Listen to What You Say to Others

He had no idea how he spoke to his family, and the attitude shown by his words was impacting his wife and kids. He would never curse or use profanity, but the tone in what he said really hurt. His wife wondered how to deal with this. So, she secretly recorded what he was saying, and then let him

hear the impact his words were having. When he listened to the recording, he was shocked. He had no idea how what he said and the way he said it sounded to oth- Your words may ers and the impact it was having on his family.

Think about how you treat your family and whether or not what you say and the tone you use would ever be used in a public way when talking to **God remembers** people you hardly know.

Have you thought of what the Bible says about these matters? Let me urge you to read the following verses carefully, and let them impact what you say to others, especially those closest to you.

"Let no corrupt word proceed out of your mouth, but what is good for necessary edification that it may impart grace to the hearers" (Eph. 4:29).

"But fornication and all uncleanness or covetousness, let it not even be named among you, as is fitting for saints, neither filthiness, nor foolish talking, nor coarse jesting, which are not fitting, but rather the giving of thanks" (Eph. 5:3-4).

"Let all bitterness, wrath, anger, clamor (a rarely used English word, the Greeks indicates "loud quarreling"—dj), and evil speaking be put away from you, with all malice. And be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God in Christ forgave you" (Eph. 4:31-32).

> "For every idle word men may speak, they will give account of it in the day of judgment. For by your words you will be justified, and by your words, you will be condemned" (Matt. 12:36-37).

"And the tongue is a fire, a world of iniquity. The tongue is so set among our members that it defiles the whole body, and sets on fire the course of nature; and it is set on fire by hell" (Jas. 3:6).

every word "For to this you were called, because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that you should follow His steps...who, when He was reviled, did not revile in return; when He suffered, He did not threaten, but committed Himself to Him who judges righteously" (1 Pet. 2:21-23).

> That wife who recorded her husband's words listened to that recording and discovered her tone and her words were part of the problem. Tragically, we feel justified about our own actions and are worse to our family than to total strangers. Think about this.



Give Me the Bible, Not "Sola Scriptura" (Part 5 of 6)

It is the responsibility of every responsible Bible student to "[handle] aright the word of truth" (2 Tim. 2:15, ASV). Handling it "aright" clearly warns against handling it "a-wrong." Therefore, we must recognize that we have no authority to "go beyond" (ESV) or even "think beyond what is

written" (1 Cor. 4:6). We have no authority to "speak" beyond what is written, for we must speak only "the oracles of God" (1 Pet. 4:11). We have no authority to create "divisions" by speaking, thinking or going beyond what is written (1 Cor. 1:10). That is our clear, Godgiven responsibility, as we handle "aright" His Word.

While such should never even cross the we hold within mind of finite man when it comes to the infinite God, our hands the Bible repeatedly commands, "You shall not add to the word which I command you, nor take from it" (Deut. 4:2). "You shall not add to it nor take away from it" (Deut. 12:32). "Do not add to His words" (Prov. 30:6). "If anyone adds to these things, God will add to him the plagues that are written in this book; and if anyone takes away from the words of the book of this prophecy, God shall take away his part from the Book of Life, from the holy city, and from the things which are written in this book" (Rev. 22:18-19).

There is only one gospel, one truth, one faith, one

final revelation from God, but some "want to pervert the gospel of Christ" (Gal. 1:6-7), so we are warned about "anyone" who would preach "any other gospel" (1:8-9) or "bring" to us something other than "the doctrine of Christ" (2 John 9-11). It is dangerously "vain" for individuals to go around "teaching as doctrines the commandments of men" (Matt. 15:9). We must "speak THE truth" (Eph. 4:15) and "preach THE word" (2 Tim. 4:2), recognizing the singular, objective, final revelation that we hold within our hands.

> The Bible is full of examples of individuals who chose to go beyond God's Word, thus going beyond God's authority for them. Nadab and Abihu, priests in the Old Testament, offered "unauthorized fire before the Lord," and as a result, "fire came out from before the Lord and consumed them" (Lev. 10:1 -2, ESV). Moses chose to "strike the rock," rather

than "speak to the rock," as instructed by God, and as a result, he was not permitted to enter "into the land" of promise (Num. 20:7-12). Uzzah was improperly transporting the ark of the covenant, and he "put out his hand to the ark of God and took hold of it," when God had instructed to "not touch any holy thing" (Num. 4:15), and as a result, "he died there by the ark of God" (2 Sam. 6:3-7).

We must respect and obey God's Word, lest we "be punished with everlasting destruction" (2 Thess. 1:8-9).

However, these days, such a post is likely to produce as much ridicule as it does solidarity. Critics would much rather chastise you for stating what they see as a trite sentiment and not making a political statement that they agree with. We need to realize that those who criticize this kind of thing do so from an atheistic mindset. To them, saying you are praying about something holds no tangible value because there is no God to answer. At best, they see these words as the futile exercise of a superstitious simpleton. At worst, they assume you lack any real compassion and accuse you of self-righteousness. If only they understood what the power of prayer truly is.

Each Wednesday, we gather as a congregation to pray about things that are on our minds. We pray for sick family

members and coworkers, wayward brothers and sisters in Christ, and those mourning deaths. After reading each name, we bow our heads and ask our Lord in heaven in one accord to hear these prayers. We do not spend all this time in prayer just because it makes feel warm and fuzzy. We pray because we there is a God who has the power to answer.

The Bible tells us over and over that God answers the prayers of faithful Christians. James 5:16 famously tells us.

prayers of faithful Christians. James 5:16 famously tells us, "The effective, fervent prayer of a righteous man avails much." Jesus says in John 15:7, "If you abide in Me, and My words abide in you, you will ask what you desire, and it shall be done for you." All we must do is truly believe it. Mark 11:24 states, "...whatever things you ask when you pray, believe that you receive them, and you will have them." What an amazing privilege we have!

Prayer was not given to us to generate likes and virtual pats on the back. Prayer changes the world!




