The Path to True Wisdom

The serpent said, "God knows that in the day you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil" (Gen. 3:5). Eve was in the "Garden of God" and was surrounded by the evidence of His existence. She was naïve and learning so much as she lived in that garden.

The opportunity to be like God was given to her. She looked at the tree that was "...good for food, that it was pleasant to the eyes, and a tree desirable to make one wise" (Gen. 3:6). She yielded to the temptation to be like God and have His wisdom. Tragically, this is the way sin entered into the world God created. The time to read the blessings of Eden were ruined, and Adam and Eve were separated from the God of all wisdom.

wisest man Three thousand years later there was a young man who became king of Israel. Solomon had just offered a thousand burnt offerings, and God offered to give the son of David whatever he asked. Solomon said, "I am a little child; I do not know how to go out or come in...therefore give to Your servant an understanding heart...that I may discern between good and evil" (1 Kgs. 3:5-9). God gave him this wisdom and said, "I have given you a wise and understanding heart so that there has not been anyone like you, nor shall any like you arise after you" (1 Kgs. 3:12). Truly Solomon became the wisest man who ever lived.

"God gave Solomon wisdom and exceedingly great understanding...Thus Solomon's wisdom excelled the wisdom of all men...for he was wiser than all men" (1 Kgs. 4:29-31). It was not just wisdom about spiritual matters but about trees, animals, birds, creeping things and of fish. "He spoke three thousand proverbs and his songs were one thousand and five...And men of all nations, for all the kings of the earth...came to hear the wisdom of Solomon" (1 Kgs. 4:32-34).

He was the wisest man who ever lived.

That wisdom did not end with the death of who never takes Solomon, for he wrote three books of the Old Testament (Prov. 1:1; Ecc. 1:1; Song of Solomon 1:1). Solomon "...was wise...he pondered and sought out and set in order many proverbs...and what was written was upright-words of truth. The words are like welldriven nails...and further my son, be admonished by

them" (Ecc. 12:10-12).

So let me urge you to spend time reading the words of this great man. However, do more than just read them. Write them on your heart and let his proverbs guide you in the choices you make in life. Do not be like Solomon who after writing them failed miserably in applying them to his life. Remember this proverb especially: "Fear God and keep His commandments, for this is the whole duty of man" (Ecc. 12:13). You can be wiser than Eve or Solomon!



That Prayer List in the Church Bulletin

Every church bulletin that I have ever seen includes some kind of "Prayer List" within its pages. That fact alone is interesting-why do all churches find it appropriate, needful and effective to publish a list of names for which the church to pray? Is it simply to have something that takes up some

space in the bulletin? Or is there a greater purpose?

Having a prayer list in the bulletin is an expedient way to fulfill the command in Scripture to "pray for one another" (Jas. 5:16). How can we way to fulfill the effectively pray for one another? We need a list of names—a church bulletin and even a church directory help to provide that. And if there are specific needs, then we have a focus to which we can give those prayers.

Having a prayer list follows in the footsteps of the apostle Paul. Scripture does not specify that Paul kept a list, but when you read his letters, he constantly says to congregations and to individual Christians that he is "always...making mention" of them in his "prayers" (1 Thess. 1:2). Did he have a good memory to recall all of those, by name, for whom he was praying? Or did he keep a list? A list helps us to pray like Paul.

When we pray for those brethren in the church bulletin, we are doing the very best and the most powerful thing that we can do for them-we are talking to the God of heaven, the Creator and Sustainer of all things, about a specific person, and drawing His powerful attention in his/her direction. What could be better than that? The "prayer of a righteous man avails much" (Jas. 5:16, NKJV). It "has great power as it is working" (ESV). That power, first and foremost, is the power of God to respond to our requests (Eph. 3:20-21).

> When we pray for those brethren in the church bulletin, it has great power for the one for whom we pray. Paul told his brother Philemon, "I trust that through your prayers I shall be granted to you" (Phile. 22). Paul told the Corinthian brethren that the Lord had delivered him and "will still deliver us," through their "helping together in prayer for us" (2 Cor. 1:10-11). Prayer makes a difference in the lives of others.

But, also, when we pray for those brethren in the church bulletin, it has great power for the one who is doing the praying. It helps us to look beyond ourselves to the needs of others. It helps us to learn the members of the church, perhaps leading us to look some of them up in the church directory to see who they are. It helps us to draw closer to our brethren, as we lift their names before our Father and even share with them that we prayed for them.

Prayer is powerful! Using that prayer list in the church bulletin "has great power [for all of us] as it is working."

Are Your Friends Keeping You from God's Blessings?

Who wants to be blessed? I think that would be an easy "yes" for most people. After all, who wouldn't want to receive the favor of the God of the universe? However, the God who blesses those He wills is just as capable of cursing those He wills (cf. Gen. 12:3). So, how do we make sure that we will

We know that all of God's blessings are found in Christ Jesus (cf. Eph. 1:3; Gal. 3:14; John 1:16), and we know that remaining in Christ is a matter of behaving like Christ. "But if we walk in the light as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanses us from all sin" (1 John 1:7). So, if we want to receive God's blessings, then we need to guard

ourselves from being turned back to the behavior of the world.

One of the primary methods Satan uses to turn us from God's favor is through bad influences. If we want to fit in with a group, we naturally tend to adapt to their behaviors. So, if we choose the wrong group to mesh with, we will inevitably adapt to the wrong behaviors.

In the First Psalm, we are shown some ways to know if we are in a group that leads to God's blessings or cursing. The psalmist tells us about a man who is blessed and the things he does and doesn't do. Interestingly, all the things the blessed man doesn't do have to do with the people he surrounds himself with. If we want to be blessed like this man, then we need to do three things.

First, do not walk in the counsel of the ungodly. Where do you go for advice? 1 Corinthians 15:33 tells us plainly, "Bad company corrupts good habits." We need to be picky about who we listen to. If someone is living an ungodly life,

then you cannot expect them to point you in a godly direction. Don't lose your blessing over bad advice.

Don't lose your blessing for popularity.

Second, do not sit in the path of sinners. Who do you spend your time with? 2 Corinthians 6:14 says, "Do not be unequally yoked together with unbelievers. For what fellowship has righteousness with lawlessness?" We need to be picky about who we spend our time with. If we spend our days with

immoral people, it is only a matter of time before we start participating in their sins. Don't lose your blessing for popularity.

Third, do not sit in the seat of the scornful. What do you talk about with friends? Ephesians 4:29 tells us, "Let no corrupt word proceed out of your mouth, but what is good for necessary edification..." If catching up on "the tea" seems to always be part of your hangouts, then you are already sitting in the seat of scorn. Do not lose your blessing over juicy gossip.

Are your friends keeping you from God's blessings?


