#### He Gave Me a New Song

The songs that we sing are often a mirror of our hearts. This is clearly seen in the songs sung before the early Christians became saints and those songs which they sang afterwards. This is so vividly seen when we look at the contrast of the "before" and "after" songs of the Christian faith. This is

what Paul does in Ephesians chapter five.

To understand this, we must know what it would have been like to live in Ephesus before Paul brought Christ to them. In the midst of that city was a large temple used to worship Dionysus or Bacchus. I used Artificial Intelligence to find a description of his worshippers. He was the god of wine and worship festivals involved in excessive drinking and debauchery. "AI" used these words: "wild and uninhibited

behavior, excessive and hedonistic behavior, drunkenness, promiscuity, violence, moral ruin, dancing, singing and sexual orgies." This describes the "before" worship of the Ephesians.

Paul described just how corrupt the pagan world was in the first eleven verses of Ephesians five when he mentions, "Fornication...uncleanness...covetousness...filthiness...foolishness...filthiness...foolish talking...coarse jesting...fornicators... unclean...unclean person...covetousness...idolaters and deceivers...darkness...and unfruitful works of darkness."

He emphasizes, "It is shameful to even speak of those things done by them in secret." Paul contrasts this evil with the lives of those who walk in the light and must NEVER be partakers of what they once did, but to walk in the light and reprove those in the darkness of paganism.

As he concludes his discussion, he contrasts their former "church" with the new worship they now engaged in. The old worship involved being "drunk with wine" ("spirits"), unlike

the worship of Christians, where those who were filled with the Spirit (not spirits) were given psalms (1 Cor. 14:26) and inspired songs and prayers, both in known and unknown languages (1 Cor. 14:15-16). They were babes in Christ, and when they did not know how to pray, the Spirit provided the prayers for them.

Do not simply read the words about New Testament singing and ignore the total context of Ephesians five. When first read, the words of Paul about not being drunk with wine seems so much out of place. Keep it in the context as you read those verses. Pagan worship of Dionysus involves excessive drinking, debauchery, chaotic behavior. Instead of bringing pagan ideas into the church, they were to let the Spirit lead them to be singing His psalms and spiritual songs. Our worship is to always be done decently and in order. We have the words of the Spirit to show us how!

#### **Count Your Blessings, Name Them ONE By ONE**

There are

a lot of

"ONE" blessings

We know the hymn. Perhaps it is one of your favorites. How could it not be? We reference it often, as it is a needed reminder (from the eloquent pen of Johnson Oatman, Jr.) that we need to count our blessings, even (or maybe especially) when we are "tempest-tossed" on "life's billows," when

we are "discouraged," "burdened" or "amid the conflict."

To actually "count" our blessings and "name them one by one" would be an impossible task. But let me offer you a vantage on something that you already know but to see them as BLESSINGS—true blessings. Let's consider them ONE by ONE.

Blessing #1: There is ONE GOD (Eph. 4:6).
There are people in the world who believe in a multiplicity of gods. How confusing must that be? You understand this truth: "The Lord our God, the Lord is one" (Deut. 6:4), and "there is no other God but one" (1 Cor. 8:4).

Blessing #2: There is ONE LORD (Eph. 4:5). People today serve all sorts of "masters" (cf. Matt. 6:24), even their own "lusts and pleasures" (Tit. 3:3). You are blessed to know and serve "the Lord of lords" (Rev. 17:14).

Blessing #3: There is ONE SPIRIT (Eph. 4:4). Folks today seem to go off in so many directions, but Jesus sent "the Spirit of truth" (only one!) to guide the apostles into "all

truth" (only one!) (John 16:13). What a blessing to know the one revealed way that is pleasing to God (Matt. 7:14, 21), given to us by His one Spirit and not man (2 Pet. 1:20-21).

Blessing #4: There is ONE FAITH (Eph. 4:5). Many today believe that truth is subjective ("my truth" and "your truth"). How confusing! How blessed are you to have and to know God's singular, objective truth given to us in His Word (John 8:32; 17:17) and delivered in its fullness (Jude 3).

Blessing #5: There is ONE CHURCH (Eph.

**4:4).** With thousands of manmade denominations in existence, it can be very confusing to "pick a church." What a blessing to know and be part of Jesus' one church, which He built (Matt. 16:18), purchased (Acts 20:28) and approves today (1 Cor. 1:10-13).

Blessing #6: There is ONE BAPTISM (Eph.

**4:5).** While man has complicated God's simple plan, you are blessed to know that the Lord only taught (Mark 16:16), authorized (Acts 2:38) and accepts (Acts 19:4-5) His one baptism of immersion (Col. 2:12) for the purpose of washing away sins (Acts 22:16).

Blessing #7: There is ONE HOPE (Eph. 4:4). Count your blessings, name them ONE by ONE! There are a lot of "ONE" blessings we enjoy, but perhaps none is more joyful to consider than the "living" (1 Pet. 1:3) "hope of eternal life" (Tit. 1:2; 3:7) of being with Christ (Phil. 2:19) forever (1 Thess. 4:17).

#### The Great Commission and Acts 2

Before Jesus ascended to the Father, He left the apostles with the Great Commission, recorded in Matthew 28:18-20. The Great Commission summarizes the mission of the apostles and of Christians everywhere.

On the Day of Pentecost, the apostles fulfilled the Great Commission in Peter's

first sermon. We can look to Acts 2 and see how each part of Christ's mission statement for His church was enacted at Pentecost and must be carried out today.

The Lord begins, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth" (Matt. 28:18). The sole source of authority in the church is Jesus Christ. In Acts 2:4, the Holy Spirit descended on the apostles, endowing them with miraculous gifts, signifying an extension of Christ's authority on them. Paul writes in 1 Thessalonians 4:2-8 that their commandments were given through the Lord Jesus. "Therefore he who rejects this does not reject man, but God, who has also given us His Holy Spirit" (v. 8). Today, our authority must come from the same source, the inspired words of God, found in the Bible.

Next, Jesus says, "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations" (Matt. 28:19a). In Acts 2, the apostles were provided with an audience of men from every nation (v. 5-11). By the power of the Holy Spirit, each person in attendance

heard Peter's sermon in his own tongue. No matter where they came from or what language they spoke, they heard the message of Christ. In verses 14 through 39, Peter preached to them the gospel that calls all men, everywhere, to be reconciled to God through discipleship in the church of Christ.

But how do you enter Christ's church? How is a sinner made into a disciple? The men at Pentecost were cut to the heart, realizing that they had crucified the Lord. They asked,

"Men and brethren, what shall we do?" (v. 37). Jesus told the apostles back in Matthew 28:19-20 how to make disciples. By "baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you." So, Peter replied to the multitude, "Repent, and let every one of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins" (Acts

2:38). "Then those who gladly received his word were baptized; and that day about three thousand souls were added to them" (Acts 2:41).

If we want to be the church that Jesus Christ died for, we must follow the Lord's mission statement. The apostles obeyed each tenet of the Great Commission and established the church in Acts 2. We too must follow this plan for entering His church and growing His church.

If you believe in the sovereignty of God, you know that "the Most High rules in the kingdom of men" (Dan. 4:17, 25, 32; 5:21). #### My rights as a citizen

Just because you "have a right" as a citizen of this country does not necessarily mean that you have approval from God for such.
