



Paul blinded Bar-Jesus/Elymas, the sorcerer in Paphos, Crete (13:6-12)

Paul healed a man, a cripple from birth, in Lystra (14:8-10)

Recorded persecutions:

Jews in Antioch of Pisidia stirred up opposition and expelled them from their region (13:50)

Violent attempt made to abuse and stone them in Iconium (14:5)

Stoned in Lystra, dragged out of the city, supposing to be dead (14:19)

Great sermons preached:

A historical message of hope for Jews & Gentiles in Antioch of Pisidia (13:16-41)

Epistles written while on this journey:

Points of interest:

- They first taught those who already believed in God (13:5, 14; 14:1)
- Paul's name transitioned from Saul to Paul on this journey (13:9)
- Miracles were designed to confirm the word and create faith (14:3; 13:12)
- When the Jews rejected the gospel, Paul turned to the Gentiles (13:46-48)
- When the gospel was rejected, Paul shook the dust from his feet (13:51)
- Truly "believing" in the NT is synonymous with obedience (14:1-2, ASV)
- They went back and strengthened the new converts (14:22)
- They appointed elders in every church (14:23)
