Paul's Plans, Closed Doors and Providence

Look at Paul's

life to see how

"closed door"

may open to

greater ones

"You almost

persuade me

to become a

Christian."

The study of Paul's life gives real insight into the doctrine of the freewill we have as we serve our God. In our arrogance sometimes we may think we are wise enough to determine what we should do. Take a moment to reflect on this as we look at Paul's plan to go to Ephesus, Bithynia and Rome to

preach the word.

One cannot read the book of Acts without seeing Paul's desire to get the gospel into the great city of Ephesus. As he began his second missionary journey, he first visited the congregations he had established in Phrygia and Galatia on that first journey. He then headed toward Ephesus and the Roman province of Asia. His desire to go this area did not happen as he planned. The door was closed and his plans changed. The Bible says, "They were forbidden by the Holy Spirit to preach the word in Asia" (Acts 16:6).

With that door closed they headed north with a new plan. Paul and Silas and Timothy decided to "...go into Bithynia, but the Spirit did not permit them" (Acts 16:7). There were souls in Europe who needed the gospel and in a vision Paul saw a man from Macedonia who was pleading with him saying, "Come over to Macedonia and help us" (Acts 16:10). He immediately headed toward Macedonia and in a short time established two powerful congregations—Philippi and Thessalonica. The door into Europe was opened into both of the provinces of Greece (Macedonia and Achaia). It is interesting to note that as Paul finished his second journey, he stopped at Ephesus and when they asked him to stay, he said, "I will return again to you, God willing." Isn't this what James said we should say as we make plans? "Instead you ought to say, 'If the Lord wills, we shall live and do this or do that" (Jas. 4:15).

> When Paul began his third journey, he headed straight to Ephesus where he stayed for three years. Hundreds, perhaps thousands were converted and even publicly burned their pagan books. "So the word of the Lord grew mightily and prevailed" (Acts 19:20). This same chapter says, "All who dwelt in Asia heard the word of the Lord Jesus" (v. 10). The door was now open, but not when Paul first thought he

should have gone to that great city.

Space does not permit us to look at all the details of Paul's plan to preach in Rome. As his third journey ended, he wrote to the Romans telling them of his plan to come to Rome and then carry the gospel to Spain (Rom. 1:10, 13, 15; 15;28). Read how this story turned out in the closing chapters of Acts.

So, when troubles come into your life, take comfort that God used closed doors to open doors into greater works! Remember to always day, "If the Lord wills, I will..."



Persuasion to Become a Christian

In Paul's defense before King Agrippa and the governor Festus, in Acts 26, he made a direct appeal to the king's knowledge and faith in the prophets (26:26-27). Agrippa's "almost" response has troubled and even hunted many for the last two millennia. By David Sproule "You almost persuade me to become a Chris-

tian" (26:28). What does this rejection by the King show us is required to become a Christian? Persuasion!

First, consider the source of the persuasion. The gospel is "the power of God to salvation" (Rom. 1:16), and Paul knew that. He spoke "the words of truth and reason" (26:25) about "the Christ," who came to "suffer" and to "be the first to rise from the dead" (26:23). It is the wonderful news about the saving love and sacrifice of Jesus that compels us (2

Cor. 5:14) and calls us (2 Thess. 2:14) to the Lord. Jesus Himself said, "And I, if I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all peoples to Myself" (John 12:32). The only source of persuasion that is truly available and should ever be utilized is the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Second, consider the one who persuades. Persuading an individual to become a Christian must never be about the persuader himself or herself but about Christ (1 Cor. 2:1-2). Paul did not make himself out to be anything. In fact, he identified himself as one who had been extended the amazing grace of God and was humbly obeying the commission that had been given to him (26:1-23). If we are going to "be well pleasing to Him," then we must "persuade men" (2 Cor. 5:9-11). That involves stepping out of our comfort zone and initiating conversations that will help prepare people to "appear before the judgment seat of Christ" (5:10).

> Third, consider the method of persuasion. Various efforts can be persuasive, but not all methods are appropriate when seeking to persuade someone to give their life to Christ. Proper and effective persuasion must be motivated by love (Eph. 4:15), saturated with grace (Col. 4:6), moved with compassion (Matt. 9:36-38), engaged in with humility (Rom. 12:3) and presented with gentleness and respect (1 Pet. 3:15). Our methods of persuasion must never get in the

way of the persuading power of the gospel itself.

Finally, consider the focus of the persuasion. There are lost souls all around us who desperately need Jesus (Luke 15:4). Most of them do not even realize it. Agrippa did not realize how urgently he needed to be persuaded to become a Christian. Sadly, there is no evidence that he ever was "altogether" persuaded. Who have you been trying to persuade for Christ? Don't give up! Who will you meet this week who needs to be persuaded? Don't miss any opportunity!

Do I Need to Obey or Just Believe?

John 3:16 is one of the most wellknown verses in the Bible. "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life." This passage has been used by many to downplay the importance of baptism and obedience all to-

gether. Is belief all that is needed to be saved?

The New Testament is filled with passages that proclaim the essentiality of baptism. Mark 16:16 says, "He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned." In Acts 2:38, Peter proclaims, "Then Peter said to them, name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit." And 1

Peter 3:21 tells emphatically, "There is also an antitype which now saves us-baptism (not the removal of the filth of the flesh, but the answer of a good conscience toward God), through the resurrection of Jesus Christ." But what does John, chapter 3 really teach?

In John 3, Jesus is having a conversation with Nicodemus about what it means to be born again. Nicodemus asks in verse 4, "How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother's womb and be born?" His question shows that his first interpretation of Jesus' words was a literal rebirth. This is obviously impossible. Jesus cannot be talking about a literal birth. So, Jesus answered him, "...unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God." If a literal birth cannot be Jesus' point, then this leaves only one option for what being born of water can be. Jesus is saying you must be baptized.

Nicodemus, the man Jesus spoke to, was a Pharisee (John 3:1). A Pharisee would have understood what baptism was. John the baptizer had been baptizing for some time prior to this meeting and some of the Pharisees even came to him to be baptized (Matt. 3:7). So, when Jesus told him to be born of water, he Repent, and let every one of you be baptized in the to be speaking of was living in a context that understood Jesus to be speaking of baptism.

> John 3 continues this theme, recording John the Baptist's explanation of Jesus' baptism (v. 27-36). In his conclusion, the NKJV translates verse 36, "...he who does not believe the Son shall not see life, but the wrath of God abides on him." This may lead someone say that he is emphasizing belief. However, the ESV, NASB, and ASV provide a more accurate translation, "he who does not obey." Throughout the Bible, nothing is emphasized more than obedience. It is how we express our love to God (John 14:15). If we do not obey God, we will not enter His kingdom, and baptism is an act of obedience.

Bent on being bent out of shape

How would you describe your disposition? How would you describe your general attitude? Are you generally a positive or negative person? What is your standard mindset? Is your default to find fault? Are you bent on being bent out of shape?

If anyone had a right, from a human perspective, to be bitter

and bent out of shape because of circumstances, it was Paul while imprisoned in Rome. And, yet, when one reads the book of Philippians, he finds just the opposite. Paul was devoted to "prayer" (Phil. 1:3-4). He found "peace" in prayer (4:6-7). In the midst of his suffering, he wrote, "I am glad and rejoice with you

all" (2:17). So much of this is the mindset that one sets out to develop and flourish. When one "meditates" on things that are "true...noble...just...pure...lovely...of good report" (4:8), instead of the opposite of those things, it defines his perspective on all things.

What if we were bent on rejoicing in the Lord, regardless of what's going on around us (4:4)? Could we find enough reasons to be filled with "joy" (2:2) and "thanksgiving" all of the time (4:6)? – DS




