Book, Chapter and Verse AND More

When we look at our Bible, we are so blessed even though we may not realize just how blessed we are to have our own personal printed copy of God's will for us.

Our Bible is divided into books, and it was God who determined these divisions. He sent His Spirit upon chosen men to give

us a record of so much of what He has done in the past. These men did not give a private interpretation of His will. They were God's "mouthpieces" and the "handpieces" as He gave us the various books. "No five + seventeen prophecy which were written during the time of prophecy of Scripture is of any private interpretation, for prophecy never came by the will of man, but holy men of God spoke as they were moved by the Holy **nine books of the** is the messages given by God to His holy nation after Spirit" (2 Pet. 1:20-21). God determined the book divisions.

These books were arranged and placed in the order in which we find them by those who received them. They were arranged so that we first have the five books of Moses, for these were the first given. The books of Moses are followed by twelve books of the history of what happened after Moses died. They tell us about Joshua's work and then the events that followed as the judges and kings led the Lord's people.

We then have five books containing the psalms (the songs and poems) written by men who lived during the time recorded in those first seventeen books. They are different from those first books which primarily are historical. These poems contain more than the songs of the Jews. They record God's proverbs, short words of wisdom to shape how men think and the wisdom given through the wisest king who ever lived. This section also tells the conversation between Job and his friends and Job and God. This book is also written in poetical style in the Hebrew Bible and men placed it in this part

where we have these poems of the Bible.

There are then the seventeen books of those first seventeen books of the Bible. While they contain some historical events, their greater content Joshua led them into the Promised Land. The messengers were the "mouthpieces" God used to speak

to the nation He had chosen. He used these men to give His words to that nation about their current spiritual conditions and more importantly to give prophecies about the coming of a newer testament.

That first Old Testament contained thirty-nine books and was for the nation God brought out of Egypt. The New Testament is for every person of every nation. More importantly is the fact that it is His will for you and how you live your life. We will write more about this next week.



Out of Context: "He Who Is Not With Us Is on Our Side"

One of the easiest things to do (it seems) is to quote a Bible verse—out of its original and intended context-in order to prove a point. However, in so doing, the validity of such argumentation has no foundation at all. As has long been stated, "A text, out of context, is a pretext."

While some verses may sound good and make us feel good, the original context must determine its intended meaning. This applies to Jesus' statement, "He who is not against us is on our side." This is often quoted by individuals today to provide some kind of justification for denominationalism, religious division or doctrinal differences. However, the immediate context and the complete Biblical context do not support such a conclusion. Let's look at it.

Read both Luke 9:49-50 and Mark 9:38-40. Both accounts essentially say the same thing. John told Jesus that the apostles forbade a certain man, because he was "casting out demons in Your name," but "he does not follow us." Jesus told John to "not forbid him, for he who is not against us is on our side." But that is NOT all that the text says. Read Mark 9:38. Jesus says, "No one who works a miracle in My name can soon afterward speak evil of Me." The fact that John was unaware of this man means nothing. Jesus affirms that this man (and anyone else) could ONLY work a miracle in Jesus' name IF such power had been given by God. (That's the very nature of miraculous deeds. See John 3:2.) And, IF the man was working a deed by the power of God, THEN whatever he would "speak" would be the Word of God (and no different).

Jesus was affirming that this other man was teaching the SAME thing that He was, otherwise, God would not have given him the power to do miracles. Miracles were designed

> to confirm the message was from God (Mark 16:20; Heb. 2:3-4). While the man was "not with" the apostles, he was on Jesus' side from a purity of doctrine and practice standpoint. This passage cannot be used to justify doctrines or practices that differ from that which is authorized by Scripture.

In the larger context, if this statement of Jesus proves that a doctrine or group that teaches and operates contrary to Scripture is approved of God and "with us," then it makes scores of passages non-sensical. (Examples: Matt 7:15-23; 1 Cor. 1:10-13; 1 Tim 1:3; 6:3; Gal. 1:6-9; Rev. 22:18-19; 2 Pet. 2:1-22; etc.). There is "one faith" (Eph. 4:5), which must be preached accurately (Gal. 1:23), obeyed precisely (Acts 6:7), stood for firmly (1 Cor. 16:13), and contended for earnestly (Jude 3). There "is not another" (Gal. 1:7). Anyone who preaches or practices another has departed from that faith (1 Tim. 4:1; 6:21) and is not on God's side!

It makes scores of passages non-sensical.
