### **Goads and Nails**

When God heard young Solomon's request, He responded and gave him wisdom above all men. "All of the kings of the earth who had heard of his wisdom, came to hear the wisdom of Solomon" (1 Kings 4:34). The wisest king "...sought to find acceptable words" (Ecc. 12:10) and then wrote these

words, so by reading them we can share in his wisdom. Those who read these words of wisdom and write them in their hearts are men who truly are wise. Consider how Solomon regarded the words of the Bible.

Solomon knew these words were true. When Solomon sought to find the acceptable words to convey the wisdom and then wrote them down, he described them as being "...upright, words of truth" (Ecc. 12:10). Solomon's father, David, had said,

"Your law is truth...all Your commandments are truth...the entirety of Your word is truth" (Psa. 119:142, 151, 160). To be wise, we must know the words of the Bible are truth.

Solomon knew these words were from God. Look again at the words of Solomon in Ecclesiastes chapter twelve. "The words of the wise...are given by one Shepherd" (v. 10). God is that one and only Shepherd and He cannot lie. Solomon knew that "...nothing can be added to it, and nothing taken from it" (Ecc. 3:14). Wise men know the source of truth.

Solomon knew these words would keep us close to

God. He uses an illustration people of his day knew so well when he describes the words of God as being like an ox goad. "The words of the wise are like goads" (Ecc. 12:11). To appreciate this, remember that a goad was a large wooden pole sharpened on one end. It was used to keep beasts doing the will of the farmer who used that point to prick the legs of the ox and ensure they went in the right direction.

> Now think of this figurative language to see that the Bible is the way God's encourages men to go in the right direction. We have free will and can "kick against the prick" (see Acts 9:5), but this always is hard and harms us.

> Solomon knew that these words were permanent. He said that they "...were like well driven nails" (Ecc. 12:11). I am sure that the "nails" of his

day were different from those we use today, but think of how buildings are held together today with those large nails. When my house was being built almost forty years ago, I remember watching the builder driving the nails that would ensure the roof was firmly attached to the walls. They were well driven and have withstood several hurricanes. God's word will firmly anchor your life to Him and help you in the storms of your life.

We are wise when we live by the words of the wisest man who received them from the God of all wisdom.

# The Only Way to Get Rid of Daniel

Daniel was in his mid-80s. He had been taken captive by the Babylonian warrior -king Nebuchadnezzar when he was just a teenager, and he had lived through the entire 70-year captivity (Jer. 29:10). Then, under Darius the Mede, Daniel was again promoted to a high position in the kingdom, as

one of the king's three governors, "and the king gave thought to setting him over the whole realm" (Dan. 6:1-3).

The other governors and satraps wanted Daniel out of the way, so they first "sought to find some charge against Daniel concerning the kingdom; but they could find no charge or fault, because he was faithful" (6:4). Well, if there wasn't "any error or fault found in him" when it came to the kingdom, practice his faith. their only other alternative (and guaranteed option) was to find a "charge against this Daniel...concerning the law of his God" (6:5). What a reputation Daniel had! His enemies

knew that Daniel would not violate the will of God!

So they devised a scheme by which they lied to the king (for not "All" of the governors agreed to their plan, as Daniel was one of the governors) and convinced the king to sign a decree that made it a capital crime to pray to the God of heaven, punishable by death in the den of lions (6:6-9). Once it was signed, his enemies knew they had him!

Verse 10 tells us that "Daniel knew that the writing was signed." He knew that the ruling officials were after him and were trying to bring him down. He knew that it was now illegal for him to practice his faith.

But that did NOT stop Daniel. HE opened his windows (i.e., he was not going to hide his faith and his obedience to his God) and he prayed. Not only that, in the face of everything that was going on, he "gave thanks before his God" (6:10).

Friends, there is a certain segment of our **He knew that it** society that is working behind the scenes and in front of our faces to (1) make it difficult for Christians to live out their Christian faith, or (2) at the very least, to make Christians uncomfortable to live out their Christian faith.

> Will we yield (Gal. 2:5)? Will we permit shame to enter our hearts (2 Tim. 1:12)? Will we question our God (Psa. 43:1-8)? Will we let doubts arise (Jas. 1:6)? Will we conform to this world (Rom. 12:2)? Will we begin to approve of things that are not right in the eyes of God (Rom. 1:32)? Will we put our trust in our God (Prov. 3:5-6)? Will we be even more diligent to grow in our faith (2 Pet. 1:5-11)? Will we learn to be thankful, even in difficult times (Eph. 5:20)? Will we be determined to obey God rather than man (Acts 5:29)? Will we be like Daniel in all of these ways, more concerned about the law and will of God than of man?

## Just One More Political Ad

THAT WAS A JOKE! This year brought a new level of political distraction. For the last several months, our phones have been bombarded with text message after text message from politicians trying to gain our vote. It was annoying and a huge waste of time!

The discussion of politics has grown into an everpresent beast of distraction. I remember a time when presidential candidates campaigned for only the year of the election. Now, it is nonstop campaigning year after year. I don't know about you, but I have given up way too much time to politicians.

Now that the election is over, it's a good time to refocus our attention. In Matthew 6:33, Jesus tells us exactly what our priority should be. He says,

"But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness..." If we truly believe the Bible and that we have eternal souls, then the only thing that matters is where we will spend that eternity. So, the number one thing that should be on our minds is getting to heaven.

In the verses leading up to this amazing statement, the Lord exposes the problems with placing our priorities elsewhere. Whether we are talking about prioritizing possessions, money, or daily needs, Jesus is clear that, in the end, none of them are more important than your eternal destiny.

In verses 19-23, Jesus talks about "treasures on earth" (AKA: possessions). They may bring plenty of temporary convenience or entertainment, but they all share the same fate. Eventually "...Moth and rust destroy..." or "...thieves break in and steal" (v. 20). Many choose to satisfy their wants instead of serving others. What possessions matter in eternity?

In verse 24, Jesus brings our attention to money. Money is exchanged for just about anything in this world. You need money in order to survive. So, to make sure we can live comfortably, we spend a lot of time making money and putting it away in banks or investments. But Jesus warns us, "You cannot serve God and mammon." Many people will put making the next buck before serving the church. How much money is your soul worth?

In verses 25-32, Jesus takes this concept to its ultimate degree—daily needs. Some things are necessary to live. He summarizes them as what we eat, drink, and wear. Jesus says "...do not worry...For after all these things the Gentiles seek. For your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things" (vv. 31-32). Many cannot accept that even our needs cannot take priority. If we trust in God to take care of us in eternity, then we must trust Him to take care of us in life.

A lot of things have taken our attention. Let's refocus our priorities and put the kingdom of God first in our lives.


