Has He Ever Chastened You?

It is remarkable how easy it becomes to understand a difficult passage if we just look at the precise words found in that verse. Far too often we read a verse and assume we know the meaning of every word, when we do not fully understand how God uses that word elsewhere in the Bible. For

example, hear these words from God. "For whom the Lord loves He chastens, and scourges every son He receives" (Heb. 12:6). We sometimes are troubled when we focus on the "scourging" of the Lord and overlook the actual meaning of the word chastens.

Have

To see this consider this question. When did the Lord chasten you, specifically. Before you answer look at this verse as it is quoted from Pro. 3:12. "For whom the Lord loves He corrects, just as a father the

son in whom he delights." This is not the picture of an angry father severely punishing a son, but it is a picture of a father who delights in every son. Our Father delights in us and His correction is evidence, not of His wrath, but of His love.

It is true that the word chasten is sometimes used to indicate anger toward the one being chastened (Luke 23:16, 22), but Pilate's action toward Jesus is far different from the way God deals with us. Pilate selfishly brought discipline, but our God is not selfish; He is on our side.

Jeremiah says it this way. "O Lord, correct me, but with justice; not in Your anger lest you bring me to nothing: (Jer. 10:24). His correction is from the heart of our just God, not like that of an irrational, angry father.

God does use circumstances which come in our lives to help us grow as His children. Hebrews 12 shows that as he uses these situations at first they may seem painful, but "... afterwards it yields the peaceable fruit of righteousness to those who are trained by it" (v. 11).

The most overlooked way that we fail to see how God chastens us in seeing how this same word for chastening is found in the verse that says all Scripture is "...profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness" (2 Tim. 3:16). How is the word chasten translated in this verse? It is not translated as doctrine, as reproof, or

as correction. God chastens us by giving instructions. Our father chastens us every time we read His word. As we meditate on His words, He is chastening us. Every Bible class we sit in is the chastening of the Lord. Every sermon we hear is the Lord chastening us. This is how He specifically chastens us!

As we examine ourselves in eating the Lord's Supper is described as chastening (1 Cor. 11:31-32), in the same way we look into the mirror of the Lord and are instructed and corrected. Rejoice, God's correction is evidence that we are sons!

do, and I appreciate those who do them (and many other good works)! But not everyone needs these services listed here, but EVERYONE you ever meet needs to go to heaven! EVERYONE!

The Bible says that "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Rom. 3:23). So how can one be saved from sin? Later in the same book, Paul said (pay attention to this), "Whoever calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved. How then shall they call on Him in whom they have not believed?

And how shall they believe in Him of whom they have not heard? And how shall they hear without a preacher?" (Rom. 10:13-14). Without a what? Without a preacher!

Preachers get to help those who are lost to be converted to Christ and saved from their sins by being baptized into Christ (Mark 16:15-16; Matt. 28:19-20). There is NOTHING on this earth more fulfilling than that!

Preachers get to help those who are saved to "finish the course" and "keep the faith" (2 Tim. 4:7), so that they can receive "the crown of life" (Rev. 2:10). There is NOTHING more fulfilling than that!

Paul told his fellow Christians that there was nothing that would bring him more "rejoicing" than all of them "in the presence of our Lord Jesus Christ at His coming" (1 Thess. 2:19), so that together they could "always be with the Lord" in heaven (4:17).

Going to heaven together is ALL that matters!

Young man, you should be a preacher because you get to help people go to heaven! There's nothing more fulfilling than saving someone from the eternal fire of hell and helping them spend an eternity with Jesus! The world needs preachers! More preachers! The church needs preachers! More preachers! I pray that YOU will be one! You will love it! (Parents and grandparents, please share this with the young men in your family. They won't find it on their own.)

Consistent Christianity

Consistency is difficult. Whether you are talking about drawing a straight line, making your bed in the morning, or calling your mom, keeping up with them over and over again can be a difficult task. This is especially true when it comes to our daily walk as Christians.

We have good days, and we have bad days, don't we? Sometimes it's really easy to think about spiritual things and other times it isn't. There is a perfect place to go in scripture to help us be consistent in our Christianity: Romans 12.

We need to recognize that the scriptures demand consistency. In verses 10 through 13, Paul tells us, "Be kindly affectionate to one another with brotherly love, in honor giving preference to one

another; **not lagging** in **diligence**, **fervent** in spirit, serving the Lord; rejoicing in hope, **patient** in tribulation, **continuing steadfastly** in prayer; distributing to the needs of the saints, given to hospitality." The words I've highlighted all describe behaviors that remain the same over time. If we have been "transformed by the renewing of our minds" as described earlier (v. 2), then we can't be Christians some of the time and like the world the rest. If we master these behaviors, then we can be sure of our consistency.

First, we must not be lagging in diligence. To lag means to be lazy or holding back, and diligence is eagerness. So, to be lagging in diligence would mean to be unwilling or to be half-hearted in doing good. Christianity requires a love for the work. If we are not actively working to keep our interest in the church, then we will certainly miss opportunities to be useful to God. Are you checking the upcoming activities to see where you can be useful?

Second, we must be patient in tribulation. This means that you endure or stick around when things get difficult. Patience is something we can easily lose. All sorts of things can cause us distress or hurt our morale. We may be overworked, we may suffer ridicule, or we may suffer loss. No matter what comes about, we must be committed to doing good. Have you backed away from anything at church be-

cause of life's circumstances or burnout?

Last, we must always continue steadfastly in prayer. Whenever we are struggling, we should immediately ask ourselves, "Am I praying enough?" Steadfast means to be devoted to something. Prayer needs to be a priority for us. 1 Thessalonians 5:17 tells us to "Pray without ceasing." It must be a daily, continuous habit. If we neglect prayer, we will certainly stumble. Are you praying for opportunities to work for the Lord?

Let's be Christians consistently!


