When Jesus prayed that all who believed in Him would have the same unity that He had with the Father (John 17:20-21), He revealed that having many denominations would create unbelievers! A simple computer search will show that in America there are between at least 20,000 different denomina-

tions. It shows just how little unity exists in "Christendom" today. There is no way this situation is like the unity of Jesus and His Father.

monly held practice is to change the church to fit into the mold in our world. Denominations are in great turmoil over the acceptance of transgenders, appointing homosexual clergymen, and the basic organizational structure of the various religions. It is even divided over how to be saved from our sins.

However, the world in which the church entered was even more diverse than our own. Every Gentile region had its own gods and how each god was to be worshiped and served. Even Judaism, which worshiped God, was in turmoil. The Sadducees had decided that God did not want men to believe in angels, eternal souls or the resurrection. The Pharisees had changed ancient Judaism and added their own rules so much that Jesus said they had made God's commandments void (Mark 7:9). The Jewish nation had failed to follow God as He had revealed and because of them "...the name of God was blasphemed among the Gentiles" (Rom. 2:23-24). They exalted their own religious ideas above what God said.

How did the church adapt to change the first century world? They did not change the church Jesus established. It did not make any difference if they were in Africa, Arabia, Turkey, Asia, Rome, Corinth, Europe or anywhere on the earth. Paul,

who traveled and established churches in so many places, said he preached the same doctrine in every One of the reasons such division is a com- thority to change church (1 Cor. 4:17). Corinth had changed the Lord's supper to be more like pagan feasts, and Paul said they were no longer partaking of the Lord's Supper but your own Supper (1 Cor. 11:20-21).

> Paul established the church at Ephesus and change the world preached there for three years. What happened when he left? They drifted so far away from what he taught them that Jesus was about to remove His recognition of them as the church of Christ (Rev. 2:1-5). What solution did He give them? It was not to change the church to fit better into the society at Ephesus! It was to repent and return to what they had been taught.

> > The church in every place should be no larger than what the faithful preaching of the gospel will bring. We are not to change the church but to change the world!

"I'm just a passing through"

Picture for a moment the hallway in your high school. Hard concrete floors. Harsh fluorescent lighting. Metal lockers on both sides. Was that the main part or main focus on your high school days? No! It was just a passage used to get you from one place to another.

This is not unlike some trips that you have taken. Maybe you were going to see family or you were **Your life**

going on a vacation. You get in your car and hit the highway for hours and hours. You stop along the way for one night in a hotel or campsite, but the next morning you're back on the road. Were the travel days your actual destination or the main focus of your trip? No! They were just temporary passage to your high school. get you to where you were going.

Those two examples are used to illustrate the nature of your life. Your life is like the hallway in your high school. Your life is like the travel days to go see family. The main focus is the destination, not on the passage to get there. The passageways are essential and must be properly planned and used, but if you get stuck in and only focus on the passage, you'll never get to the destination.

Now, let's make the application. Our life is described in Scripture like that of "aliens and pilgrims" (1 Chron. 29:15) and "sojourners and exiles" (1 Pet. 2:11, ESV). We are merely temporary residents on this earth, for "our days on earth are as a shadow" (1 Chron. 29:15) or "a vapor that appears for a little time and then vanishes away" (Jas. 4:14). How much focus do we put on a shadow or on a vapor? Our focus is usually on the actual substance.

Where is your focus? Is your primary focus on the here and now of temporary life on this earth (and the word

> "primary" is key), or is your primary focus on the there and then of eternal life in heaven? Paul said, "We do not look at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen. For the things which are seen are temporary, but the things which are not seen are eternal" (2 Cor. 4:18).

We put so much emphasis sometimes on the lives we are living now in our bodies, which are merely "jars of clay" (2 Cor. 4:7), that we neglect "reaching forward" to "press toward the goal" of eternity with Christ (Phil. 3:13-14; 1:21-23). This earthly life is not (don't misunderstand) unimportant or insignificant. But the life we are living right now has a purpose! That purpose is not to make "provision for the flesh, to fulfill its lusts" (Rom. 13:14), but our purpose is to glorify God (Isa. 43:7), exemplify Christ for others to see (Gal. 2:20) and win souls to Christ (Luke 4:43). Are you fulfilling your purpose? Are you focused on your eternal goal?



Service Requires Trust

Over the last four years, it has been debated whether or not America has gone through a recession. While there is still a lot of debate on this issue, one look at gas prices or a trip to the supermarket will show that there is a lot of uncertainty these days. To deal with this, many of us are giving much

more attention to how we spend our time and money. We are weighing our priorities and cutting out the things we see as less important. Where are we placing our pri-...we can't allow orities?

In 1 Kings 17:8-16, God tells the prophet Elijah to go to Zerephath where he will meet a widow whom God prepared to provide for him. When Elijah meets her, he does as he was told and asks for water and a morsel of bread.

Then, we learn in verse 12 that this is no small request. All she has left is a handful of flour and a little oil. In fact, her situation is so desperate that she tells Elijah, "I am gathering a couple of sticks that I may go in and prepare it for myself and my son, that we may eat it, and die."

Elijah understands her apprehension. So, he comforts her with the revelation that God is going to perform a miracle. If she is willing to put her faith in God and serve, she and her son will eat for many days. With great trust, the widow obeyed Elijah, and God kept His promise (v. 13-16).

As Christians, we have a great responsibility to provide for our families. 1 Timothy 5:8 tells us, "But if anyone does not provide for his own, and especially for those of his household, he has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever." However, we also have responsibilities to the church. In Jesus Christ, we have been given freedom from sin, and God expects us to use our liberty for the church. Paul says in Gala-

> tians 5:13, "For you, brethren, have been called to liberty; only do not use liberty as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another."

> While our duty to our families is important, we can't allow our worries to keep us from making time for the church. In many cases, we will sacrifice service to God for things far less important than food. We worry about our kids' grades, sporting events, or

recitals instead of worship, devotionals, and service projects. Of course there is nothing wrong with extracurriculars, but some of us treat them like our child's life depends on it.

God has promised each of us to take care of our needs (Matt. 6:25-32). If we want to be useful servants to Him, then we have to trust Him to do so. We need to have faith like the widow from Zerephath who did not withhold anything she had from the Lord. Let's not allow our earthly worries to keep us from being faithful servants of God.

Which would you tear?

During the reign of King Josiah, the Book of the Law was found in the house of the Lord (2 Kgs. 22:8). The book was brought and read before the king (22:10). "When the king heard the words of the Book of the Law" (and realized that its commandments had not been kept), he "tore his clothes" (22:11), in grief and shame over the disobedience of God's people.

Less than 20 years later, there was a new king on the throne named Jehoiakim. The Lord told Jeremiah to "take a scroll" and "write...all the words that I have spoken to you" (Jer. 36:1-2). The scroll was read "in the hearing of the king" (36:20-21), and after "three or four columns" had been read, "the king cut it with the scribe's knife and cast it into the fire that was on the hearth, until all the scroll was consumed in the fire" (36:23).

There are two reactions to God's Word. It can grieve you to the point that you tear your own clothes (and heart) in repentance or it can convict you to the point that you tear it up to get rid of it. Which one are you? - DS

Praying from A to Z

So often in his letters to his brethren, Paul would tell them that he was "praying always for you" (Col. 1:3), and "We give thanks to God always for you all, making mention of you in our prayers" (1 Thess. 1:2). He told Timothy, "without ceasing I remember you in my prayers night and day" (2 Tim. 1:3). He said something similar in nearly every letter.



Sometimes when someone asks us to pray for them, we might respond, "Well, that's the least I can do." But, in actuality, when you're speaking to the Creator and Sustainer of all things about someone, there is nothing better that you can do! That's not "the least"!

While having your own prayer list is a very good practice, may I encourage you to have another list? What if you prayed through your church directory every week or every month? Take a few names or a few pages each day to your Father. It wouldn't take long. What could be better? Maybe do the same thing with the contacts in your phone. Pray each day from A to Z. -DS
