

# Once a Goat, Always a Goat—Once a Sheep, Never a Goat

to Jesus, but a

"sheep" has no

freedom to turn

away from Him

Let us not be

fooled!

Church history shows there was a great rebellion against the Catholic Church in Europe in the 16th century. Who has not heard of Martin Luther and how he sowed the seeds for other Protestant churches who openly departed from the catholic (worldwide) church centered around the Vatican?

At that same time, John Calvin, who was born in France but fled to Switzerland, and his writings became the basis for many of the doctrines so widely believed.

A "goal"

There were no mainline churches like Presbyterians, Methodists, or Baptist churches, but as the reformation movement spread, Calvin's writings became the doctrinal foundation of these various Protestant churches. There were five major aspects of the doctrine of Calvinism that were so widespread

in these churches. One of these doctrines was predestination, which in our day is no longer in the forefront of the creeds of Protestantism but many of the others are widely held.

One of central teachings of Calvin affirms that once a person is saved he can never be separated from God. Calvin called it the "perseverance of the saints." In our day it is described as the "impossibility of apostasy," the "eternal security of believers" or the "impossibility of falling from grace." The clearest way to describe this teaching is that once one be-

comes a child of God, there is absolutely no way he can forfeit his salvation. There is no sin or action that could cause him to ever be destined for the fires of hell.

Jesus used two animals, sheep and goats, to describe mankind. Predestination says, "Once a goat, always a goat," and there is nothing one can do to change that. The doctrine of the impossibility of apostasy says "Once a sheep, never a goat." A goat has free will to turn to Jesus and become one of

A "goat" can turn His sheep, but once he is a sheep he loses his free will. He cannot go to hell, even if he wants to!

This aspect of Calvinism is part of the teachings of the largest denomination in the south. Just say the "sinner's prayer" and you can never lose that salvation. It is also widely believed by community churches today.

The important question is not who is right or who is wrong about these teachings. The most important question is, "What is right?" How do I find the answer to this? Go to the Bible and read the epistles written to the early Christians. Were they warned against falling away? Read the six chapters of Galatians and see what God said. Pay special attention to Gal. 1:6-9; 3:1; 4:11; 5:1-2, 4, 7, 21; 6:7-8. Truth is not determined by a pope, by a creed, by a statement of faith, by Luther or Calvin or televangelists today. Read the Bible to see what God teaches about sheep and goats, about sin and salvation.

# **That Tempting Situation**

In May 2022, Tyreek Hill, of the Miami Dolphins, purchased a 7-bedroom, 8.5-bathroom home for \$6.9 million. That's a really nice place! On January 3, 2024, a fire ripped through that house, and it took fire-fighters two hours to quell the flames, leaving extensive water and smoke damage

throughout the house. A really nice place was nearly destroyed and left with severe and very costly damage.

How could something so valuable and beautiful so quickly be ravaged and left with lasting devastation? What could cause such destruction? Here it is: The fire was sparked by a child playing with a lighter in one of the bedrooms.

Do you think that child had any idea the damage that such a small, seemingly innocent act could cause? Playing with a lighter is no big deal, right? It's "small." It's "controllable." It's "easy to keep secret," so that no one will ever know, right? And, sure, it's a little risky, but that's what gives it a sense of excitement and intrigue. The child had no idea what would happen! But that's the point.

How often do we, as Christians, behave in a similar fashion to this little child? I'm not talking about playing with lighters, but I'm talking about playing with temptation.

How often (and why?) do we put ourselves in tempt-

ing situations (even if "only slightly tempting"), but we think we can "handle it"? Maybe we think it's just a "small" thing. Maybe we think that it's "controllable." Maybe we think that it's a "secret" and nobody knows about it, so it's no big deal. And, maybe, we realize that we are bordering on the edge of temptation, but that little "risk" gives us a little spark of excitement and adrenalin and intrigue.

Friends, are you playing with temptation? Are you getting yourself too close, but you think you've got it under control? The book of wisdom says, "Can a man take fire to his bosom, And his clothes not be burned? Can one walk on hot coals, And his feet not be seared?" (Prov. 6:27-28). Peter probably thought it was no big deal for him to go and warm himself with those who hated Jesus, but putting himself in that situation led him into sin (Luke 22:54-62). David

probably thought it was no big deal for him to take a sneak peak at Bathsheba while she was bathing, but allowing himself to keep looking led him into sin (2 Sam. 11:1-27).

We need to "watch and pray" to keep ourselves from entering "into temptation" (Luke 22:40, 46; 8:13; 11:4). Our "own desires" entice us to think we can control temptation (Jas. 1:13-14). Let us not be fooled! Let us "flee" (2 Tim. 2:22) and "abstain" (1 Thess. 5:22; 1 Pet. 2:11), rather than playing with fire to see how close we can get without getting burned. Your soul is more valuable than a 6.9-million-dollar home!

# In An Instant...

On the evening of January 29, 2025, a United States Army Sikorsky UH-60 Black Hawk helicopter collided with an American Airlines CRJ700 airliner. The crash resulted in the deaths of 67 people. Although an investigation is still underway, it is believed that the crash happened because the helicopter crew

did not see the incoming passenger jet.

When I hear of tragedies like this, I can't help but wonder how many of these victims were in a right relationship with God. About 45,000 flights transporting around 2.9 million people occur every day in the US. It is safe to assume that everyone on board the CRJ700 and Army Black Hawk expected to go home that day. They had plans for what they were going to do after they landed and, in an instant, they were facing eternity.

We never know when our lives will suddenly come to an end. James tells us, "...whereas you do not know what will happen tomorrow. For what is your life? It is even a vapor that appears for a little time and then vanishes away" (Jas. 4:14). Will we suffer an accident? Will we be diagnosed with a terminal illness? Or will the Lord choose today to return? We have no way of knowing (cf. Matt. 24:36). But, what is certain is that our final day will come, and we will stand before God in judgment. "And as it is appointed for men to die once, but after this the judgment..." (Heb. 9:27). Are you ready to meet the Judge?

Many people will foolishly live their lives as if there is nothing to fear. But, unless you are in Christ, you have everything to be afraid of. The Bible tells us that "...all have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God" (Rom. 3:23) and that "The wages of sin is death..." (Rom. 6:23). When you stand before

the Lord in judgment, what will your record show? If you are covered in sin, then there is only one verdict God can render: guilty. Before you stand before Him, you need to be forgiven.

Christ came to this world so that the guilt of your sin might be washed away. Paul tells us, "Therefore, as through one man's offense judgment came to all men, resulting in condemnation, even so

through one Man's righteous act the free gift came to all men, resulting in justification of life" (Rom. 5:18). If we are in Christ, then we are no longer in danger of judgment. In His sacrifice, we can become justified before God.

Many have known this for a long time but haven't yet chosen to become a Christian. Some day they will be out of time. But, in an instant, you can be free of the guilt of sin and the fear of death. "And now why are you waiting? Arise and be baptized, and wash away your sins..." (Acts 22:16).

# What somebody else is thinking

So many times, people have struggled with anxiety, have avoided certain places or individuals, have doubted their own worth, have made poor decisions, have chosen to not take a needed step, have caused trouble or hurt in other people's lives (and a host of other choices) all because they thought that someone else was thinking a certain way toward them. Here are two things to keep in mind.

One, you cannot know what another person is thinking just by thinking you know (or worrying about) what the person is thinking. Unless they tell you with their own mouth, you cannot know (1 Cor. 2:11). So, stop worrying about it and making decisions based upon what you do not know.

Two, you cannot stop another person from thinking what they are going to think. You can do all the right things and make all the right decisions, and someone is still going to think negatively about you. Ask Elijah. Ask John the Baptist. Ask Jesus. So, do what is right...in the eyes of God...and only worry about what is pleasing in His sight (1 John 3:22)! That is all that matters! - DS

# Jesus has been talking about you

Some claim that Jesus talks to them today. Well, the Bible says that it contains "all things that pertain to life and godliness" (2 Pet. 1:3) and "all truth" that has been given God (John 16:13), and that God's Word has been "once for all delivered" (Jude 3).
