

# A Turning Point in Bible Study

I distinctly remember a conversation I had with a young man I had just baptized years ago in Birmingham. He was on fire for the Lord and told me that he was spending a lot of time reading the Bible. I wanted him to have a better study Bible than the one he had, so I explained the concept of translation

from the Greek to English and gave him a New American Standard Version, which has outstanding center column references I find so helpful. If you were Satan

He called me the next day and was so excited. Now keep in mind that he had been using the King James Version. He said, "I am now so amazed as I read the Bible. You really can understand what it says! I thought reading the Bible was like reading Shakespeare—just a lot of words but no one was sure what they meant."

Now if you were Satan, how would you deal with the powerful impact reading the Bible has on individuals? I can immediately think of two lies I would foster on all mankind. The first can be illustrated by imagining you were given a 300page book and told beforehand that you should read it, but that it was so far above your intelligence level you would never understand it. How much would you read it? How interested would you be in wasting your time reading it? Isn't this what Satan has done? Does not America believe that the Bible is so complex that almost no one can understand it?

The second lie would be that if you spend too much time reading the Bible you will end up being a religious fanatic, bordering on insanity. Who would read a book which is so "dangerous" it might warp you forever? Isn't this what Satan has done?

> Now consider the promises of God. "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst after righteousness for they shall be filled" (Matt. 5:6). Who said this? When God became a man, God said it. Ours is not to deny this by believing lies originating from Satan. Ours is to believe and seek for righteousness, confidently assured that God will reveal it to us.

> The Bible does have truths that are more difficult to understand than others easily understood,

but even the difficult truths can be known (2 Pet. 3:16)! The amazing thing is that every truth related to becoming a Christian is so simply grasped. Read the Bible expecting to find the path to heaven, and God Himself has promised your desire will be fulfilled. "You will seek Me and find Me, when you search for Me will all your heart" (Jer. 29:13).

That's the turning point in reading the Bible. You do your part. Open your Bible and read it seeking to find His will. He will do His part!



## "I Was Baptized in a Denomination"

If we ONLY had the Bible, what would we know about the church? Ponder that for a moment. If we ONLY had the Bible, what would we know about baptism? Ponder that for a moment. A third question, is everything being taught and done in the name of Jesus today in true accordance with

Scripture? That just cannot be answered in the affirmative.

So, when it comes to matters of faith, matters of truth, matters of doctrine, matters of righteousness, there is ONLY one place we can go. We must turn our eyes to the Word of God and leave all human ideas and teachings behind.

First, the Word of God teaches us that "There is one body" (Eph. 4:4), which is "the church" (Eph. 1:22-23), so there is "one church."

That "one" church is not a collection of all of the manmade churches, anymore than the "one God" of verse 6 is a collection of all of the manmade gods. There is only "one church" that Jesus built (Matt. 16:18), purchased (Acts 20:28) and of which He serves as the one head (Eph. 5:23). God does not accept any "divisions" in His one church, for He commands everyone to "speak the same thing" (1 Cor. 1:10). Conclusion: The Word of God lends no support to and, in fact, condemns manmade denominationalism that exists today. Second, the Word of God teaches us that "There is one baptism" (Eph. 4:5). The "one baptism" has one method burial (Rom. 6:4; Col. 2:12; Acts 8:38; Matt. 3:16). The "one baptism" has one authority—in the name of Jesus Christ (Acts 2:38; 10:48; 19:5; 1 Cor. 1:13). The "one baptism" has one proper subject—a penitent believer (Mark 16:16; Acts 2:38; 8:36; 18:8). The "one baptism" has one purpose—for the forgiveness of sins (Mark 16:16; Acts 2:38; 22:16; 1 Pet. 3:21).

> The "one baptism" has one order of progression hear, believe, repent, confess, baptized, be saved (Rom. 10:8-17; Mark 16:16; Acts 2:38; 18:8). The "one baptism" has one church to enter—the body of Christ, the church of Christ (Acts 2:41, 47; 1 Cor. 12:13; Rom. 6:3; Gal. 3:27). Conclusion: The Word of God lends no support to and, in fact, condemns (Rev. 22:18-19; Gal. 1:6-9) all manmade baptism doctrines or practices that do not conform to God's "one bap-

tism" specifically and clearly defined in the New Testament.

As is evidenced by simple investigation today, most denominations do not teach or practice all of these "ones" of the "one baptism." If I was baptized in a denomination: (1) Can I be satisfied that I was truly baptized with the "one baptism? (2) Am I willing to risk the salvation of my soul? (3) Should I not follow the example of those whose baptism was not the "one baptism" (in Acts 19:1-5) and get baptized today with the "one baptism" of Jesus Christ?

# We Have a Motive!

"Motive' "s the reason behind a decision or action. Knowing why we would do something can be one of the best evidences for if we do something. When a prosecutor is trying to convince a jury to convict a defendant for murder, it may all hinge on whether or not they present a reasonable

motive for the crime. If a jury can understand why someone would do it, they are more likely to be convinced that they actually did it.

Is there a sufficient motive for us to follow Christ? What if we explained our reason for being a Christian to someone else? Would they have enough evidence to believe that we really do believe the leads to the best a worldly life can certainly give plenty of temporary faith we proclaim? Does our reason for living differently than the rest of the world make sense?

In 1 Timothy 4, verses 8-10, Paul explains our motive for being Christians. He writes, "For bodily exercise profits a little, but godliness is profitable for all things, having promise of the life that now is and of that which is to come." He is telling us that our reason for living as a Christian comes down to two things: a profitable life on earth and a profitable life in heaven. We do what the Bible says is right not only because there is a reward of heaven, but because it leads to the best possible life.

We are motivated to live Christian lives because our actions are in line with our purpose. Every person wants to know what their purpose in life is. Without purpose, our lives have no meaning. If we want fulfillment in life, then we must live according to our purpose. Ecclesiastes 12:13 tells us that our purpose is to "Fear God and keep His commandments, for this is man's all." This means that living a godly life is exactly what we were made for. We weren't made to live for the tem-

porary pleasures of life. We are eternal, spiritual be-We do what the ings (cf. Ecc. 12:7; Gen. 2:7). We were made to glorify God.

> We are also motivated to live Christian lives because it is good for our health and wellbeing. Living pleasure. But, we all know that they come with terrible consequences. Drunkenness leads to violence and

car accidents. Lying destroys trust and relationships. Promiscuity brings disease and tears apart marriages. Fleshly living may seem fun in the moment, but it will always lead to chaos. If I am living according to the Bible, then it can all be avoided. "For to be carnally minded is death, but to be spiritually minded is life and peace" (Rom. 8:6).

We have a motive for being Christians! If we know it, we will be ready to give a defense to everyone who asks us a reason for the hope that is in us (cf. 1 Pet. 3:15).
