What Do I Say When My Child Asks to Be Baptized

Jesus brought

When a child first mentions their desire to be baptized most parents are not sure how to respond. I have written on this before, but some time has passed. Now there is another "generation" of parents who face this. Hopefully, last week's article and this one will give some insight into how to

handle this in the right way.

Consider the tender heart of the child who asks. As a parent, you have brought influences into that child's life which has created this situation. Make sure your child knows that you are thankful they have this desire. If you choose to delay that baptism, make sure the child is not discouraged to the point of having lower self-esteem as you talk to him.

Having expressed your joy, I suggest you sit down with them and humbly talk about it. Obviously, there are things you should ask to see where they are. Sometimes it is better to ask a series of questions. You could ask them about the Lord's supper and all of worship. You should be able to see if they are old enough to worship. Worship is not just eating bread and drinking fruit of the vine, it involves discerning the Lord's body as they examine themselves. Worship is not just turning the pages in a songbook. It involves the soul as the

words are sung. Worship is not just sitting reverently on a pew. It involves listening to what God says and its impacts on life. Obviously, a child using electronics at worship is not worshiping.

Ask them what we pray about at worship and what we should do when we pray (the answer is not just bow your heads and close your eyes). Ask them about the words of the songs we sing to see if they know more than words.

As you talk about these matters ask them why they want to be baptized and then be quiet. Do not help them give the right answer. Be careful that you do not make this question more important than the other question, even though it probably is.

One way I see if they know why they should be baptized is to ask, "Someday Jesus will come to take people to heaven. If He came today would he take your little brother to heaven? Would He take mommy and daddy to heaven? If He came today would He take you to heaven?" Listen carefully for if he says yes to that last question. If

Jesus Is the Prince of Peace

There must have been such great excitement in the heart of the Jews as they heard the prophecies of Isaiah of the coming Messiah. They would not understand them all, but it must have been fascinating to think about the Messiah as the Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God and Everlasting Father. (We

looked at these titles in the last three weeks.) And as war was all around them (with Assyria capturing the northern kingdom and then coming against the southern kingdom), it must have been particularly comforting to think of the Messiah as "the Prince of Peace."

Most worldly rulers (like princes) seek power and greatness, and if it takes the sword and war to achieve, then by all means, let's fight for it. But Jesus is not "the Prince of Conflict" but of "Peace." Now, some may think of peace as merely the cessation or absence of hostilities, but that is not necessarily true peace. Instead, there must be the removal of the cause of the conflict and war.

Only then does true peace reign.

The Hebrew word for "peace" (shalom) carries the idea of "well-being, completeness, wholeness, soundness." The well-being and soundness in which the Prince of Peace is truly interested is not on the physical, military or national level, but on the spiritual level. Jesus told His disciples, "Peace I

leave with you, My peace I give to you" (John 14:27). What is the peace of the Prince of Peace?

First, Jesus brought peace between God and man by removing the cause of that enmity—sin. When He was born, there was an announcement of "peace on earth" or "goodwill toward men" (Luke 2:14), for this "Jesus" was coming to "save His people from their sins" (Matt. 1:21). As the exalted "Prince and Savior," Jesus provides the only thing that can bring about

true peace—"forgiveness of sins" (Acts 5:31). And when we are "justified" through His salvation plan, "we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ" (Rom. 5:1). What a glorious blessing!

Second, by bringing peace to sinners in reconciling them to God through His blood, Jesus also brought peace that man can have with his fellowman. Deep enmity existed between the Jews and Gentiles, but "through the cross," Jesus was able to "reconcile them both to God in one body," "thus making peace" (Eph. 2:15-16). True peace is found among the people of this Prince!

Third, when His people stand in a right relationship with their Prince, they are able to enjoy a "peace that surpasses all understanding" that "will guard [their] hearts and minds through Christ Jesus" (Phil. 4:7).

How blessed we are to have Jesus as our Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father and Prince of Peace!



Are You Spiraling Out of Control?

Sin can cause the

humblest and

to crumble.

The life of King Saul is a tragic story of a humble man's descent into pride and the lust for power. What makes his story so disheartening is that one incident of failure became the catalyst for him to lose his kingdom, his family and his relationship with

When we are first introduced to Saul, he is a humble man. He is very considerate of his responsibilities and his relationships. He went to great lengths to find his father's lost possessions (1 Sam. 9:1-5). When he was chosen as Israel's king, he wasn't up front waiting to receive glory but was found hiding (1 Sam. 10:21-23). When he took command of God's army, he led his people to victory and showed mercy instead of dealing revenge (1 Sam. 11:12-13). By all accounts, Saul was a man of great character.

However, Saul made a mistake. Instead of waiting on the priest, Samuel, to come and offer supplication to God, he broke the Law of Moses and offered it himself (1 Sam. 13:8-12). As punishment for this sin, God told him that the kingdom would not continue in Saul's lineage.

This event devastated Saul. Rather than learning from his mistakes, he had a change of heart and left his humility behind him. He no longer led his men in battle but sent them to do his bidding. Soon after, he would even disobey God's direct command to wipe out the Amalekites (1 Sam. 15). So, God told Saul that he would lose his throne (v. 22-23).

After this decree, Saul's decline only steepened. He grew in anger, jealousy and paranoia over his replacement, David. Though David only ever showed him love and honor, Saul began terrorizing him and sent him into hiding. In his mad campaign to find David, he became a murderer of innocent priests, women and children (1 Sam. 22:17-19).

In the end, Saul's sins caught up with him. He lost everything. He lost his sons, his army, his life and most importantly, his relationship with God (1 strongest of men Sam. 31:3-6).

> Sin can cause the humblest and strongest of men to crumble. Saul's greatest crime wasn't a single mistake but that he refused to learn from it. Instead, his pride led him to fear and murder.

> How do we handle our mistakes? Instead of accepting God's forgiveness and making an effort to repent, many of us will allow a single sin to grow and become a way of life. Sin becomes an identity. We cannot let our failures define us. We must let Christ define us. He paid the debt of our sin and gives us the opportunity to repent and live a life in His likeness. Don't let your life spiral out of control over a single sin, but let the Lord renew your spirit according to His words.

Would you carry Jesus' cross?

After a long night of agonizing, blood-stained prayers, followed by a friend's betrayal and a criminal arrest, then hours of kangaroo court proceedings, accompanied by taunts and violent mobs, which culminated in a vicious scourging, Jesus was "led away" to be crucified, "bearing His cross" (John 19:16-17). Somewhere along the way, the executioners "compelled a certain man, Simon a Cyrenian...to bear His cross" (Mark 15:21).

Simon did not have a choice in this matter. Under law, the soldiers "impressed him into service," and he was obligated to carry the burden as directed.

Would any of us have volunteered? Would we have done anything to ease the burden on our Savior? Sometimes we make excuses and feel that we have been "impressed into service" by a ruling authority. When, in fact, we have instead been lovingly granted access into a relationship with the One who Redeemed us (Heb. 10:19-23)! Rather than see carrying His cross as a burden, let us see the privilege and enjoy every moment of bearing "it after Jesus" (Luke 23:26)! - DS

As Jesus approached the city of Jerusalem in the last week of His life, He sent two of His disciples into a village, "where as you enter you will find a colt tied, on which no one has ever sat" (Luke 19:30). Two verses later, they "found it just as He had said to them" (19:32). A few days later, Jesus sent Peter and John to prepare the Passover, telling them that they would

> meet "a man...carrying a pitcher of water," who would lead them to a house with a "large, furnished upper room" (Luke 22:8-12). In the very next verse, they "found it just as He had said to them" (22:13). A few days later, a group of women came to the tomb of Jesus and found it empty. An angel told them, "He is risen! He is

not here...as He said to you" (Mark 16:4-7).

The disciples continually found things "just as Jesus said" they would be! Friends, so it is with us! We have found, in Christ, "life...more abundantly" than any others (John 10:10) and will one day be with Him "where He is" (John 14:3), just as He said! -DS


