Jeremiah and "Prophets" of His Day

Jeremiah chapter twenty-three gives a vivid picture of what was happening just before Nebuchadnezzar came to bring God's judgment on the Jewish nation. The land was filled with many prophets, but Jeremiah stands in marked contrast with those false prophets found throughout the land.

There are so many lessons to be learned from reading this chapter.

First, there is the reaction of Jeremiah. "My heart within me is broken because of the prophets; all my bones shake" (v. 9). He was so overwhelmed that he described himself as being like a drunken man who has been overcome by wine. He reacted in this way, "...because of the Lord, and because of His holy words."

God's hope for the spirituality of the Jews was entrusted to prophets and priests. Jeremiah stood alone against the prophets of Samaria in the northern kingdom and against the prophets in Jerusalem in the southern kingdom (vs. 12-13). Their messages were described as folly and as a horrible thing. These messages had "caused My people Israel to err" and "commit adultery and walk in lies" (vs. 13-14). God's view of every one of them was they "...are like Sodom to Me, and her inhabitants like Gomorrah."

These prophets "speak a vision of their own hearts" (v. 16), "prophecy lies" and the deceits of their own heart" (v. 26), saying "I have dreamed, I have dreamed" (v. 25)!

These prophets had been joined by the priests (v. 11). Those who had been appointed by God to reverently come before Him on behalf of the nations had profaned the Holy Place and the Most Holy Place on earth. God said, "Yes, in My house I have found their wickedness" (v. 11). Judgment lay on

> the horizon, which Jeremiah described as God coming as a violent whirlwind that would fall violently on the head of the wicked (v. 19). His anger would not be turned back until He had executed and performed the thoughts of His heart. Yet these false prophets repeatedly said that only peace lay ahead and condoned the worship of Baal (v. 17).

God said, "I have not sent these prophets, yet they ran. I have not spoken to them, yet they prophesied" (v. 21). "Do not listen to the words of the prophets who prophesy to you. They make you worthless; they speak a vision of their own heart, not from the mouth of the Lord" (v. 16).

This is such a remarkable section of the Bible and teaches us so much. The only true path to find our God in a land filled with so many "prophets" is to only listen to the message He has given in the Scriptures we know are from God. Jeremiah was grieved and so should we be!

Books produced by mere men have been found to be plagued with mistakes, especially as time passes. But not the Bible! That's amazing! That's from God!

Amazing Fact #3: The Bible is filled with predictive prophecies that were fulfilled exactly as predicted. There are hundreds of prophecies that were made hundreds (sometimes thousands) of years before their fulfillment, and these prophecies deal with matters relating to people, places and events that were impossible for the writers to have known about or to have affected the outcome in any way. No human could ever foretell the future like the Bible does! That's amazing! That's from God!

Pick up your Bible. This is no ordinary book!

Amazing Fact #4: The Bible contains extraordinary scientific foreknowledge. The Bible is not a science textbook, but there are scientific details within it that are astonishing, as related to the fields of astronomy, oceanography, biology, medicine, physics, etc. The penmen could have never known or understood these things, as man just recently

"discovered" most of them in the last few centuries. That's amazing! That's from God!

Pick up your Bible. This is no ordinary book! While many charges have been leveled against the Bible, those charges have all faded one-by-one, but the Bible still remains. Why is that? Because the evidence within the pages of the Bible itself prove that it can in no way be the product of a man or a group of men (on their own)! God used men to write HIS WORD (2 Tim. 3:16-17; 2 Pet. 1:20-21). That's amazing!

For the Bible Tells Me So

One of my favorite sounds in the world is a chorus of young people singing cheerfully, "Jesus loves me. This I know for the Bible tells me so." It's a song simple enough that any child can learn it and start singing along in minutes. It has a simple melody and a simple message. Why do I know

that Jesus loves me? Because it says so in the Bible.

It's such a simple explanation. But is it too simple? Thousands upon thousands of books, essays, sermons, and the like have been written by Christian apologists to explain the basic claims of the Bible. And these claims have been debated countless times by atheists and others. Surely it isn't enough to say that I can truly know that Jesus loves me simply because the Bible says so. Are we deceiving our children with an overly simple answer to all the criticisms the

world will hurl toward them? Or is it really that simple?

Jesus certainly thinks so. In John 17:17, He prayed to God, saying, "Sanctify them by Your truth. Your word is truth." Here, Jesus expresses that the word of God is true. That means that the Bible is trustworthy. If it wasn't trustworthy, then Jesus would have been lying when He said in John 8:32, "And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free." The truth of the Bible is the very foundation of our faith. If it wasn't

trustworthy, then we would have no reason to hope for the promises found in Jesus Christ.

Some may argue, these are only the words of a man who lived 2,000 years ago. What makes Him trustworthy? Because the trustworthy nature of Jesus was seen and attested to by trustworthy witnesses. "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth" (John

1:14). John speaks on behalf of the apostles and all those who saw Jesus risen from the dead (cf. 1 Cor. 15:3-8), declaring that His resurrection proved that Jesus was not just a man but is the embodiment of truth. This fact was so undeniable to the apostles that each of them refused to recant their faith, even in the face of execution and exile. It was to these men that the Lord Jesus gave the responsibility of

writing the New Testament (cf. Acts 1:8; 2 Pet. 1:21; Heb. 1:1).

The message of the Bible is the most amazing thing in the world. The God of the Universe, Jesus the Christ, loves me. Whatever trial or tribulation, loss, disease, or heartache that may come into my life cannot destroy the comfort of this truth. I know that it is true because the Bible tells me so. And the Bible is true because Jesus is trustworthy. And so are the men who died to bring this most wonderful news. And that is all I need to know.

Feeling overwhelmed?

Do you ever feel like you have too much going on? Do you feel overwhelmed and not sure how much more you can take? Sometimes it is easy to let stresses take over. If any of that sounds familiar, consider this.

STEP ONE: Press pause for just 10 seconds. When Peter was overwhelmed, he prayed the shortest prayer in the Bible, "Lord, save me!" (Matt. 14:30).

Throughout your day, press pause and just say, "Lord, please help me!" STEP TWO: Press pause for just 10 more seconds. When Paul was overwhelmed with suffering, in every one of the prison epistles, he said, "I thank my God" (Eph.

1:16; Phil. 1:3; Col. 1:3; Phile. 4). Find little things throughout your days to pause and tell God a simple, "Thank You for that!" STEP THREE: Press pause for a final 10 seconds. When Jesus was overwhelmed with pain and anguish, He took time to see those around Him and do something for them (Luke 23:34, 43; John 19:26). Take 10 seconds to send a short text of encouragement to someone who needs it.

Feeling overwhelmed? 10-second pauses can make a big difference! – DS

Those "one another" pronouns

Dozens of times in the New Testament, the Holy Spirit gives instructions to Christians regarding our relationship with and interaction with "one another" by using that pronoun "one another." This is a reciprocal pronoun, wherein a person performs an action for, toward or on another person, while receiving that same action performed in return.



It is easy as humans to point the finger and identify all of the ways that others are not doing what they should be doing for us. While their inactivity can be disheartening, frustrating and even seem like a reason for inactivity on my part, God will not allow me to remain idle. The

reciprocal pronoun instructs me to act, even if the other person is not acting, realizing that doing such will not only benefit the receiver, but it benefits me as the giver also.

One example: "Bear one another's burdens" (Gal. 6:2). Don't complain if no one is doing it for you. Get busy and get under the burdens of your brethren. You just might find your own burdens lifted in the process. God's ways always work best! – DS






