## **Good Soldiers in the Greatest Army**

In Paul's last epistle, he described to Timothy the attributes of a good soldier. Since all of us are encouraged to put on the armor of the Lord (Eph. 6:11), we would all be wise to think seriously about what Jesus expects of us as His soldiers. Take time to look at Paul's description in 2 Timothy 2:1-6.

#### Good soldiers are strong in the grace of Christ (v. 1).

Our strength does not come from within, it comes from our understanding of grace. No man can be a perfect soldier, but every man can be perfected by wise to meditate the world to distract us really do not matter. Be de-His grace. Be strong in grace.

Good soldiers know the source of the truth we believe (v. 2). Paul reminds Timothy that he had heard heaven's message from him. Good soldiers today hear that same message from that same man. Be confident in the source of truth you first have believed.

Good soldiers stand in all the things he has learned and gives the same truths to others (v. 2). The KJV translates these words urging Timothy to commit the same message to faithful men, who in turn would commit the same message to others. Be confident that truth never changes—never changes.

Good soldiers endure hardship regardless of the cost (v. 3). In the previous chapter, Paul mentions two men who had left the faith, and Paul had withdrawn from them. This is

We would be on God's definitions of a good soldier

why he began this chapter with the word "therefore." Men can make shipwreck of the faith, but a good soldier endures whatever hardship his service to his King might bring. Be determined to be faithful until death, regardless of the cost.

Good soldiers stay focused and are not distracted by the world around them (v. 4). Every Christian should meditate on these words. "No one engaged in warfare entangles himself in the affairs of this life, that he may please him who enlisted

him as a soldier." Secular affairs, political affairs, sporting events, success in the world and all that is in termined to keep the main thing the main thing.

Good soldiers are like athletes (v. 5). He trains extensively for the events, but he fully understands that he must compete lawfully. He knows the truth he has learned, and that truth regulates every action. Be aware of the boundaries God has given you.

Good soldiers are like hardworking farmers who first partake of the crops (v. 6). At first reading one might think Paul is discussing financial support for workers. This does not fit the context. The vital word in this verse is the word "first." Before he sees the results of the seeds he works so hard to plant, he must apply them first to his life! Otherwise his life is hypocritical. Be a soldier who applies the truth to your life first.

Be a good soldier in the greatest work on earth!



## **The Complete Revelation of God**

When it comes to the Bible, one must be able to answer the question, "Is the Bible the complete revelation of God, or are there verbal revelations from God outside of and subsequent to God's revelation of His will in the Bible?" The Bible clearly teaches that it is the complete revelation of God.

"All Scripture is given by the inspiration of God" (2

Tim. 3:16). No part of Scripture was ever the result "of any private interpretation, for prophecy never came by the will of man, but holy men of God spoke as they were moved by the Holy Spirit" (2 Pet. 1:20-21). The Bible clearly teaches the verbal inspiration of all Scripture, for the Holy Spirit "revealed" the very "words" to be recorded (1 Cor. 2:10-13).

#### In recording the "words" revealed by God to

man, there is an emphasis throughout the New Testament that God was providing His complete revelation for man to know His entire will for them. On the night before His death, Jesus told the apostles that the Holy Spirit would come when He left, and look at this affirmation: "When He, the Spirit of truth, has come, He will guide you into all truth" (John 16:13). Read that carefully. When the Holy Spirit came, into how much truth would He guide the apostles? When the Holy Spirit was done guiding the apostles, how much truth would He have given?

Put together the passages already studied. The Holy Spirit "moved" the writers of Scripture to "reveal" the "words" of God (and not man), and in that verbal "inspiration" process, He guided them into "all truth." When the Holy Spirit completed His work with these men, there would be no more truth to reveal. The revelation of God would be complete.

This is emphasized again in the verse right after affirming that "All Scripture is given by the inspiration of God,"

> which gives us the purpose of God breathing out all Scripture—"that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work" (2 Tim. 3:17). By furnishing completely, the Scripture gives to man everything that he needs to serve God. There is not anything missing or to be revealed later, else man really was not thoroughly equipped.

The God-directed Jude wrote that "the faith" (i.e., the gospel system, Gal. 1:11+23) "was once for all delivered" (Jude 3). Just as the blood of Jesus was offered "once for all" (Heb. 7:27), never to be amended, Scripture has been "once for all time" delivered to man by inspired writers, never to be amended. It is the complete revelation of God!

Having the full revelation of God in the Bible, we must never "add to" or "take away" from any part of it (Rev. 22:18-19). We must "live by every word" that God has given to us (Matt. 4:4), for we have "every word" He is going to give to us!

What was it about Dorcas that these men and women cared so much for her? Verses 36 and 39 reveal that she was a beloved member of the community who "was full of good works and charitable deeds" (v. 36). When news of her resurrection spread, the Bible says many were converted to Christ. As Christians striving to be the church that Christ died for, we rightfully spend a lot of time making sure that our worship reflects the pattern laid by Christ's disciples. But, we must not

> forget to make sure we reflect their hearts in our charity. 1 John 3:17-19 tells us that we cannot shut up our hearts to brothers in need. "Let us not love in word or in tongue, but in deed and in truth. And by this we know that we are of the truth, and shall assure our hearts before Him" (v. 17).

> Let this holiday season start a new habit for yourselves. Let us go and look for opportunities to

reflect the love of Jesus Christ to our brothers, sisters, and strangers. Speak to the church elders, community leaders, and to the less fortunate in your life and see where you can be a blessing. If we reflect the heart of Jesus Christ and His disciples more, how many souls might believe in our Lord? 
