One Is NOT Two and Is NOT None

There are places in the Bible where when it discusses some vital truth it emphatically affirms, "There is one." When these words are used it implies two truths. One truth is that that truth does exist. You can never say there is none when the Bible says there is one. The second truth is that this

denies there could be two, three or even more. No mortal has any right to ever say there is none, nor to ever say there is more than one. Revelation 22:18-19 prohibits us from adding even one thing to what God says or to ever take away even one thing God says. I love the way a lady from Trinidad said it. "You cannot plus one there is, and or minus the Bible." Let's take time to look at the seven "ones" God affirms in Ephesians chapter four.

"There is one body" (v. 4). What is that one body? Ephesians 1:22-23 clearly says the body is the church, this demands that there is one church. Jesus promised to build it and that when it was built nothing would prevail against it (Matt. 16:18). There are many churches in our land, but Jesus established one-not two or many. It is still on this earth today. To find it, read the Bible to see that church which He built, then search and find it using the Bible as your guide.

"There is...one Spirit" (v. 4). There is no question that this is the Holy Spirit who guided the apostles into all the truth (John 16:13). The one Spirit gave all the truth in the first century (2 Pet. 1:3; Jude 3). There is only one-not two or many. No mortal can say the Holy Spirit has revealed more truth to him!

"There is...one hope" (v. 4). The foundation of hope is faith (Heb. 11:1) and that faith comes from hearing the word of God (Rom. 10:17). Reading the words given by the one Spirit creates that hope. There are not many hopes, only the one given by God and by which we are saved (Rom. 8:24).

When the one God says there is there is not two

or more

God's Power

"There is...one Lord" (v. 5). That Lord is Jesus. The word lord means one who has authority, and Jesus has all authority (Matt. 28:18). The one church is built on the words given by the one Spirit who gives this one hope. There is only one Lord.

"There is...one faith" (v. 5). That faith is the one which comes from hearing the faith preached by the early church (Rom. 10:17; Gal. 1:23). There are not

many bodies, and there are not many faiths given by the one Lord. Our faith comes from the one faith.

"There is...one baptism" (v. 5). It is in water (Acts 8:36-38), and it is a burial in water (Rom. 6:4). The one Lord told the apostles to go and baptize (immerse) people and then to teach them to go and baptize others with that one baptism.

"There is...one God" (v. 6). We know who He is. It is He who has given us all of these seven "ones." Glorify Him!



You Can Move Mountains in Your Life

One must NEVER take a verse out of context! One must NEVER make a verse in the Bible mean something that it did not or does not mean! Still, when one understands passages in their context, look for applications for us today.

During His last week of life before the crucifixion, Jesus cursed a fig tree because it had no figs, and

"Immediately the fig tree withered away" (Matt. 21:19). When the disciples "saw the fig tree dried up from the roots" (Mark 11:20), they "marveled" (Matt. 21:20). They asked, "How?" (21:20).

Jesus gave the apostles the key to such power in their lives—"Have faith in God" (Mark 11:22)! And not only to "have faith" but also "do not doubt" (Matt. 21:21). Jesus gave the apostles mirac-

ulous "power" (Matt. 10:1), which is not available to anyone today, but even that miraculous power would not work if there was "unbelief" (NKJV) or "littleness of faith" (NASB) present in the hearts of the apostles (Matt. 17:20).

In speaking to the apostles (keep the context), Jesus said, "For assuredly, I say to you, whoever says to this mountain, 'Be removed and be cast into the sea,' and does not doubt in his heart, but believes that those things he says will be done, he will have whatever he says" (Mark 11:23). For the apostles: Faith + Prayer = God's Power. The "moving of mountains" was commonly used among the Jews as a proverb for doing that which seemed impossible or overcoming some great difficulty (see Matthew 17:20 and 1 Corinthians 13:2). The miraculous power from God would enable the apostles to do the impossible or overcome a difficult with God's help.

So, does this passage not have any application to us today? Let's be clear that it does NOT have any miraculous appli-

> cation to us today. No prayer is going to move a literal mountain today, and a literal mountain remaining upright and not in the sea is not a sign of a lack of faith. HOWEVER, even for the apostles, this terminology was probably figurative.

> Here's a question: Do you have any "mountains" in your life? Do you have obstacles that don't seem to go away? Do you have God-given responsibilities

that seem too large to accomplish? While the age of miracles has ceased, the power of God still works within us and for us (Eph. 3:20; Phil. 2:13; Heb. 13:21). So, don't try to scale that "mountain" in your life or try to remove that "mountain" WITHOUT God's help! What does that involve? First, "Have faith in God." Do everything you can to increase your faith through God's Word (Rom. 10:17). Second, "ask," "pray" "in faith, with no doubting" (Jas. 1:6; Mark 11:24). When you do, remember this: Faith + Prayer = God's Power.



Evangelizing Without Partiality

The Great Commission is one of the last commands Jesus left His disciples before ascending into heaven. We understand that though He was speaking to the apostles, "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations..." was intended to be obeyed by every By Robert Lupo Christian. In the earliest days of the church,

we see exactly that. "Therefore those who were scattered went everywhere preaching the word" (Acts 8:4).

Each of us has a responsibility to share the gospel, but we often have trouble deciding when to share it or who to share it with. Of course, not every moment is the right time to preach Christ. Your boss probably wouldn't appreciate it in the middle of a company meeting. We need to be careful to wait for opportunities that are appropriate. However, we do not need to be so careful when deciding who needs to hear it.

Are we picky when it comes to deciding who to teach about Jesus? Sometimes we limit our outreach to people we feel are already "good enough" to be taught. Other times we hold off because it could get us more involved with someone we would rather not. Some may even withhold the gospel based on how a person looks. Brethren, we cannot be so arrogant as to prejudge a person's worthiness of the gospel.

When Peter preached the gospel for the first time in Acts

2, he probably had very little reservations as to who would receive the message. All those present were his people: Jews. When they asked Peter "What shall we do?" he gladly told his brethren the message of salvation.

Later, in Acts 10, Peter would be commanded by God to preach to someone he might have apprehensions about. The Spirit led Peter to Caesarea to preach to a gentile. Not just any gentile, but a Roman centurion. Like any of his peers, Peter

> had strong prejudices against the idolatrous gentiles, let alone one serving in the military occupying his country.

However, after receiving a vision from God and hearing Cornelius' testimony, Peter realized something. "In truth I perceive that God shows no partiality" (Acts 10:34). The Lord then confirmed this message by endowing Cornelius and his house with the

Holy Spirit. So, Peter baptized them for the remission of their sins.

Peter thought he knew who was worthy of the gospel, but he misjudged the breadth of God's love. God doesn't pick and choose who is worthy, He offers it freely to all who will believe (Acts 10:43). We have no place to judge who is worth teaching Jesus to. That is only for God to decide. Whatever nation or social status a person may belong, everyone deserves to hear the gospel. Let's evangelize without partiality.

All is vanity, except this one thing

Solomon was overwhelmed with being king of Israel, and the Lord wanted to get him started off on the right foot. The Lord asked Solomon, "What shall I give you?" (1 Kgs. 3:5). The king simply requested "a wise and understanding heart" (3:9, 12), and that is exactly what the all-powerful, all-wise, all-loving God gave to him. Wisdom!

Near the end of his days, the man who possessed a heavenly dose of wisdom looked at life, and he concluded, "I have seen all the works that are done under the sun; and indeed, all is vanity and grasping for the wind" (Ecc. 1:14). Heavenly wisdom caused him to investi-

gate ALL the works done under the sun—to look at everything done in life and everything supposedly meaningful in life. After investigating them ALL, he surmised, "ALL is vanity and grasping for the wind."

When will we learn from Solomon? When will we stop grasping after the meaningless things of this world? When will we truly (not superficially!) realize that our "ALL" is to "fear God and keep His commandments" (12:13)? That's ALL that matters! – DS

"Do not speak evil of one another"

Talking about others behind their back seems almost like a sport or a competition today. We have to be intentional and paying close attention to our conversations to stop ourselves from doing it. Can we look at this for a moment?

James 4:11 commands simply, "Do not speak evil of one anoth-

er, brethren." The same Greek word is used twice in First Peter of others who "speak against you" (2:12; 3:16). We truly hate it when people "speak against us," don't we? Why do we do it to others? Its noun form is translated "backbiters" or "slanderers" in Romans 1:30. Do you know any backbiters? Are you one?

King David asked God, "Who may dwell in Your holy hill?" (Psa. 15:1). In other words, "Who may go to heaven?" Among the answers in that psalm is this, "He who does not backbite with his tongue...nor does he take up a reproach against his friend" (15:3).

Speaking evil of someone behind their back may feel natural, since "everyone else is doing it." But...it will cost you a home in heaven (cf. Matt. 12:36-37)! - DS
