

Conquerors of Death

Satan deceived Eve about death and since that time he tried to use death to lead men away from God. What happens to a person when he dies was not readily apparent in the Old Testament. When Job asked, "If a man dies, shall he live again?" (Job 14:14), he expressed how little was known

about death before Christ came. In fact, Job in that same chapter said, "Man dies...he breathes his last and where is he?" (v. 10). References to the resurrection are vaguely found in the Old Testament, but it is in the New Testament that Christ "....abolished death and brought life an immortality to light through the gospel" (2 Tim. 1:10).

The writer of Hebrews described this truth and how drastically Jesus changed mankind's view of

death. Jesus became flesh in order that, by His death, "...He might destroy him who had the power of death, that is, the devil and release those who through fear of death were all their lifetime subject to bondage" (2:14-15). Without His resurrection, we too would look at death so differently. This lack of knowledge about death could so easily overwhelm us when our loved ones die. Without His resurrection, we would have a fear of death, and that fear would be used by Satan to bring us under the bondage of fear. Jesus was born; Jesus died; Jesus was raised. We are born; we die; we will be raised!

Put yourself in the place of Cain, Adam and Eve. Abel had been alive, and something so strange had happened. Where was Abel? They knew where his body was, but was that lifeless body all there was to man's existence? There are ten generations from Adam to Noah, and nine times the Bible uses the expression, "and he died," to describe man's existence on the earth.

The one exception to describe the end of Adam's descendants is in the seventh generation. "So all the days of Enoch were three hundred and sixty-five years. And Enoch walked with God; and he was not, for God took him" (Gen. 5:23-24). At that time, men lived over nine hundred years, and some might have born, die and will said about Enoch, "He died so young."

Look at this realistically. What a hopeless be raised. view of living nine hundred years where every day of your life you dealt with a cursed ground, its thorns and thistle and spent every day dealing with the sweat of your face until

> Before Enoch left, he said, "Behold, the Lord comes with ten thousands of His saints, to execute judgment on all...who are ungodly" (Jude 15). This is one glimpse of the resurrection in the Old Testament. How blessed we are to know about His empty tomb and face death without any fear! We are more than conquerors over death (Rom. 8:36-37)!

your body returned to that cursed ground (Gen. 3:17-19).



Worthy vs. Unworthy

With the growing egocentric and entitled mentality that is spreading throughout humanity (and creeping into our families and the Lord's church), we would do well to go back and meditate on the words of the great John the Baptist, of whom Jesus said, "there has not risen one greater" (Matt.

11:11). This forerunner of Jesus-of whom the Holy Spirit prophesied hundreds of years before his birth that he would prepare the way for the Lord (Matt. 3:3; Isa. 40:3)—proclaimed of Jesus, "There comes One after me who is mightier than I, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to stoop down and loose" (Mark 1:7).

How lowly must one be to not even be worthy to "loose" the sandal strap of another or even to "carry" it (Matt. 3:11)? Interestingly, there are not

many details found in all four gospel accounts, but this statement from John the Baptist is recorded by each of the gospel penmen (Matt. 3:11; Mark 1:7; Luke 3:16; John 1:27). What should that tell us about the significance of this admission?

The words perhaps remind us of the centurion in Capernaum, who said to Jesus, "Lord, do not trouble Yourself, for I am not worthy that You should enter under my roof. Therefore I did not even think myself worthy to come to You" (Luke 7:6-7). Here was a Gentile military officer, who was captain over one hundred Roman soldiers, and yet, he did not deem himself worthy to even be in the presence of Jesus.

Sometimes we start to "think more highly" of ourselves than we "ought to think" (Rom. 12:3), and we need to be reminded that in our relationship with Christ, there is only One who is worthy! The entire host of heaven ("many angels around the throne, the living creatures, and the elders; and the number of them was ten thousand times ten thousand, and

thousands of thousands," Rev. 5:11) are continually shouting around the heavenly throne (as if with a "megaphone"), "Worthy is the Lamb who was slain to receive power and riches and wisdom, and strength and honor and glory and blessing!" (Rev. 5:12). Do we remember that the Lamb "was slain" for us? Do we realize how unworthy we are of His love, His care, His attention, His blood, His promises?

Before we begin to think that we are entitled to the blessings that we have in Christ, let us remember that we were once like that prodigal in Luke 15. When he finally "came to himself" (as you and I once did), he got up, went to his father and humbly said, "I am no longer worthy to be called your son" (15:18-21). No, we are not worthy either! But, thanks be to God that He does not measure our worthiness in the way that we deserve but through the prism of His love! Truly, He is worthy of all praise, honor and service we can give to Him!

What If He Really Did Call 10,000 Angels?

"Ten Thousand Angels" has been a beloved hymn for sixty-five years. In fact, it has always been one of my favorites. It is hard to find a better song to put into perspective the tremendous personal sacrifice of Jesus Christ.

The song is based on our Lord's statement in Matthew 26:53, where He rebukes Peter, saying,

"Put your sword in its place, for all who take the sword will perish by the sword. Or do you think that I cannot now pray to My Father, and He will provide Me with more than twelve legions of angels?" The hymn takes us step-by-step through the physical and time, He could have called 10,000 angels to halt His suffering. It is a beautiful expression of the incredible obedience, mercy, and love shown by our Lord.

Now, have you ever considered, "What if Jesus really did choose the angels instead of the cross?" What would have happened to mankind? The answer helps us truly appreciate the magnitude of Christ's sacrifice.

When you think of angels coming to rescue Jesus, the story of Elisha against the Syrians in 2 Kings 6 might come to mind. The city in which Elisha was residing was surrounded by the Syrians. One of Elisha's young servants became fearful, but when Elisha prayed that his eyes would be opened, he saw an army of angels on their side. "And behold, the mountain was full of horses and chariots of fire all around Elisha" (v. 17). What a sight that must have been! Had the Syrians seen such a force, they would have run away in fear. Had Jesus called the angels, mankind wouldn't stand a chance against them. But, the reality of that choice is far more terrifying.

If Jesus called 10,000 angels, there would be nothing to satisfy God's wrath against sin. If "all have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God" (Rom. 3:23) and "...the wages of sin is death" (Rom. 6:23), then our reward should be eternal punishment (2 Thess. 1:9). But, "...God did not appoint us to wrath, but to obemotional tortures Jesus endured, though at any **nothing to satisfy** tain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ..." (1 Thess. 5:9).

> Thanks be to God that Jesus did not call 10,000 angels. Because Jesus did give Himself to die in our stead, we have hope. We have hope for those who die in Christ (1 Thess. 4:13). And we have hope for our own salvation. "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who according to His abundant mercy has begotten us again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead..." (1 Pet. 1:3).

> He could have called 10,000 angels. But, He didn't. He died alone for you and me. Let us live as those who have hope.

The magnet of heaven

According to a quick web search, the world's most powerful magnet is located in Tallahassee, Florida, at Florida State University's National High Magnetic Field Laboratory.
