripture. In this chapter, we learn of the Suffering Servant. The prophet tells us that this servant would be "despised," "rejected," "a Man of sorrows," "smitten by God," "wounded for our transgressions," "bruised for our iniqui-

ties," and heal us "by His stripes."

If you are in any way familiar with the life of Jesus of Nazareth, then you cannot help but see that this prophecy was fulfilled in Him. Throughout the New Testament, it is revealed that Jesus was, in fact, the Servant described in Isaiah 53. For example, God's other servwhen speaking of Jesus, Peter wrote, "...who Himself bore our sins in His own body on the tree, that we, having died to sins, might live for righteousness—by

whose stripes you were healed" (1 Pet. 2:24). If it was obvious to the New Testament writers and every Christian that Jesus is the Suffering Servant of Isaiah 53, then how do modern Jews reconcile not believing in Jesus as the Messiah?

The most common argument modern Jews make is that the Suffering Servant is not the Messiah. In this view, it is argued that the Servant is not an individual, but the entire nation of Israel. Meaning, that is the revived Jewish kingdom that will fulfill this prophecy. They point to several passages preced-

ing Isaiah 53 that directly identifies "Jacob and Israel" as a servant of God (cf. Isa. 41:8-9; 44:1-2, 21, 26; 45:4; 49:3). But is this the same servant of Isaiah 53?

Without spending too much time in Isaiah, it can be seen very quickly that the prophet refers to more than one person as God's servant. Early in the book, kings Hezekiah and Cyrus are called servants of God. Furthermore, in chapters 42-53, it is clear that Isaiah speaks of two different servants of

God. Certainly, there is Israel, but there is another. This is shown clearest in chapter 49:1-7, where this second servant speaks to Israel. In verse 5, He says, "And now the Lord says, who formed Me from the womb to be His Servant, to bring Jacob back to Him, so that Israel is gathered to Him..." Not only is there a second servant, but this Servant will redeem God's other servant, Israel. This is the Messiah.

So, which servant is Isaiah 53 talking about? We can prove that the Suffering Servant is the Messiah. In verse 8, we see who is benefited by His suffering. "...For the transgressions of My people He was stricken." Who were God's people in the Old Testament? They were Israel. Is it possible for Israel to be stricken for the transgressions of Israel? Nonsense! This servant must be the Messiah, whose life described in the prophets was perfectly fulfilled in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus of Nazareth.

Flip a switch

John Henry Holmes—a 19th-century electrical engineer and inventor from Newcastle, England—is credited with inventing the light switch in 1884. Never before could an individual so quickly turn something on or off. Or is that true?

The apostle Peter utilized a type of switch in Galatians 2. When he visited the Gentile city of Antioch, "he would eat with the Gentiles" (Gal. 2:11-12), for his fellow Jews were not around. But when Jews came to visit him from Jerusalem, "he withdrew and separated himself [from the Gentiles], fearing" the Jews (2:12). You see, Peter flipped a switch.

Do you have that kind of a switch? Do you "flip a switch," depending on "who you are around"? Are you friends with certain people, until some other friends come around? What about your speech or your conduct? Does it vary (on/off) depending on who is around? Verse 13 calls that "playing the hypocrite," which is condemned repeatedly by our God (Jas. 3:17; 1 Pet. 2:1). Friends, Jesus said to turn your light "on" for Him and leave it "on" (Matt. 5:16; Phil. 2:15). - DS



It's interesting how current events can be a reminder of a similar event in the Bible. While Paul was in Ephesus in Acts 19, "there arose a great commotion about the Way" (19:23), and unbelievers targeted Paul for his preaching and miracles (19:27). Read the reactions of the people carefully: "They were full of wrath and cried out...So the whole city was filled

> with confusion...Some therefore cried one thing and some another, for the assembly was confused, and most of them did not know why they had come together...all with one voice cried out for about two hours" (19:18, 29, 32, 34). The city clerk finally spoke up and urged for matters to be "determined in the lawful assembly," in-

stead of "this disorderly gathering" (19:39-40).

God calls upon us to "reason" through things (Isa. 1:18). He tells us to "not follow a crowd to do evil" (Ex. 23:2). He warns us that evil influences can lead us astray (1 Cor. 15:33). Let us ever be mindful to consider those with whom we associate and, rather than following blindly, let us set a godly example by choosing to follow Christ first (Matt. 5:16; 1 Pet. 2:9-12). -DS
