

The Psalms Show Us the Way

The book of Psalms allows us to see deep into the heart and soul of the man whose heart mirrored the heart of God. The words of these psalms and the depth of the spirituality behind them should become the words of our hearts. Early in this book, David said, "Let the words of my mouth and the

meditation of my heart Be acceptable in Your sight, O Lord, my strength and my Redeemer" (Psalm 19:14). These words are followed by more than a hundred psalms Let the words of where we see the words of David and look into his heart. When we read and meditate on these words from his mouth, they allow us to see his heart and then our hearts can become like the heart of God.

Almost every emotion of our hearts can be to follow God found in the psalms as we meditate on them. There are psalms written when David was so filled with despair that he was about to turn from God (Psalm 73), and there are those where David was filled with exaltation of the grandeur of being in God's presence. Our emotions differ from day to day, and since almost all emotions are found in the psalms, there are psalms that fit each period of our lives.

To see this illustrated, take a moment to look at Psalm 63. David was dealing with those who were seeking to destroy him (v. 9), but instead of looking at them he looks toward God. The greatness of God is so far greater than what others were doing, and David fully saw this.

He recognized that God was supreme, and God was personally concerned about him. "O God, You are my God" (v. 1). His soul and his body began early each day by praising God. He looked at God and saw his power and glory (v. 2). Every day David spent seeing His greatness—he blessed his name and lifted up his hands toward heaven (v. 4).

Though there were those who sought to destroy him, David ended each day mindful that God would help him. "I remember You on my bed, I meditate on You in the night watches" (v. 6). He never forgot that God had helped him in the past and he each day we seek had lived "...in the shadow of Your wings" (v. 7).

> Note carefully his words, "My soul follows close behind you" (v. 8). God was His guide who led him in paths of righteousness, but David did not follow him from a great distance. He was a close follower of Him whose right hand upheld him. He knew that ultimately he would triumph over his enemies (v. 10). He praised God with his lips (v. 3) and his mouth praised God with joyful lips (v. 5).

Should not we say to God, "Let the words of OUR mouth and the meditation of OUR hearts be acceptable in your sight"? David has shown us how to do this!

Your Life Is Not Just a Vapor

When talking about the brevity of life, we often quote James 4:14, which illustrates life as "even a vapor that appears for a little time and then vanishes away." That is a vivid reminder of how fleeting life is. But the Bible uses many illustrations to emphasize the brevity, temporary nature and limitations

of human life. Consider these, in addition to a vapor.

Life is like a swift runner. "Now my days are swifter than a runner; they flee away..." (Job 9:25). This is likely a reference to a courier who carries messages quickly from one place to another.

Life is like a soaring eagle. "My days are...like an eagle swooping on its prey" (Job 9:26). An eagle moves speedily and unstoppably upon its prey and then it's gone. If you blink, you miss it.

Life is like a weaver's shuttle. "My days are swifter than a weaver's shuttle, and are spent without hope" (Job 7:6). That shuttle darts back and forth across the loom so quickly that it's hard to keep up, and before you know it, it's done.

Life is like a shadow. "Our days on earth are a shadow...like a passing shadow" (Job 8:9; Psa. 144:4). A shadow does not last—it moves and then disappears quickly.

Life is like a flower. "His days are like grass; As a

flower of the field, so he flourishes. For the wind passes over it, and it is gone, and its place remembers it no more...the flower fades...all fade as a leaf" (Psa. 103:15-16; Isa. 40:6-8; 64:6). Life is fragile and temporary; eventually it withers away.

Life is like a handbreath. "Indeed, You have made my days as handbreadths..." (Psa. 39:5). "My life on earth is but a span"—just a few inches long like the width of my hand.

> **Life is like spilled water.** "For we will surely die and become like water spilled on the ground, which cannot be gathered up again" (2 Sam. 14:14). The passing of life is irreversible—once gone, it cannot be recovered.

> **Life is like a tent.** "If our earthly house, this tent, is destroyed...taken from me like a shepherd's tent" (2 Cor. 5:1; Isa. 38:12). A tent is a temporary dwelling, quickly dismantled. It is not meant to last.

Life is like a mist. "You are just a mist that appears for a little time and then vanishes" (Jas. 4:14, ESV). So, we finish where we began. A mist is only present briefly and then it disappears quickly. That is what life is like.

Contrast that with eternity, which never ends. What you are doing with your vapor now will determine where you will spend your forever. No wonder the very next verse emphasizes to live as "the Lord wills" (Jas. 4:15). Are you?

When Are They Old Enough?

How do you know when your child is old enough to be baptized? Whenever I hear the question, I immediately know that the person asking already understands much of what the Bible says concerning baptism. It means they know that the Bible clearly teaches that baptism saves (cf. 1 Pet. 3:21). It

also means that they know that children do not need baptism until they reach the "age of accountability" (cf. Ezek. 18:19-20; Jas. 4:17; Matt. 18:3). It also means that they truly want their child to go to heaven. So, how do you know when they are old enough?

there must be The basis for our answer is found right at the beginning of the church in Acts 2. In verses 36guilt... 38, Peter tells the Jews assembled at Pentecost, "Therefore, let all the house of Israel know assuredly that God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, both Lord and Christ. Now when they heard this, they were cut to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, 'Men and brethren, what shall we do?' Then Peter said to them, 'Repent and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins..." Here we can see the parameters for baptism. To be baptized there must be guilt, sorrow for that guilt, a change of mind toward guilt, and the understanding of baptism's ability to remove that guilt. So, here are some questions to ask that will help you know if they are old enough.

First, is your child guilty of the blood of Jesus Christ? In 1 Corinthians 15:3, the Bible says, "...Christ died for our sins..." If Jesus died for sins, then someone is only guilty if they have sins. We already referenced James 4:17 in regard to the "age of accountability." The Scripture says, "...to him who knows to do good and does not do it, to him it is sin." So, a child becomes guilty of sin when they understand the difference between right and wrong. Before this, they are innocent.

Second, does your child regret their sins and want to change? 2 Corinthians 7:10 says, "For godly sorrow produces repentance leading to salvation..." It is one thing to understand right from wrong. It is another thing to feel regret for wrongdoing and then decide to live differently. They cannot be saved without repenting.

Third, does your child understand the purpose of baptism? Acts 22:16 shows us that baptism washes away sins. A child that is ready for baptism understands why they are doing it. Otherwise, it is a purposeless act. They cannot be baptized if they are not able to describe a biblical understanding of it.

Is your child old enough to be baptized? There is a lot more to be said on this topic, but these three questions are a biblical starting point. If you work hard to know your children well, then the answers will come easily.

What happened that night is a fulfillment of Numbers 32:23, for when one sins "against the Lord...be sure your sin will find you out." What is His cam seeing? What do you need to change? -DS

His cam catches the good, too

Social media went crazy when a concert's "Kiss Cam" exposed the hidden sin of two people. Yet, there was "nothing hidden from His sight" at all (Heb. 4:13). It is easy to think about all of the "bad stuff" that we do that God sees. But, remember, that's not all that God sees.

God's cam catches us doing good and doing right, too. Focus on the last part of the last verse of Ecclesiastes, "For God will bring every work into judgment, including every secret thing, whether good or evil" (Ecc. 12:14). Did you catch that? God is aware of "every secret thing" that is "GOOD"! Three times in Matthew

6, Jesus tells us, "...your Father...sees in secret" (6:4, 6, 18). Sometimes we may think that God is only trying to "catch us" doing wrong. Such is far from the truth! Our Father, even more, is eager to "catch us" doing good!

Other people may never know the time, effort, money and personal sacrifice that you put into serving others, helping others, doing good in the church, etc. And they don't need to! God's cam is always rolling! He sees! He will reward! – DS


