The Gospel Is...

One of the most amazing qualities about the Bible is that as God reveals His will for our lives, so many vital truths can be expressed in so few words. To see this, look at the letter Paul wrote to the churches of Galatia. Paul had established these churches and his letter to them gives great insight into pro-

found truths about the gospel.

The gospel is unique. He had preached the gospel to them, but they had failed to continue in their devotion to the truth. "I marvel that you are turning away so soon from Him that called you into the grace of Christ to a different gospel, which is not another; but there are some who trouble you and because it can be is not after man" (1:11, KJV). The Greek word for want to pervert the gospel of Christ" (1:6-7). They were turning away from the gospel, thinking there

were other gospels. There is one gospel and any change to the gospel results in a perverted gospel. It is unique and there is nothing worthy to be compared to it.

The gospel is teachable and receivable. In the next verses, Paul reminded the Galatians how their salvation involved his preaching it (v. 8). The Great Commission was to preach the gospel, and those saints had received it (v. 9). If it is teachable and receivable, then it must be understandable. This is exactly what happened when those churches began.

The gospel is unalterable. There is no authority for even the apostles to add to or take away from the gospel. "But even if we...preach any other gospel to you than what we have preached to you, let him be accursed" (1:8). There is not authority for any angel from heaven to change the gospel. "But even if...an angel from heaven preach any other gospel to you than what we have preached to you, let him be accursed" (1:8). There is no authority for any person who has ever

> lived or who shall ever live to alter truth. "If anyone preaches any other gospel to you than what you have received, let him be accursed" (v. 9).

> The gospel is certifiable. "But I certify you, brethren, that the gospel which was preached of me "certify" involves more that stating it. God not only revealed the truth, but He certifies that it is truth. He

who was the way, the truth and the life spoke the truth, and it was accompanied with miracles. He who was truth gave the truth to the apostles and first-century prophets. It was accompanied with more miracles. "And they went out and preached everywhere, the Lord working with them and confirming the word through the accompanying signs" (Mark 16:20).

We have the truth. It has been certified. Let us learn it. Let us live it. Then let us faithfully teach it to others without any change. That is His plan!



Give Me the Bible, Not "Sola Scriptura" (Part 1 of 6)

The gospel can

be preached and

received. This is

Many people have asked over the years, "So you believe sola scriptura?" I remember the first time someone ever asked me something like that-I had no idea what they were talking about. I had never heard of "sola scriptura." I've been in some Bible studies where a person will say, "Of course

you would say that! You're sola scriptura!"

At first, it may sound, on the surface, like a good thing to believe in "sola scriptura." After all, it is simply a Latin phrase that means, "by Scripture alone." Isn't going "by Scripture alone" a good thing? What could be wrong with believing or claiming "sola scriptura"?

Consider for a moment that this is a phrase that was made up by a group of men to describe a certain belief system. As such, the phrase actually has some different understandings about how it is applied and exactly what it means. For example, does it mean that "Scripture alone" is sufficient or that "Scripture alone" is the authority or something else? Interestingly, among those who hold to "sola scriptura," there is variation in its explanation. Not to mention that those who do not hold to "sola scriptura" have their own understanding of what the phrase means and what people believe who espouse it. All of that can be kind of confusing.

Here's the better practice: Rather than take a position that aligns with a manmade slogan (without knowing exactly what it means, or exactly what those who hold to it believe it means, or exactly what those who deny it believe it means) and rather than take a position that questions or repudiates the belief system, what if we just go to the Bible itself, read the Bible for what it says for itself and then use Bible terms to explain what the Bible teaches? Let's see where that leads and what we can know (for certain) from that endeavor.

Bible certainty #1: ALL Scripture in the Old Testament and New Testament is inspired of God. The Bible says, "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God" (2 Tim. 3:16), or "breathed out by God" (ESV). Bible writers recognized Divine guidance of their words: "The Spirit of the Lord spoke by me, and His word was on my tongue" (2 Sam. 23:2). While they

"inquired and searched carefully" to fully understand what they were writing, they understood that their words were coming from "the Spirit of Christ who was in them" (1 Pet. 1:10 -12). "We have received...the Spirit who is from God, that we might know the things that have been freely given to us by God. These things we also speak...which the Holy Spirit teaches" (1 Cor. 2:12-13). Peter stated simply, "...holy men of God spoke as they were moved by the Holy Spirit" (2 Pet. 1:21).

In 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18, Paul tells us of the most wonderful day that will ever happen. It is the day that the Lord returns to bring His children with Him into heaven. Paul says that on this glorious day, Jesus will "...descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of an archangel, and with the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive and remain shall be caught up together with

> them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And thus we shall always be with the Lord."

> Can you imagine what that day will be like? All of His faithful children who we love the most, Jesus promises us, we will get to see again and never be separated. This is why a Christian doesn't sorrow like the rest of the world. "For if we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so God will bring with

Him those who sleep in Jesus" (vv. 13-14). Not only will we be united with our Lord and Savior, we will also be reunited with our dear friends and family in Christ.

Do you want to be at Christ's reunion? There is one thing you need to keep in mind. The only ones invited are the members of God's family. Are you a faithful member of the church Jesus died for? 
Bible Games to Play While You Wait

I heard of a family who played the "Name-As-Many-Players-As-You-Can Game" while driving on long trips. Start with the letter "A" and name as many people, places or things you can think of in the Bible that start with that letter, then go on to "B," "C," etc.

When we pick up our Bibles today, guess what we have? We have "the comfort of the Scrip-

tures" (Rom. 15:4), which comes from "the God of comfort" (15:5). With so many things happening in our lives, what do we need? Comfort! Where do we get it? From the Scriptures that were given by "the Comforter"!

How much time do you spend with the words of comfort from the God of comfort? How much better would our lives be, how much closer would we be to God, how much better of a comforter would we be to others, if we were comforted by His inspired comfort? – DS


