You Have Come to the Heavenly Jerusalem

They saw only a

but God saw in it

a far greater

temple

As discussed last week, the estimated value for the cost of all materials in the temple Solomon built is \$240,381,000,000. King Nebuchadnezzar destroyed that "Eighth Wonder of the Ancient World," and we tend to lose sight of worship in the temple. When Babylon fell, the Jews returned to Jerusalem

under the leadership of Zerubbabel and built a new temple. They even brought vessels from the first temple.

We do not have room in this article to give the details, but humanly speaking, it was almost temple of wood, nothing compared to Solomon's temple. Instead of using those magnificent cedars from Lebanon, it was built with wood locally found. There is a sense in which Solomon's temple was a "temple of gold" and the second temple was a "temple of wood." God

used the prophet Haggai to deliver this message to the Jews. "Go up to the mountains and bring wood and build the temple that I may take pleasure in it and be glorified" (Hag. 1:8).

God then said to the Jews of Haggai's day, "Who is left among you who saw this temple in its former glory? And how do you see it now? In comparison with it, is this not in your eyes as nothing" (Hag. 2:3). Humanly speaking, a temple of wood is not worthy to be compared to a temple of gold. God saw in the new temple far more than the Jews did. He said, "The glory of this latter temple shall be greater than the former" (Hag. 2:9). God saw in that temple of wood how it would lead to the coming Jesus (described as the "Desire of All Nations" in verse 8), and there would be a new temple filled with heavenly glory. Those Jews only saw a temple of wood, but God saw in it the seeds of the Messiah and His temple!

The temple they saw is mentioned in verse three, but God looked at it with heavenly insight and in verse nine spoke

> of a far greater temple—the Messianic Temple. Bible students should never overlook the six verses separating these two views.

> The Holy Spirit quotes those six verses in Hebrews 12. Read them first in Haggai and then read the application in the New Testament. The Desire of All Nations had come and figuratively His coming and His continuing presence had shaken heaven and

earth. The tabernacle was built at Mt. Sinai (mentioned in verse 18). "But you have come to Mt. Zion...the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem to ... the church of the firstborn who are registered in heaven" (vs. 22-23).

They saw a temple of wood, and God saw the glorious church. Read Paul's words carefully. "To Him be glory in the church by Jesus Christ to all generations forever and ever. Amen" (Eph. 3:21). To this we add our own words, "Amen and Amen!"



You've Been Bought!

How do you pay for something that you purchase today? Who do you pay? When do you pay? Where do you pay? The answer, I suppose, depends on what the product or service is and who is making the purchase. Consider how much variation there is in paying for something today.

WHO do you pay? You might pay one person at a restaurant window, and then another person gives you what you paid for. You might pay a bank for a product that is given to you by a company.

WHEN do you pay? You may pay before you receive the product in a pre-order. You may put it on layaway, and make payments before receiving a product. You may purchase on credit, and make payments after receiving a product.

HOW do you pay? You could use cash, you could use a check, you could use a credit card. You could pay in-person or online. You could barter and exchange some good or services for what you want.

Systems and methods of payment vary so much that often questions must be asked to determine the exact who, what, when, where and how, in order to make sure it is done right. What does that have to do with anything spiritual?

The Bible talks about Jesus making a purchase. Did you know that Jesus bought something? First, He "redeemed His people" (Luke 1:68) "from every lawless deed" (Tit. 2:14) "to God" (Rev. 5:9). When and how did He do that? Second, which is identical with the first, He "purchased" His "church" (Acts 20:28). When and how did He do that?

The currency that Jesus used was not any "corruptible things, like silver or gold" (1 Pet. 1:18). No, what He "gave" in

> this purchase was "Himself" (Tit. 2:14). "He purchased with His own blood" (Acts 20:28)-His "precious blood" (1 Pet. 1:19).

Jesus did not use a credit plan or a layaway plan. He paid in full in "the death of the cross" (Phil. 2:8). Truly, "you were bought at a price" (1 Cor. 6:20) -the steep price of "the blood of His cross" (Col. 1:20).

Stop and reflect for a moment. That is how valuable you are to Him! He did not look for a clearance rack or a coupon! He gave all that He had to save your soul! Why would He do that? The simple answer is: He loves you! "His great love with which He loved us" (Eph. 2:4) is a hard thing to fathom, and the blessings we receive are just as unfathomable.

So, what should we do with this information? You no longer belong to yourself! You belong to Him, by right of purchase! "Therefore," here it is, " glorify God" (1 Cor. 6:20).

hate coconut! Apparently, I once expressed my disdain for the tropical fruit, but it was misremembered as deep love. We all had a good laugh, and I ate the cake anyway, because I knew he was sincerely trying to give me something I love.

Sincerity is a valuable trait. When someone's actions are guided by an honest heart, we comes to spiritu- that the Lord will not tolerate false teaching. He tend to feel admiration and understanding toward them, even if they are wrong. But, how far will sincerity carry you when it comes to spiritual matters?

Throughout the world there are hundreds, if not thousands of denominations teaching doctrines that are contrary to the Bible, but for the majority of them, they are not intentionally trying to be at odds with God. They sincerely believe in what they teach. So, many will wonder, would God really condemn people who were honestly trying to please Him even if they are wrong?

First, we must see that the Bible is clear that denomi-

nationalism is unbiblical. The Bible teaches that there is only one church. "There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called in one hope of your calling; one Lord, one faith, one baptism..." (Eph. 4:4-5). Furthermore, the Bible shows us that the church cannot be divided on doctrine. Paul writes, "Now I plead with you, brethren...that you all speak the same thing, and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judg-

> ment" (1 Cor. 1:10). So, if a church teaches doctrines that are contrary to the Scriptures, then it is in opposition to the one church that Jesus died for (cf. Acts 20:28; Eph. 1:22; 5:23).

> Second, we must see that the Bible is clear warned us in 2 Timothy 4:3-4 that false doctrines would come about and that many would fall prey to

them. In Matthew 7:21-23, Jesus tells that it is not an excuse. Jesus says, "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father in heaven... And then I will declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from Me, you who practice lawlessness!""

If we think that God will overlook false doctrine, we are sincerely wrong. There is only one church that will save. If we let our admiration of sincere religion blind us from this uncomfortable truth, many sincere people will be sincerely lost.

Emperor Palpatine is a creative depiction of how the devil works—"cunning" (Gen. 3:1), "crafty" (2 Cor. 11:3), "deceitful" (Rev. 12:9). But yielding to the devil will ALWAYS be a losing decision for you! "Do not," under any circumstances, "give the devil an opportunity" (Eph. 4:27)! - DS




