

The Power of His Resurrection

As Paul begins his letter to the church at Rome, he uses words which clearly focus on the resurrection of Jesus. He said that Jesus was "...declared to be the Son of God with power...by the resurrection from the dead" (1:4). In his letter to the church at Philippi, he spoke of his great desire to

"...know Him and the power of His resurrection" (3:10). Lives are changed if we never forget that His resurrection empowers us to forsake all for Him. Stand

Our salvation will never happen until we believe in the resurrection. Listen to what Paul says about this. "If you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your hearts that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved" (Rom. 10:9). Our souls, our hearts, must believe that God raised Him from the dead. This shows the power of the resurrection.

The resurrection on the third day is the foundational truth of Christianity. When Paul used the expression "first of all," it was far more than the "first point" of a paragraph. The Greek shows that of all the truths in the gospel it was first in importance. "I delivered to you first of all...that Christ died....and that He was buried, and that He rose again the third day according to the Scriptures" (1 Cor. 15:4).

The resurrection assures that preaching is not vain.

Paul said, "And if Christ is not risen, then our preaching if empty" (1 Cor. 15:14). There is no need to preach! There is no need to try to get men to come to Jesus. If there is no resurrection, then Jesus is a fraud and the empty tomb is a myth. Yet, Jesus showed the entire world's need when He said to preach the gospel (His death, burial and resurrection—1 Cor. 15:1, 4) to every creature (Mark 16:15).

> The resurrection gives reality to hope and faith. Look again at 1 Corinthians 15:14 and especially the closing words. "If Christ is not risen then...your faith is also empty." This entire chapter ties the empty tomb to our resurrection to the hope eternal life with Him.

The resurrection changed Jesus' entire family of Jesus. Prior to His resurrection, His brothers did not believe in Him (John 7:5). For three decades none of them thought He was the Son of God. On one oc-

casion, "...they went out to lay hold of Him, for they said, 'He is out of His mind.'" But less than three years later they were all in the upper room and were part of selecting the apostle to replace Judas (Acts 1:14, 26)! What changed them? Jesus had appeared to James, his oldest brother (1 Cor. 15:7), but His brothers believed the testimony of those who had seen Him.

The power of the resurrection will change you. Stand and look at the empty tomb. Something happens to you as you look inside—He is not there! Its emptiness will change you!



Where Are the Nine?

Similarities and differences. In any group of people, you will probably find similarities and differences. This is true in a third grade classroom, in a boardroom of executives, on a football field, in a grocery store, etc., etc. This was also true of groups of people that Jesus encountered.

In Luke 17:11-19, Jesus met ten men. Now let's consider their similarities and their differences. Similarities: all ten were men, all were lepers, all stood afar off, all asked Jesus for mercy, all were told by Jesus to go to the priests, all went to the priests, all were cleansed of their leprosy. all realized that they were cleansed of their leprosy. Differences: only one returned to Jesus, only one glorified God, only one gave thanks to Jesus, it appears that this one man was a Samaritan and the other nine may have been Jews. What's the point?

First, consider the similarity of the transformation that has occurred in all lives of New Testament Christians. At one time, we all "stood afar off" (Luke 17:12) in our sins (Eph. 2:13). We could not come near because of our sinful choices (Isa. 59:1-2). But, when we called (Luke 17:13) upon the name of the Lord in repentance and baptism (Acts 2:21, 38; 22:16), we were all "cleansed" (Luke 17:14; 1 Cor. 6:11; Eph. 5:26).

Like the Ethiopian treasurer, we went on our way rejoicing (Acts 8:39), having our sins blotted out by the blood of Jesus. Our lives were changed immensely and eternally.

Second, however, consider the differences in our responses. As in Luke 17, not everyone who was "healed" of our souls' diseases "returned." Some were baptized, but then went back to their old life, without making much change at all. Some were baptized, but made only a few modifications in

> their lives, where such were convenient or not overly troublesome. Some became active members of the Lord's body for a while, only to get distracted and fall away later. Some pressed on, kept on seeing that they were continually healed, and they continually returned to glorify God and thank Christ.

Which group are you in? In Luke 17, Jesus questioned, "Were there not ten cleansed? But where are the nine?" (17:17). Are you among the majority (i.e., in the nine) who are likely thankful for what the Lord has done but have other things to do? Are you among the minority (i.e., in the one) who find it more important to be with the Lord and glorify God than any other thing in this life?

In any group in which you will find yourself, there will be similarities and there will be differences. But, ask yourself this question, "Do I share similarities or do I share differences with Jesus Himself?" That is the wise comparison to make!

What Kind of Christian Are You?

"What kind of Christian are you?" is a question I have been asked countless times. I'm a big fan of the response, "Hopefully a good one." But, this question is asked for a very good reason.

Livescience.com. According to "Estimations show there are more than 200

Christian denominations in the U.S and... 45,000 globally." Is this what Jesus wanted? In Matthew 16:18, Jesus told Peter after his confession, "I will build My church." Notice that He did not say, "churches." Clearly, the Lord only had one church in mind.

Jesus prayed in the garden before His betrayal that those who believe in Him, "be made perfect in one, and that the world may know that You have sent Me, and have loved them as You have

loved Me" (John 17:23). He is saying that the oneness of the church is itself evidence that Christ was sent by God. So, would the Son of God come to sow division among His followers? Of course not.

Then, the apostle Paul said, "I plead with you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that you all speak the same thing, and that there be no divisions among you" (1 Cor. 1:10). The church must be one because Christ is one. Paul continues, "Each of you says, 'I am of Paul,' or 'I am of Apollos,'

or 'I am of Cephas,' or 'I am of Christ.' Is Christ divided?" (v. 12-13). By its nature, the church cannot be divided because Christ is not divided.

So, which church then is Christ's church? The church is the body of His disciples, who observe the pattern demonstrated by Christ and His apostles. In Matthew 28:19-20, Jesus told His apostles exactly how His church was to be built. He said, "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing

them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things The true church that I have commanded you." So, if we want to find the church of Christ, then we need to find the church that looks to Christ for authority, baptizes according to Christ, and relies on the doctrines of Christ.

> The true church of Christ is found in the Bible. Paul said in Galatians 1:8-9, "But even if we, or

an angel from heaven, preach any other gospel to you than what we have preached to you, let him be accursed." We cannot look to any other source. Therefore, Christ's church cannot be found in any manmade dogma, creed, or denomination.

What kind of Christian am I? According to the Bible, there is only one kind of Christian. "For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body-whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free-and have all been made to drink into one Spirit." (1 Cor. 12:13). I am a Christian of the one true faith.

> The same Hebrew word used for "weaver" in Exodus 26:36; 27:16; 36:37; 38:23; 39:29 is also found in Psalm 139. Inside of his mother's

womb, the psalmist knew that he had been "skillfully wrought." That word means, "to embroider, weave colored thread; to do needle-point embroidery."

If no right-thinking person would ever believe that a beautifully -woven curtain could exist without a weaver, how could a beautifully-woven baby (NOT fetus!) exist without being "intricately woven" (ESV) by an all-powerful, life-giving Weaver? Life in the womb is evidence of God's fingers at work! -DS
