Help, My Child Wants to Be Baptized!

"You cannot be

you learn how

One of life's greatest joys is to be part of teaching your children about our Father and His Son. As you do this, keep in mind that God did not give the primary responsibility to learn about God to the church but to you as a parent. I am so thankful for Sunday and Wednesday Bible classes, but

every son and daughter needs far more than these classes. God gave your children to you, not to the church, and He holds you responsible to "...train up a child in the way he should go" (Prov. 22:6). What is so often overlooked is the New Testament's instructions to "...bring them up in the training and admonitions of the Lord" is given to fathers and not to mothers (Eph. 6:4). If your son or daughter is not learning about God, it is not your wife's fault!

However, the greatest joy in being a parent is when your child first asks about baptism. Hopefully he or she has seen your joy every time someone is baptized in the assembly. Hopefully you have talked about it in the car after you leave worship and what a special moment they have just witnessed. Sometimes children as early as kindergarten age will bring up the subject. Parents sometimes are surprised and may be ill equipped as how to respond. I remember one of my children before he was seven expressing his concern about dying in a flight from New Zealand back to America because he said, "Oh, no! I haven't been baptized." He had been thinking far deeper than I thought he was at such a young age. What do you say when similar events happen in your life?

I remember one mother whose son in his early teens asked about baptism and she responded, "No, you are not ready to be baptized because you don't even keep your room clean." That was a wrong response for that mother did not keep her house clean! He was not baptized then or later. Wis-

> dom dictates that regardless of the age when the topic arises parents should express thankfulness that their son or daughter is thinking about these matters. This thankfulness does not mean you always give approval of the topic, but it is such a great joy to know they are thinking about spiritual matters.

Years ago, I heard an older preacher say, clean" "Baptism is a birth and if a person does not know where babies come from, he does not know enough to be baptized." I do not agree with him for knowing biological reproduction is far different from knowing about creating a spiritual relationship with God.

How should a parent respond when these special moments happen? Next week, we will give suggestions about how a parent should respond. It is an important moment, and you should think about how you will respond before it ever comes. More next week!

Jesus Is the Everlasting Father

The title of this article may throw you off a bit. In fact, you may read the title and believe that error is being espoused. How could Jesus be said to be the "Father"? "That's just not right," someone might say.

The title "Everlasting Father" is from Scripture. It is found one time in Isaiah 9:6.

In that text, the Messianic prophet is looking ahead to a brighter time in history when "unto us a Child is born," who will reign "upon the throne of David and over His kingdom"—a kingdom of which there would be "no end" (i.e., everlasting) (9:6-7). In articles over the last two weeks, we have considered Jesus as the "Wonderful Counselor" and "Mighty God," and the text also calls Him the "Everlasting Father." What does that mean? How can Jesus be called "Father"?

First, consider that the Bible clearly teaches that Jesus is everlasting. He is not some "created being," as some would suggest. The first verse of the gospel of John affirms that Jesus always (the Greek imperfect tense indicates continuousness) "was God." And God (remember, Jesus is "God") is "from everlasting to everlasting" (Psa. 90:2), for He "inhabits eternity" (Isa. 57:15). Jesus is the ever-existing one, the great "I AM" (John 8:58). There is a clear prophecy of the coming of Christ in Micah chapter five, foreseeing that He would be born in Bethlehem Ephrathah (5:2). Of the Christ, Micah revealed that the "goings forth" of this "Ruler" are "from of old, from everlasting." Truly, Scripture teaches that Jesus is eternal.

Why does Isaiah call Him, "Father"? Consider two truths. First, Christ brought everything into existence from nothing. He is the Creator of all things (Col. 1:16-17; John 1:3) —thus, it could be said that Christ "Fathered" everything and everyone into existence, making Him its "Father."

Second, the emphasis of "Father" is not Christ "Fathered" merely upon Christ as the source or cause of all things, but more especially of His fatherly care for His people. Seeing that Christ was the active agent in Creation of all things, do you suppose that He then stopped caring for, providing for and protecting His people, who desperately need Him? Later Isaiah said, "You, O Lord, are our Father; Our Redeemer

> from Everlasting is Your name" (63:16; cf. 64:8). David described Him in the psalms as a "father of the fatherless, a defender of widows" (68:5), and "As a father pities his children, so the Lord pities those who fear Him" (103:13). Yes, Jesus "Fathered" all things into existence, and even now, through His tender care, "In Him all things hold together" (Col. 1:17).

> Jesus is forever a Father to His people—caring for them (1 Pet. 5:7), guarding them (Psa. 34:7), supplying their needs (Psa. 37:25). He is tender, like a loving father would be.

Who Is Like You, O Lord?

After the defeat of Pharaoh's army in Exodus 15, Moses and the children of Israel sang to praise the Lord for His unchallenged victory. We call this chapter The Song of Moses. In verses 1 through 10, they sang of the defeat of the Egyptians in the Red Sea. Then, from verses 14 through 18, they sang

confidently of the Lord's future victories over the Canaanites and the fulfillment of His promises.

These stanzas bookend verses 11 through 13. While the other sections were written in the past sent tense. The crossing of the Red Sea gave them a new understanding of the relationship between themselves and God. What can we learn from this heavenly Father. section of song?

In verse 11, Moses and the children of Israel sang, "Who is like You, O Lord, among the gods? Who is like You, glorious in holiness, fearful in praises, doing wonders?" Is there any one like our God? His majesty far exceeds any false god imagined by man. We simply cannot imagine a being like our heavenly Father. We imagine gods like ourselves, capable of some good but flawed. Like us, we imagine them given to selfishness, lust and cruelty. But our God is infinitely kind, merciful and powerful (cf. Joel 2:13).

Then, in verse 12 they sang, "You stretched out Your right hand; The earth swallowed them." With the Lord as our God, we do not need to fear any man or power. We can confidently go and proclaim His gospel knowing that He can overcome any force. Paul reminds us in Ephesians 6:12, "For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places."

Last, they sang in verse 13, "You in Your mercy have led forth the people whom You have redeemed; You have guided them in Your strength to and future tenses respectively, 11-13 is in the pre- cannot imagine a Your holy habitation." Just like the children of Israel, we too have been redeemed by our God but to an even greater promise than what is spoken here. Through Jesus Christ, the home we look forward to is one not made of hands (cf. 2 Cor. 5:1). We have not

> been redeemed from earthly bondage but from the bonds of sin. By the grace of God, anyone who puts on Christ and faithfully obeys His word has the promise of eternal life in heaven. Jesus said, "And I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; neither shall anyone snatch them out of My hand" (John 10:28-30).

> Who is like our Lord? No one is! In Him, we have a kind, loving Father, a supremely powerful ally, and the promise of eternal life. Let us give Him our unique devotion and praise.






